## It's A HUGE HONOR!

Genevieve Mucitelli and Elizabeth Kooshoian.

Congratulations to Genevieve Mucitelli and Elizabeth Kooshoian of North Buffalo who were named as Co-Players of the Year by the Buffalo Public Schools Sports Division of Western New York Girls Softball. Both girls are Seniors on the City Honors Centaurs softball team and are a part of the just released first team roster of all Buffalo Schools.

Both Mucitelli and Kooshoian are long-time stand-out players from the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball and Softball League as members of the Wildcats Travel Program and have been playing together for years in Shoshone Park. They and Peyton Gallivan, another player on the Wildcats team in North Buffalo, is an eighth grade student from Olmstead, and is a part of this team that includes girls from four other schools including daVinci, Emerson, Hutch Tech and Performing Arts.

"I feel like this award gives Lizzy and I a special role that some young girls can look up to," said Vieve Mucitelli Monday afternoon. "It's a huge honor. Lizzy and I have been playing softball for City Honors together since seventh grade and in other leagues since we were little kids. Receiving the award together is especially sentimental."

The remaining team members are Seniors Bi-

onca Bennett and Christina Greco, Juniors Abigail Diamond, Nicole DeJesus and Grace Wheeler as well as Jalea Lofton and Anna Wheeler. Two players selected for the second team are also stand-out players from North Buffalo including Gallivan's younger sister, Mikayla and Karrington Mann, also members of City Honors and Olmsted Schools.

"This is indeed a shock to me," said Robert Mucitelli, Vieve's father and coach in the Wildcats program. "I knew that she had made the first team but to be named as a player of the year for Buffalo Schools, this is really awesome. She's worked hard all year."

These girls all join an impressive list of boys and girls who have previously played in Shoshone Park and have gone on to play for the high school of their choice and be successful on the bigger diamonds like Johnny B. Wiley or Nardin Academy for both boys and girls. The teaching and fundamentals of the game are started early in a youth sports league like Hertel North Park. North Buffalo boys and girls have been a part

of rosters for area high schools for years and have won Championships because of this.

With the holiday weekend in full swing, teams are currently playing in various Tournaments all across the area. As this goes to press, we're just learning of the boys 11U Babe Ruth Boys Team winning a Championship in Syracuse this past Sunday. The green and gold teams of Shoshone Park travel well and represent North Buffalo with all their might. Parents and families are indeed the keys to successful play and results. Baseball and Softball games are huge events in Shoshone Park and crowds gather around ball diamonds til almost 10:00pm, even on week-nights.

It's an exciting season happening in Shoshone Park this year with league playoffs happening soon. Every team makes the playoffs and with 76 clubs playing in ten divisions, the best part of Summer is in July when a Championship is won in Shoshone Park. At approximately 7:30pm each night, I move quickly to each diamond to learn the final score of a particular game and quickly ask questions as to how the game was won. In these little interviews with the volunteer coaches for both boys and girls teams, I quickly take down information for use in this column the following weekend. Unfortunately, not all the information is used in these reports but the opportunity to watch these games and report scores to the League is indeed a pleasure and has been for years. We're lucky to have Buffalo Rocket in this community as a source for some good information for all.

Someone approached me recently and asked how I'm able to get all this information and what about their son or daughter? I quickly responded that I talk to the coaches in the Park after every game and they tell me the names of who should go into a printed newspaper as scoring the winning run or throwing the strikeout. My goal has been to be there for the boys and girls when the games end because everyone's a winner in my eyes.

## Felonies

**North Buffalo**  
**June 30, 2023**  
Hertel Avenue – Defendant did threaten victim with knife causing victim to fear for his life. Victim did subdue defendant and while doing so defendant fought with victim. Knife recovered on scene by patrol officer, submitted by same AT issued.

**June 28, 2023**  
North Park Avenue – Officers received a 911 call of a black male wearing a white shirt, black hoodie over shoulder reportedly rummaging through a New York registered vehicle. 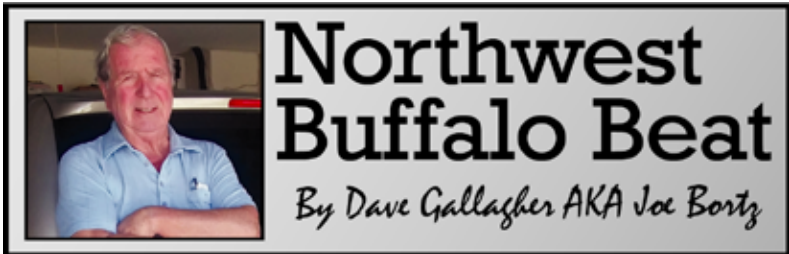

## End The Day With A Bang



### America's Bicentennial — July 4, 1976.

Seems like every year there is a fourth of July. Just the way it is and there is no way to change it. Fortunately, here in America it is a date to remember as it is the day we gained our Independence from England. As the late Billy Fuccillo would have said, “it was huge”. So every year we celebrate this date with parades and most of all, fireworks. There are more fireworks displayed on this day than any other day of the year. Fourth of July has become synonymous with the night light being lit with bright colors and loud bangs. It is a tradition and done both publicly on a large scale and residentially in backyards across this great nation.

