Canisius Welcomes Bestselling Author Silas House

Canisius College welcomes nationally bestselling author Silas House to campus on Wednesday, April 19, 2023 at 5:30 pm in the Montante Cultural Center.

House's talk, titled "Complicated Love: On Appalachia" is free and open to the public. The event is presented under the auspices of the college's William H. Fitzpatrick Chair of Political Science Lecture

House is an acclaimed multi-award-winning and "New York Times" best-

selling nov-elist. Most recently, he received the

2023 Southern Book Prize in Fiction for his novel, "Lark Ascending." The novel was a SIBA bestseller and has also been chosen as a "Booklist" Editor's Choice, one of "Salon's" favorite books of the year, one of "Garden and Gun's" selections for Best Southern Books of 2022, and as a top ten most recommended book by independent booksellers across the nation in the monthly Indie Next

House is the author of six additional nov-els—"Clay's Quilt," 2001; "A Parchment of Leaves," 2003; "The Coal Tattoo," 2005; "Eli the Good," 2009; "Same Sun Here" (co-authored with Neela Vaswani) 2012; and "Southernmost," 2018—as well as a book of creative nonfiction—"Something's Rising," co-authored with Jason Howard, 2009; and three plays.

He serves as the NEH

Chair of Appalachian Studies at Berea College, on the fiction faculty at the Naslund-Mann School of Creative Writing at Spalding University in Louisville, and as a series editor for Fireside Industries at the University Press of Kentucky.

House is a former commentator for NPR's "All Things Considered." His writing has appeared recently in ¯"Time,"

"The Atlantic," "Ecotone," "The Advocate," "Garden and Gun," and "Oxford American" ican." AsS music journal-ist. House has ist, House has worked

artists such as Kacey Musgraves, Kris Kristofferson, Lucinda Williams, Jason Isbell, Leann Womack, Tyler Childers, and many others. He is also the host of the popular podcast "On the Porch."

A member of the Fellowship of Southern Writers, House is the recipient of three honorary doctorates, and is the winner of the Nautilus Award, an EB White Award, the Appalachian Book of the Year, the Storylines Prize from the New York Public Library/ NAV Foundation, the Lee Smith Award, and many other honors, including an invitation to read at the Library of Congress.

He was the recipient of the Governor's Award from Kentucky Governor Andy Beshear for his service to the arts in his home state in 2021, and in 2020, he was chosen as the Appalachian of the Year in a nationwide poll. House graduated from Eastern Kentucky University with a bachelor of arts degree in English, specializing in American literature. He earned a master of fine arts degree in creative writing from Spalding University.

House graduated from The Fitzpatrick Lecture Series at Canisius is part of the larger Fitzpatrick Institute of Public Affairs and Leadership at the college, which provides an array of opportunities for Canisius students to develop leadership potential through close contact with and exposure to those who contribute to American public affairs and societal issues.

The Institute and the Fitzpatrick Lecture Series are named for William H. Fitzpatrick, a South Buffalo builder and longtime chair of the Erie County Democratic Party. His sons, Paul E. and Walter D. Fitzpatrick, endowed the Fitzpatrick programming at Canisius in 1958, in memory of their father. A few years later, in 1962, the Hon. Harry S. Truman, 33rd president of the United States, inaugurated the Fitzpatrick Lecture Series at Canisius. Each year since, the college has hosted national figures in politics, government, academia and media, including Jane Goodall, Robert F. Kennedy Jr. and Bernice King, all under the auspices of the Fitzpatrick fami-





Secured Funding Defibrillators For Kenmore Fire Companies

In the wake of Buffalo Bill Damar Hamlin's cardiac arrest during the game against the Bengals in January, Kenilworth Fire Hall received an increase in requests for defibrillator units. Erie County Legislator John Bargnesi was able to de-

liver \$20,000 in grant funding, which enabled the fire company \mathbf{to} provide units for several fire companies, the Ken-Ton Closet, Kenilworth Church Christ (which provides addiction recovery services) and

St. Christopher's Elementary School. Bargnesi attended this morning's distribution, alongside representatives from five local fire companies and other locations to present the new equipment. Afterward, they reviewed lifesaving first aid measures. Bargnesi worked together with Dan Wiles from the James V. and Fay P. Ryan Paramedic Foundation to secure funding for the new automatic external defibrilla-

"AEDs help save lives. They're essential to make accessible in public. I think this a great step in that direction, and I'm glad that I was able to help make sure this was possible. The reach that this will have is incredi-

> ble, and I think it's so important that we can have equipment like this available to the public," Legis-lator Bargnesi said.

> "What have to put in perspective is just how many people that this can help to

save. That's the important part to me. It's all a matter of timing, really, and John's generosity came at just the right time we needed it. We wouldn't have been able to make it this far without him, and with the important work that's essential. That's the important part to me," said John Beaumont, Foundation Chairperson of the James V. and Fay. P. Ryan Paramedic Foundation.

Ask Rusty - Why Should A Non-Working Spouse Be Entitled To Social Security Benefits?

Dear Rusty: Why can a non-working spouse claim half of their working spouse's benefit even though they have not contributed to the Social Security system? This doesn't seem right or fair to those of us who have contributed for years from our paychecks. Signed: Inquisitive

Dear Inquisitive: This is a question which needs a bit of historical background to properly explain: Social Security's original purpose when it was enacted in 1935 was to prevent America's seniors from living in poverty (remember, Social Security was enacted during the "Great Depression"). Even before the first Social Security check was sent to a retired worker in 1940, Congress had already changed the original Social Security law to, as well, provide anti-poverty benefits to non-working spouses of a worker (a predominant family reality at that time) and surviving spouses, as well as to their minor children. Social Security's fundamental goal has always been to lift eligible Americans out of poverty, which it still does very ef-

fectively. It's important to note that this change did not (and does not) detract in any way from the benefits provided to those

who work and contribute to Social Security thus earning their own SS retirement benefit. In other words, those who receive their personally earned SS retirement benefit are not at all penalized if their non-working spouse also receives a benefit (albeit a considerably smaller amount) on the worker's record. Living expenses for two people are, simply, higher than for one, which was/is the rationale for also paying benefits to a dependent not eligible for Social Security benefits on their own work record. In the end, it all comes down to avoiding poverty.

Although the numbers vary somewhat by state, gender, and ethnicity, without Social Security about 38% of all Americans over age 65 would be living below the poverty line, whereas with Social Security only about 9% of Americans over 65 live below the poverty line. But that 9% number would be significantly higher if non-working spouses and survivors of eligible workers were also not entitled to Social Security benefits.

While it is true that Social Security is facing future solvency issues, the thought of restricting benefits to only those who have worked and contributed to the program (and

not to their non-working spouses or minor children) is not something being considered by anyone with Congressional influence, regardless of political affiliation. Doing so would be devastating to a large segment of the American population, severely increasing poverty - the very thing that Social Security is designed to prevent.
