

## **Xavier Mann: The Man!**

The tragedy at the Tops Market on Jefferson Avenue last year was still in the hearts of thousands of East Buffalo residents on the anniversary of the ten lives lost on May, 14, 2022. While the City tried to force change for a better Community, tributes for Lt. Aaron Salter Jr. and the nine other victims in this horrific event poured into the minds for a better Buffalo from now on.

Several months ago, three longtime friends of the late Aaron Salter Jr., got together and set up an annual scholarship to honor the man who confronted the killer and saved precious minutes from the crime so more store shoppers and employees could escape. The three men are Nate Goldsmith, Earl Perrin and Bradford Pitts. A panel was set up to search for young students that were emblematic of their deceased friend and after some consideration, a former player in the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League named Xavier Mann was selected as the inaugural recipient for the Aaron Salter Jr. Memorial Scholarship.

"It's a great honor to represent everything that Mr. Salter stood for in this Community and I hope to continue his legacy," said Mann, 18, recently in a telephone interview home after his first semester at Lenoir-Rhyne University in North Carolina. "I couldn't believe I was

receiving it. When everything happened, I couldn't imagine so many people like me just being gone."

Mann, a City Honors
High School Junior at
the time of the shooting,
was playing shortstop for
the Centaurs and leading the team to a sectional title under coach
John McMahon. Several
of his teammates were
also former players of the
Hertel North Park Youth
Baseball League, including Matt Cambria, Connor Keiffer, Nathaniel
Gilbert, Quinn Mahoney,
Liam Meyers and Quinn
Langdon.

A stand-out athlete in the North Buffalo Baseball league, Mann started learning the game in t-ball at the age of five in 1999 under the watchful eyes of his father, Mike, and has been playing ever since. He and his wife, Robin have taken an active role in the lives of their two children, Xavier and a younger sister, Karrington, a fierce competitor on a softball diamond. Xavier played over 14 years in Shoshone Park on both house and travel teams. He was a big part of the reason the Pirates won a Senior Division House Championship in 2009 on the 90 foot diamond at the age of 13.

Mr. Mann, Xavier's Dad, is no stranger to the game of Baseball. He played the game as a youth for the old River Rock Little League and later for Hutch-Tech. He feels interest in the game has dwindled in time in the City. But as a youth coach for his son and other boys, he also teaches lessons in humility and imparts this on a team.

"This is a tremendous honor and achievement for Xavier," said Mann. "I feel my son will be able to emulate the characteristics of Aaron Salter Jr. and carry out the goals of this magnificent honor. He realizes the Johnnie B. Wiley Sports Pavilion, where he played and practiced for games, is just blocks from where this Tops Market is. The magnitude of what happened on May 14 will always be entrenched in his mind..

At Christmas time, we remember the lives of the ones we've lost. We reflect on the year just passed and look forward to 2024. We look for new baseball helmets or a catcher's glove under our tree. But we get ready for a new season. Western New York native Jonah Heim helps lead the Texas Rangers to their first ever World Series since 1972, when the moved from Washington and the Oakland A's are moving to Las Vegas. It's still America's game.





## Ask Rusty - Are Spousal Benefits Always A Factor?

Dear Rusty: Both my wife and I have worked our entire lives. When we retire, will we both be entitled to full benefit amount each, or will there always be a spousal factor in there? Also, how are those benefits calculated – based on your highest salaries throughout your career, or your ending salaries when you retire?

Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advisor.

Signed: Looking Ahead

**Dear Looking:** Prior to retiring from work is a smart time to investigate how Social Security will fit into your golden years. To answer your second question first, each person's personal SS retirement benefit is based on the highest-earning 35 years over their entire lifetime, with earlier years adjusted for inflation. The person's Average Indexed Monthly Earnings (AIME) essentially the person's lifetime average inflation-adjusted monthly earnings amount – is first determined. Using AIME, the person's Primary Insurance Amount (PIA) is calculated using a special benefit formula which will yield a PIA of about 40% or less of the person's AIME. The PIA is the amount received if benefits start in the month full retirement age or "FRA" is attained (as you can see, Social Security likes acronyms).

Since you and your wife were both born after 1959, FRA for both of you is 67. The age when you claim benefits, relative to your FRA, determines how much you'll get. Claim before FRA and your benefit is reduced; claim after your FRA and your SS retirement benefit will be more (up to age 70 when maximum is reached); claim at your FRA and your benefit will equal your PIA – the full (100%) amount you've earned from a lifetime of working.

Spouse benefits only come into play if the PIA for one of you is less than 50% of the other's PIA. In that case, the spouse with the lower PIA gets a "spousal boost" to their own SS retirement benefit when claimed. The amount of the "spousal boost" will be the difference between the lower PIA and half of the higher PIA, but the amount of the "spousal boost" (as well as the person's own SS retirement amount) will be reduced if benefits are claimed before full retirement age. Any time SS benefits are claimed before full retirement age, those benefits are permanently reduced.

If one spouse is entitled to a "spousal boost" from the other, the spousal amount will reach maximum at the recipient's full retirement age. Thus, if the lower earning part-

ner's highest benefit will be as a spouse, then that spouse should not wait beyond their FRA to claim. If, instead, the lower earning partner's own SS benefit at age 70 is more than their spousal amount, waiting longer than FRA to claim could be prudent, depending on life expectancy.

So, as you can see, deciding when to claim So-Security benefits should consider many things, including financial need, work status if claiming before FRA, marital status, and life expectancy. But it is your lifetime earnings which determines your SS retirement benefit amount, and it is how your FRA entitlements compare to each other that determines whether spousal benefits will be paid.