Personally, I have lived through many of these special events on this day and of course they include fireworks and how dangerous they can be. The furthest back I could recall when as a kid, the house three doors down from us burned down as somehow or another the roof was ignited by an errant spark from a domestic firework. Talk about a firework display. This was a two-family wooden structure, and it went fast.

Second fourth of July that I vividly remember was when one of those explosions that you see in the sky, came down and exploded on the ground amid the admiring crowd. Do not recall the year but my children were young. Think we had about six at the time. Every year Riverside Park had a huge fireworks display. Large crowds would gather and lay on blankets, they had concessions and it was an all-day event. Back then, the fireworks were fired so they would go off over your head. I think since then they have stopped that practice. On this day, one of these many incendiaries displays you see in the sky, went up and then came down and exploded in the crowd. Like a bomb going off.

The immediate human

response for that is to run and get as far away from the danger as possible, which people did. My responsibility was to see that my family was safe. My kids, as most around us, ran off in different directions. In the ensuing chaos I had to round them up one by one and tell them to remain by a large tree located nearby. We did that till we were all together again. Not so for many who suffered burns and were trampled by the crowd. The rest of the night was filled with sirens and rescue personnel attending to the victims. A night to remember.

Then there was the fourth of July in 1976, the big one, the 200-year anniversary of the birth of our nation. This one had to outdo every other fourth. How better to spend it than in New York city? It was supposed to be bigger than New Year's Eve and the ball drop. The whole town was going to be lit up with tons of visual delights and the loud noises that accompany them. This was going to be a momentous occasion.

My daughter, who lives in Manhattan, had planned for us, my wife and I and two of our youngest children, to watch from a boat. We were going to be out in New York harbor along with thousands of other floating crafts. This way we could see the ring of fireworks from all over the big apple. We were supposed to be fed and entertained as we understood it. Turned out to be a disaster. They forgot to load the food. Since the harbor was loaded with so many boats, it was impossible to return. The only food on this boat, with hundreds of passengers, was hot dogs and candy bars. Due to the large crowd, they had to be rationed and some got nothing. We boarded at five and returned after midnight, hungry.

The highlight of that night was when the fireworks began. The captain turned the ship sideways to get a better view of the

city. The people of the boat all ran to the viewing side causing the ship to lean way over that side. It was in danger of capsizing until those with leveler heads ran to the opposite side to even out the load. That would have really been a night to remember, swimming in the Hudson River

on the fourth of July. It would not be the fourth without fireworks and as dangerous as they are, and can be, we love them. As we sit there watching them go off one by one and sigh in awe, waiting with bated breath for the grand finale. That is when the whole sky lights up with color

and brightness. Louder and louder booms tell you it is reaching its climax. Then the stillness and silence, the smell of sulfur tells you the fourth is over for another year and the crowd slowly disperses. But I guarantee you, without fail, the fourth of July will again return next year.

## Ask Rusty – Having Difficulty With Social Security’s Sign-In Process

**Dear Rusty:** Last month I tried to contact Social Security, who never picked up a phone on their end. The same with the IRS. When I finally got through, they said I had to join ID.me before they could help me.

That took me over a week, and many applications and rejects, to get through. The last step was holding up my Social Security card and my driver’s license on a Zoom call to an ID.me representative. I found this very peculiar — why do I have to go through this place to get information from my government agencies?

Now I am receiving catalog offers to buy things from ID.me online. I think this is very strange and out of line. How do I get unregistered from this place? I am very afraid they will share my information with the world.

**Is this a government agency and why do we have to register there, only to have offers to buy things?**

**Signed: Frustrated Senior**

**Dear Frustrated:** Many others have shared with us their frustration when seeking enrollment in the federal government’s newest credential verification programs so, though I know it’s no comfort, you are not alone.

Social Security has, since Sept.18, 2021, required all newly created online accounts to use either ID.me or Login.gov to authenticate the user’s identity. ID.me is a private company contracted by the government to ensure that you are who you say you are, thus avoiding any fraudulent activities. Login.gov is the government’s own authentication program set up to allow access to multiple government agencies for the same purpose.

The intent of both is to

give you one set of sign-in credentials that can be used to access multiple government agencies, rather than a unique login procedure for each agency. And, most importantly, the purpose is to protect you from any fraudulent activities that could cause you financial harm.

