## Shoshone Park Football

Christmas is that magical season that brings families together from near and far to a place that's called home. Where a fireplace is lit while the meals are prepared and talk is of memories growing up in North Buffalo.

While the Buffalo Bills have our attention in pursuit of winning a Super Bowl, many families today still have thoughts of the Little League teams that used to play in nearby Shoshone Park from late August until mid-November. Those were the days of the Shoshone Junior Football League in the late 1970's and through the 80's.

The tiny Park on Hertel Avenue near Main Street was once the site for youth football games in the Erie County Junior Football League, playing as many as four games on Saturdays from September through early November. For just as strong as the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League was back in those early days, the Shoshone Junior Football League Program offered young boys from the age of eight or nine years old all the way up to fifteen or sixteen, a chance to play another sport in the neighborhood Park.

Once the baseball and softball season ended in Hertel North Park, the players gave way to community leaders who began marking off an 80 yard football field right down the center of Shoshone Park. They used a building located near the Hertel Avenue sidewalk to
sell hot dogs or chili or soda pop and snacks to families who would come to watch the games. Most of the baseball players in Hertel North Park would also play football in the Shoshone Program.

Football was a different Sport for all boys, trying to learn the game and adjust to the physical blocking and tackling of another boy. Practices were held at least three times a week under close supervision and guidance. A young boy was taught early in his young life how to properly tackle another player without hurting themselves or the opponent.

In those early days, the teams were formed from smallest to biggest. If you were eight years old and your dad said you weighed about 60 or 70 lbs, you could play on the Chiefs, as long as you maintained that weight every week during the season.

By the time you were ten or eleven, you could move up to the Warriors, as long as you were under 85 lbs . Every week, your dad and your coaches had you stand on a scale to get weighed before games. There were times when some boys could not play because of this and it was heartbreaking to see.

After the Warriors game on Saturdays, the next Shoshone team, the Savages, would take the field and you had to maintain a weight of 105-110 lbs. all season. The fourth team in the Park was the 125lb Redskins and these boys were in local high schools as well and possibly
playing for them as well.
Buffalo Rocket has been there for most of the early years of the Shoshone League. Publisher David H. Gallagher took pictures of all the players every week in those initial years. This writer took over in 1981 and covered all games, interviewing coaches and players, taking notes and asking questions. It was an extremely great experience, writing stories about these young boys growing into young men.

Some of the Leagues that Shoshone played against in the Erie County Junior Football League were Lackawanna, Buffalo Vets, Hill/ Butler, Evans, Kensington. Barnabus and Hamburg. Each team would play a home and away schedule and the best two teams from each weight division would play in the Championship games, usually held in late November in a neutral field.

Some of the finest players to ever play the game at such a young age have come through Shoshone Park. The list is long and lengthy. A few have even passed on to a better place. In the years when the Rocket was there to watch, players like brothers Kevin, Rob and Sean Ryan; Michael, Chris and Mark Falzone, Marty and Michael Mazzara, Chuck and Mark Carfley, other standout players like Reno Masecchia, Michael Acosta, Kevin Brinkworth, Dominic Fragale, Marlon Holt, William Middlebrooks, Eric Williams, David Scime, Jack Tracy, Lance Shotwell, Mike Shatzel, Michael Maiola, Phil Gangi, Michael Buttitta, Pierre Howard, Delray Neeley, Dane Hightower, Rocco Distillo and many many others have all helped the four maroon and gold Shoshone Junior Football League teams win games while growing up in North Buffalo.

Dear Rusty: I lost my rity Spousal benefits. Unwife several years ago and I qualified for Social Secufortunately, because of my income, I have not been

able to take advantage of this benefit. I am currently 64 and still working. I believe I have until the age of 70 to receive this. Is there any way to claim any of this before I start taking my Social Security in a couple of years? Signed: Working Widower

Dear Working Widower: Your entitlement to surviving spouse benefits from your wife actually never expires so, you can wait until you stop working full time, or until you reach your full retirement age (FRA), to claim your benefit as a widower.

