

# PAL Red Cross Certified Lifeguard Training For The City Of Buffalo

Mayor Byron W. Brown and the City of Buffalo, in partnership with the Police Athletic League of Buffalo (PAL), will offer another session of free and paid Red Cross Certified Lifeguard Training for City of Buffalo Youth ages 16-21 during the upcoming winter break, Monday, February 20 through Friday, Febru-ary 24. The session will be held at the Cazenovia Pool, located on Abbott Road across from Mercy Hospital. Those who successfully attain certification can apply to become lifeguards at the City's two indoor pools, as well as apply for summer 2023 positions at the City's nine outdoor pools. Pay is \$20 an hour.

Mayor Brown stated "We need our young people to step up in a big way after a lifeguard shortage last summer kept us from opening our

City pools. Our current team of lifeguards come from all walks of life but have one thing in common, a love for our city and a love for our children who deserve a safe and fun summer. I ask youth to consider our this great opportunity and join Buffalo's awesome team of lifeguards. The position pays well and will help further improve the quality of life in neighborhoods citywide."

Last summer, the City's nine outdoor pools were closed due to a lifeguard shortage which impacted cities, towns, and private swimming facilities across New York State and throughout the United States. ## Ask Rusty - About Social Security's "First Year Rule"

Dear Rusty: I'm considering filing for my SS at age 64 in February, before my full retirement age of 66 years and 10 months. I'm working full time and would like to continue earning until I meet the \$21,240 limit for this year. When does the \$21,240 limit go into effect? Does it start after receiving my first SS benefit deposit? Or does Social Security go by my year-to-date earnings starting on January 1st?

If I file in February and it takes 90 days to receive my first SS deposit, and at that point my year-to-date earnings are \$18,500, can I continue to work until I earn the balance of the \$21,240 (\$2,740) and then stop working? Or do they only count the earnings after I receive the first benefit payment? I know that for anything earned over \$21,240 I'll need to repay \$1 for every \$2 over the limit. Signed: Ready to Retire

**Dear Ready:** Since you haven't yet reached your full retirement age (FRA), if you claim now and are working, things will work somewhat differently during your first year collecting benefits.

If you claim for your benefits to start in February, only your earnings starting in February count toward the earnings limit. But during your first calendar year, once your benefits start, you'll be subject to a monthly earnings limit of \$1,770 and, if that is exceeded in any month (February be eligible for benefits for that they could withhold your entire monthly amount for any 2023 exceeds the monthly limit. This is part of Social Security's "first year rule," your first calendar year monthly limit will apply from March thru December. Remember, it's it's when your benefits start (SS pays benefits in the month following the month earned). Beginning in 2024 only the annual limit would apply.

year rule" offers some latitude on your earnings. If the penalty for exceeding the annual earnings limit (\$21,240 for 2023) is less than the penalty which results from using the monthly limit, Social Security will use the annual limit and assess the smaller penalty amount. So, if your annual (full year) 2023 earnings are less than \$21,240, no penalty will be assessed, or if you only exceed the annual limit by a small amount, you'll be assessed a penalty of \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. But if your annual earnings are substantially more than the 2023 limit, Social Security may deem you temporarily ineligible to get benefits.

When you complete your application there will be a section asking you to tell them about this year's earnings as well as what you expect next year's earnings to be. From that they will decide whether you are currently eligible to collect benefits. So, if your goal is to work only to the point that no penalty will be as-

sessed, you can work until your 2023 earnings reach \$21,240 (whenever that is). Or you could work even a little bit longer and simply take the penalty (half of what you exceed the annual limit by), in which case SS will simply withhold future benefits for enough months for them to recover what is owed for exceeding the limit. But if you continue working full time and will substantially exceed the annual limit, it's likely Social Security will say you are temporarily ineligible to collect benefits (until your earnings are less or you reach your full retirement age when the earnings test no longer applies).



# Ingolstadt



#### Scenic Ingolstadt, Germany.

I have another little story to tell about our trip to Europe. Our ultimate goal of the trip was to visit Switzerland. The city of Zug, where my wife's father was born. Starting in France into Italy up to Germany and onto Switzerland. We had a Euro rail pass and could travel on the train anywhere. We boarded a train in Italy and headed to Germany. Had reservations in a little town called Ingolstadt. It was a late train and as we entered Germany the train stopped. Seems someone committed suicide and jumped in front of a train. That blocked the track we were on. Guess it took a long time to clean up the mess as we sat there for hours without moving. We were not too worried as we had reservations, we thought, at a hotel in Ingolstadt.

A fellow jumped up and wanted to know if anyone was going to Ingolstadt as he was going to rent a car and drive. Said we could share the cost. We volunteered along with one other man. The fellow rented the car and came back to the train station and picked us up. The four of us piled into this small German made car and we were off. He was a local and used the autobahn often. Drove really fast and we were relieved when he slowed down to 100 miles an hour. After a harrowing ride, we finally reached our destination safely. He dropped us off at the hotel where we had made reservations. The lobby was full of German speaking men, drinking beer and smoking

cigarettes. The air was so full of smoke you could cut it with a knife. When we made it to the counter, the clerk informed us they had given our room away. Due to the train delay, we had not shown up on time to secure the room. Turns out it was Oktoberfest month and everything close was booked. Here we are in the middle of Germany with our luggage and no place to go. I asked the clerk for suggestions. What we could do as we do not speak the language and we were very tired. Sleeping in the lobby would not work this time as no one would hear my snoring.

After fretting for over an hour, the clerk said she did find a place. A hostel that had single rooms and a shared bathroom. Having no choice, we went there. One of those flop houses and we were lucky to get rooms next to each other. At least we had a place to sleep and spend the night. Her concern was her usual middle of the night restroom call. The restroom


was shared with 12 other rooms, mostly men. Told her to knock on the wall between us when nature called and I would walk her to the necessary facility. She did, I did, and it worked out fine. Poorly lit hallway and lots of doors, luckily the right one was clearly marked.

Next morning we had breakfast at the same place and the cook thought we met there and it was a budding romance. Why would a married couple stay there? At least the breakfast was good, and we actually stayed another night in a different part with full rooms and your own bathroom. Again, they thought we just met that night and wanted to sleep together. Whatever.

We were in this area, me being a history buff, as I wanted to see Dachau, the concentration camp. The German cab driver was displeased and expressed it. Dutchmen like their beer and drank plenty of it. When they got too drunk the police dragged them onto a hill behind the event to sleep it off. Everyone was very nice to us as Americans and it was an awesome experience. My wife liked that the locals dressed in their Bavarian garments. Like in Lampoon's European Vacation with Chevy Chase. A happy time, so now it was on to Switzerland and another adventure high up in the mountains.






