## **Motorists Submit Vision Test Before NYS DMV Deadline**

Erie County Clerk Michael P. Kearns is reminding drivers once again that they are in risk of having their driver's license suspended if they fail to comply with New York State Department

of Motor Vehicles (NYS DMV) vision screening policy. Due to the

COVID-19 pandemic, motorists were allowed to renew their New York State driver license on-line by self-certifying their vision. By doing so they agreed to submit a vision test within one year of that date. According to Kearns, the NYS DMV is issuing this final warning, "If your license expired between 3/1/2020 – 8/31/2021 and you renewed online by self-certifying your vision, but have not submitted a vision test to the NYS DMV, your license

will be suspended on 12/01/2023." "We are asking those who chose to self-certify their vision online to complete the screening process," said Erie County Clerk Michael P. Kearns. "If you have failed to submit

your vision test results, or take one at your local DMV office, you are putting your driving privileges in jeopardy of immediate suspension. Do not ignore this final remindKearns stated, "Per the NYS DMV, this type of suspension will remain open on the driving record until the motorist submits the acceptable proof of the eye exam. Once acceptable action has been completed by the motorist, the suspension will be cleared. However, as this is a manual process, it may take up to 5 days for the suspension to be removed from NYS DMV system.

The NYS DMV has again sent reminder notices to drivers who renewed their driver license on-line and chose to defer their vision test upon *Continued on page seven.*

#### North Buffalo November 20, 2023

Military Road – Detective along with co-defendant did enter and remain in laundromat at 2420 Delaware unlawfully in business after being told to leave by owner on site. Defendant and co-defendant did remain in business and continue to snore inside building and leave garbage throughout. Owner is requesting an order of protection due to defendants repeatedly trespassing.







## Ask Rusty – About The Fairness Of "WEP" And "GPO"

Dear Rusty: I was married to my ex-husband for 30 years. For 14 of those years, I was an unemployed mom and community volunteer. After my sons were grown, I began teaching in California and earned a teacher pension. That teacher pension elim-inates ALL the spousal benefits my husband paid for. How can that be jus-tified? I, like a number of my retired friends, rent out rooms in my house to be able to live on a small teacher's pension and get none of my earned spousal benefits.

Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advisor.

Signed: Frustrated Teacher

Frustrated Dear Teacher: I can only say that your frustration is shared by many retirees from public service in States which do not participate in the federal Social Security program – that is, neither the employee nor the State contribute to the federal Social Security program. There are about 26 states (including California) which exempt at least some of their employees (and themselves) from paying Social Security payroll taxes, but those states are obligated to provide retirement benefits robust enough to offset the loss of Social Security benefits which will occur later in life after the employee

retires. As controversial as these laws - the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and the Government Pension Offset (GPO) - are, they have withstood legal challenges since they were enacted four decades ago.

Because you have a "non-covered" pension from your state employment, WEP reduces any personal Social Security retirement benefit you may have earned elsewhere and, to your specific point, the GPO has eliminated the spousal benefit you might otherwise have been entitled to from your ex-husband. Like you, many who are affected believe this to be unfair, but Congress has steadfastly failed to enact legislation to repeal these provisions, or even to soften their impact. The likely reason is that Congress has evaluated the fundamental premise of the provisions and concluded they appropriately equalize the way benefits are paid to all Social Security beneficiaries.

It might help to think of it this way: in normal circumstances, if one spouse has a personally earned Social Security retirement benefit which is more than 50% of their partner's full retirement age (FRA) amount, no spousal benefit is paid (the spouse benefit is offset by the recipient's own SS retirement benefit). The GPO (the provision which affects SS

spousal and survivor benefits) applies that same logic for a spouse who has a "non-covered" pension earned outside of the Social Security program, their spousal benefit is offset by the amount of the person's own "non-covered" retire-ment pension. The one difference is that the GPO offset is actually a bit smaller (2/3rds of the non-covered pension vs. 100% offset for a spouse with their own SS retirement benefit).

Both WEP (which reduces SS retirement benefits) and the GPO (which reduces spousal or survivor benefits) are consequences of working for a State which has chosen to not participate in the federal Social Security program, and those states are obligated to inform their employees of those consequenc-es. I know that doesn't make your situation any less frustrating, but Con-gress "justifies" these provisions as being necessary to equalize how benefits are paid to all Social Se-

curity beneficiaries. There are about 2 million beneficiaries affected by WEP and over 700,000 affected by the GPO, most of whom share your displeasure. Nevertheless, Congress has so far maintained both these provisions as originally enacted. If you wish to add your voice to those

who believe WEP and GPO are unfair, you may wish to contact your federal Congressional Representatives to express that point.

There are 3 options to show that you have visual acuity of at least 20/40 (based on the Snellen Visual Acuity Scale) in either or both eyes, with or without corrective lenses, in order to meet the NYS DMV requirement: Pass a vision test by an approved provider and the provider will enter the results to the DMV's Vision Registry for you; If you pass a vision test from a provider that is not approved to be in DMV's Vision Registry, you can ask your provider to complete a Vision Test Report (MV-619) to give to you and you can submit that original copy by mail: Erie County Auto Bureau, 170 Pearl Street, Buffalo, NY 14202, Attn: Vison Results;




