The 16th annual Buffalo Int'l Film Festival (BIFF) is excited to announce its 2022



BIFF also participates in Arts Services Inc's Arts Access Program, which allows program participants to reserve free tickets to all festival events. ## The Blotter Felonies From "D" District

## North Buffalo

September 25th, 2022 Amherst Street - Victim tried to disperse subject arguing in his pizza shop when defendant did pull out butterfly knife and did slash the victim across the face striking just below the left eye. Victim was treated on scene by AMR and possibly has a broken nose.

## **Caring For Animals Above By Caring For The Ground Below**

The seeds of success for Emere Nieves and her eco-friendly, organic landcare company Gardeness Inc, were planted generations ago with her grandmother and mother.

"They planted shrubs that naturally attract birds. By caring for the earth they had a posi-tive impact on Cardeness Inc. ple, American NATIVE, ORGANIC GARDENS white pine, and our ecosystem above," said Nieves, who founded her accredited organic land care company in 2018.

These influences led Nieves to a career in natural landscaping. She managed gardens for the Buffalo Olmsted Park Conservancy and cared for the Delaware

Park Rose Garden and the Japanese Garden of Buffalo.

Gardeness Inc. incorporates native plants found in Buffalo to produce fertile soil and to benefit birds, bees, and other living things.

Dogwood, redbuds, snakebark maple, red mawitch hazel are trees unique to the Buffalo-Niagara region. As for ferns, flowering plants and shrubs: spicebush, common ninebark, butterfly weed, elderberry, and cranberry viburnum are popular.

"Bird feathers, claws, beaks, and feathers con-

tain keratin. They depend on consuming keratin rich caterpillars, which are hosted by native plants. A lack of native plants creates food deserts for birds, causes a decline in their population, and disrupts the ecosys-tem," added Nieves.

In the same way shovels, hand trowels, and pruning shears are important tools, social media is a tool used by Nieves to cultivate clients.

"Facebook is important for our business to share how we are positive stewards of our planet. Friends and customers share posts. We received many referrals from gardening groups on Facebook. It is also a great platform to create ads, which also brings in new business," said Nieves.

As the mother of three children, Nieves plans to share her passion to produce eco-friendly landscapes.


"There are many ways to teach children to care for the environment, including starting an organic landcare business," concluded Nieves.

## Ask Rusty – Veteran Asks About Disability and Ex-Spouse Benefits

Dear Rusty: I am a military veteran with a total & permanent dis-ability. I was married for over ten years to a military man who has since honorably separated from military service. I was originally on Social Security disability, which automatically converted to regular Social Security retirement benefits when I turned 65 — with the amount remaining at the "disabled" level instead of the "regular" rate based on my Social Security employment contribution record. Why wasn't my "regular" Social Se-curity rate used when I turned 65? Also, I contacted Social Security regarding my ex-husband's Social Security since I was married to him for over 10 years but was told I am not entitled to a portion of his Social Security benefit. Why not? I was told the amount I would receive wouldn't subtract from his SS entitlement. Signed: Disable Veteran

**Dear Disabled Veteran:** First, I want to thank you for your service to our country. Your sacrifice is sincerely appreciated, and I'll be honored to answer your Social Security questions.

Regarding your current Social Security amount versus your previous disability amount, the Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefit you were receiving was, in fact, the amount you were entitled to at your full retirement age, even though you claimed disability benefits earlier. Your SSDI benefit, when awarded, was computed using your entire lifetime earnings history up to the point that you became disabled, resulting in you getting your earned full amount as your disability benefit before you reached your full retirement age. And that is why the amount stayed the same when it automatically converted to your normal SS retirement benefit (at your full retirement age which, by the way, was 66 if you were born before 1955). Said simply, SSDI is the full Social Security amount you have earned up to the

point you stopped earning, so it stays the same when you reach your full retirement age.

As for additional benefits from your ex-husband, although you meet the length of marriage rule for ex-spouse benefits, there are additional criteria as well – you must not have remarried and remained so, and your ex-husband must be already receiving his own Social Security benefit (unless you've been divorced at least two years, in which case your ex need only be eligible to collect). But you can only get an additional benefit, known as a "spousal boost," if you meet all the other criteria and half (50%) of the benefit your ex-husband is/was entitled to at his full retirement age is more than your current Social Security benefit. Since Social Security said you aren't entitled to an ex-spouse benefit, you apparently do not meet all of the eligibility criteria mentioned above. And to address your last point, if you had met all criteria and been entitled to an exspouse benefit it, indeed. would not have affected your ex-husband's benefit in any way.

Again, please accept my sincere gratitude for your military service. You may wish to visit the "For Veterans" section on our website.




