Banana Republic

I vividly remember my Ukrainian Baba (Grandmother) and Dido (Grandfather) sharing tragic stories of the horrors of living under the “Iron Fist” of Communist Russia. They grew up in and eventually fled Ukraine during World War II.

Most of the stories came from my Baba Anna, who lived much longer than my Dido Iwan (John) did. Both worked at Mercy Hospital. My grandfather was a general handyman, my grandmother a hard working janitor.

As a child, I could never truly grasp why they were so insistent on never, ever wasting food. It was almost sin-like to leave a crumb or morsel on a plate. Only when I was old enough to learn and understand that they survived the brutal Holodomor wheat famine, did I appreciate their position. Joseph Stalin’s horrific regime starved an estimated 10,000,000 Ukrainians to death by stealing and hoarding all wheat produced in Ukraine.

My Baba never missed daily mass at Saint Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Church. We lived a stone’s throw from the place where I was baptized and now where all of my children were baptized. The church, located at the corner of Fillmore and Oneida in Buffalo, is

still a very active parish.

She regularly attended mass and rosary hours at Saint Nicholas. She was a regular in the pews. As an adult, I now know part of the reason why faith and being a part of a church community was important to her. Communists persecuted and arrested Catholics in Eastern bloc nations and she was not allowed to attend mass the way she did in America,

When I was a kid, the “Miracle on Ice” defeat of the Soviet Union in the 1980 Olympics (an American team that had future Buffalo Sabre Mike Ramsey on) brought uncontrollable tears to my grandparents’ eyes. As a kid I couldn’t fathom why the United States defeating the Evil Empire brought such joy to their hearts. To me, it was just a hockey game where the good guys beat the bad guys.

When my family fled a ruthless regime to eventually come to the United States, they had no idea what to really expect, what life was like living in America. They weren’t just chasing a dream though, they were pursuing an ideal so grand and beautiful they left everything they had behind and came here with practically nothing just for the chance to succeed in America.

The beauty of this

ideal was put on paper and solidified into the fabric of our great nation almost 240 years ago, when our Founding Fathers drafted the Constitution in 1787.

The notion that Americans were destined to be free to experience “Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness” was written in the Declaration of Independence in 1776. Our specific freedoms were spelled out in the Constitution a little more than one decade later in 1787.

These fundamental freedoms distinguish our great nation from so-called “banana republics.” We cherish the freedoms of speech, religion, assembly, and the right to bear arms. The Constitution also protects us from unreasonable search and seizure, cruel and unusual punishment, and self-incrimination.

We are supposed to be a nation of law and order where good people can disagree without being disagreeable, where individuals can express different political points of view without fear of prosecution or overreaching government punishment.

Just like the 1980 victory over the Soviet ice hockey team in 1980, “this” is what separates the good guys and the bad guys.

I fear a fractured United States is starting to not only move away from protecting the freedoms that distinguish us from our enemies, but hyper politicized District Attorneys at the state and federal levels appear to criminalize political opposition, same way they did in the old Soviet Union..

Bulk Trash Collection Begins Early April

Mayor Byron W. Brown reminds people that the City of Buffalo Department of Public Works, Parks & Streets will kick-off the Spring 2023 Bulk Trash schedule the week of April 2nd, in the Ellicott District.

“In 2023, we will once again offer Spring and Fall Bulk Trash Collection. I ask City residents to follow the guidelines on the amount and type of items that can be put out for collection,” Mayor Brown said. “I also ask residents to get their bulk trash to the curb on the Sunday of their designated collection week as

pick-ups will take place Monday through Saturday, not just on their regular garbage day.”

Residents are also asked to follow the posted parking regulations in their neighborhood to make sure trash collection equipment has access to the curbside piles. The 2023 Spring Bulk Trash Schedule is:

Curbside bulk trash piles cannot not exceed 12 ft. long, 3 ft. wide and 3 ft. high.

Electronic trash, such as televisions and computers, as well as construction debris and tires, are banned from bulk trash.

The City will also hold four Tire Drop-Off Days in 2023. Those dates will be Saturday, April 8, Saturday, May 13, Saturday, July 8, and Saturday, September 9.

of Buffalo continue to work with Empire State Development (ESD), the Broadway Market Management Board and charitable organizations to advance plans to transform the market into a state-of-the-art, sustainable, and regional destination. After the recent completion of the City's \$1.2 million exterior market renovation, \$40 million in ESD funds has been allocated for the continuing revitalization of the facility, as part of a \$180 million state funded investment in other East Buffalo projects including the Central Terminal, Michigan Street African American Heritage Corridor, and MLK Park.



Ask Rusty – Widow Stung By Social Security’s “Claw Back” Rule

Dear Rusty: My husband of 48 years died on December 30th, and he received a Social Security direct deposit for December's benefits in early January, but Social Security demanded the bank return his December payment. I used part of his December benefits to pay for household expenses, so his bank account was overdrawn after his bank paid back his Social Security for the December benefit. My questions are:

1. Is it legal for Social Security to demand a return of his benefits because he died one day prior to 1/1/2023? That just seems so wrong to me!

2. Am I legally responsible for the overdrawn amount his bank repaid to Social Security? I was not notified by Social Security or his bank before "the deed was done".

3. Aren't there Social Security spousal benefits available for the surviving spouse, and how do I apply for them? (Form #, please)

My husband medically retired early, and his Social Security benefits were always lower than mine, but I fear that my benefits may be affected by his death. Is that true? **Signed: Grieving Widow, Feeling Wronged**

Dear Grieving Widow: Please accept our sincere condolences on your husband's passing. Unfortunately,

I don't have good news for you about his December benefit payment. Social Security pays benefits in the month following the month they are earned, and the recipient must live the entire month to be eligible for that month's benefit. Even though your husband lived until almost the end of the month, Social Security's rule says that he must live the entire month to be eligible for December benefits; thus, they took back (often referred to as "Clawed Back") the December benefits paid in January.

So, is all of this legal? Yes, I'm afraid it is. From what you've shared Social Security took back the money they are legally entitled to, so you have no further obligation to Social Security. The bank had no choice but to return your husband's December Social Security payment – they were legally obligated to do so. Thus, your obligation to resolve your husband's overdrawn bank account resulting from the bank fulfilling its legal obligation to Social Security still remains.

As for any spousal or survivor benefits you might be entitled to – you say your husband's Social Security payment was less than yours, which means you weren't getting a spousal benefit and cannot get a surviving spouse benefit as

a widow (you can only get your benefit or his, whichever is higher). You will, however, be eligible for a one-time lump sum death benefit of \$255. I know it's not much, but you're entitled to it and should claim it. And, from what you've described – that your monthly Social Security amount is more than your husband's – your own benefit will not be negatively affected by any of this.