Rest assured that your personal information is safe using either of these government-sponsored methods to verify your identity for government business.

Those who have a “my Social Security” account set up before September 2021 can still use their previous SSA-unique identity verification method (a “2-factor ID process”) to access their “my Social Security” online account.

This method is as secure as the newer methods but is only good for accessing your Social Security account (not the IRS or any other government agency). Nevertheless, creating a new online Social Security account now requires you use the government’s current identity verification methods, either ID.me or Login.gov.

If you select ID.me (a private company) you do have control over the type of communication you receive from them and can opt out of receiving any offers for additional services.

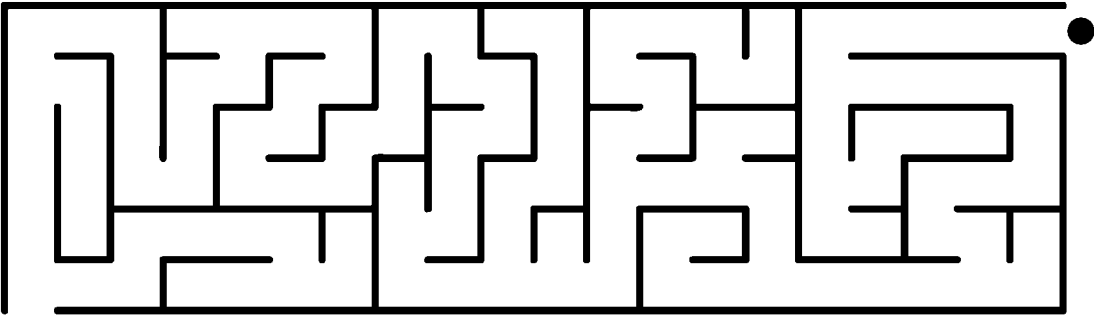

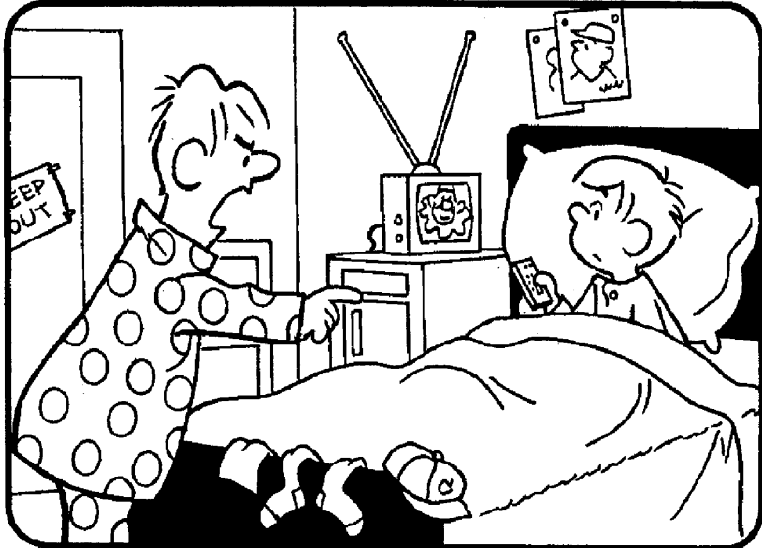

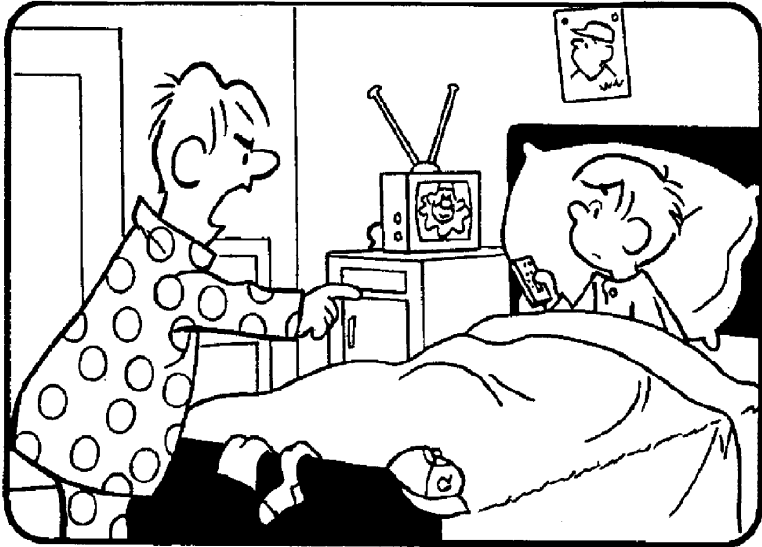