Social Security's "earnings test" lasts until you reach your full retirement age which, for you, is 66 years and 8 months. That is the age at which your earnings from working will no longer affect your Social Security benefit. So, you can simply defer claiming your survivor benefit until you reach your FRA, or until you stop working full time and won't exceed the annual earnings limit (the earnings limit changes yearly; for 2023 it is $\$ 21,240$ ). But there is no way to avoid the earnings test if you're collecting SS benefits of any kind before you reach your full retirement age. If you collect your surviving spouse benefit early and exceed the earnings limit, SS will take away benefits equal to $\$ 1$ for every $\$ 2$ you are over the limit (half of what you exceed the limit by), and if your work earnings are high
enough it can temporarily disqualify you from receiving SS benefits. The penalty for exceeding the earnings limit is also less severe in the year you reach your FRA.

You might take some comfort in knowing, anyway, that taking your survivor benefit before your FRA would mean it would be reduced (by $4.75 \%$ for each full year early) but waiting until you reach your FRA to claim it would mean you'll get $100 \%$ of the survivor benefit you're entitled to (the same amount your wife was entitled to when she died). And you can claim your survivor benefit (only) first and collect that, while allowing
your personal SS retirement amount to continue to grow, up to age 70 if you wish. You should strive to maximize whichever benefit will be highest - your own, or your survivor benefit - and collect that benefit for the rest of your life. If you choose to claim your survivor benefit at your FRA and switch to your own higher amount at 70, your personal SS retirement benefit at 70 will be almost $27 \%$ more than it will be at your full retirement age. That would be a good way to avoid the earnings test, maximize both benefits, and secure the highest possible Social Security benefit for as long as you live.

## A Happy Holiday Season Is A Safe Holiday Season

As Erie County Clerk, responsible for overseeing Auto Bureau operations, it is time to remind everyone this holiday season to not drink and drive or ride with anyone who is under the influence. If you have had too much to drink, for everyone's sake, please do not get behind the wheel of your car.
We all look forward to celebrating this time of year with our family and friends, but if those celebrations include alcohol, you, as a driver, need to plan ahead and arrange for a safe ride home. People who make
the dangerous decision to drink and drive will find that local law enforcement is serious about combating reckless and irresponsible behavior.
New York State imposes harsh driver license penalties for those with an impaired driving charge for either alcohol or drugs. If convicted of a misdemeanor DWI, your license will be revoked for a minimum of 6 months. Aside from the tremendous expense for an attorney, fines and insurance premium increases, there is total disruption of normal life, including possible loss
of job and jail time for repeat offenders.
We need to keep in mind that preventing drunk driving is everyone's business, and we all need to take a leadership role in this fight! Driving while impaired is simply not worth endangering the lives of innocent people, while ruining your own life in the process.
Every single day, impaired driving senselessly kills about 32 people in the United States in drunk-driving crashes. In every state, it is illegal to drive under the influence, yet one person was killed in a drunk-driving crash every 45 minutes in 2020. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration more than 11,500 people died in alcohol-impaired driving traffic deaths, which is a $14 \%$ increase from 2019.
A NHTSA National Roadside Survey found that more than $22 \%$ of drivers stopped by law enforcement tested positive for illegal, prescrip-
tion or over-the-counter drugs. Whether they are illegal, legalized, prescription or over-the-counter medicines all can affect your ability to drive safely.
I want to also remind everyone it really makes no difference whether the driver is impaired by alcohol or drugs. Those who choose to drive under the influence of drugs, whether obtained legally or illegally, pose a danger to themselves, their passengers, and other motorists and pedestrians. Drug-impaired driving isn't a mistake; just like a DWI, it's a crime. Impairment is impairment, no matter the substance, you can't drive safely. The facts are, if you feel different, you will drive different.
While celebrating the holidays, know the signs of when to hand over the keys and call a cab, a ride-sharing service or designate a sober driver before the party begins. Plan a safe ride home before you start your
holiday festivities. Drunk driving is no accident; it is a choice and a potentially deadly one.
Let's make sure we all do our part in making this a happy and safe holiday season for everyone on the roads and at home. Please don't drink and drive or drive under the influence of drugs.
