# Winter Traffic Safety



## Keep safe in the winter storm with these traffic safety tips.

The leading cause of death during winter storms is accidents. transportation Preparing your vehicle for the winter season and knowing how to react if stranded or lost on the road are the keys to safe winter driving.

- Have a mechanic check the following items on your car:
- BatteryWinter highway Antifreeze
- Wipers and windshield washer fluid
- Ignition system
- Thermostat
- Lights
- Flashing hazard lights
- Exhaust system
- Heater
- Brakes Defroster

- Oil level (if necessary, replace existing oil with a winter grade oil or the SAE 10w/30 weight variety)
- Install good winter tires. Make sure the tires have adequate tread. All-weather radials are usually adequate for most winter conditions.
- Keep a windshield scraper and small broom for ice and snow removal.
- Maintain at least a half tank of gas during the winter season. Plan long trips careful-
- ly. Always travel during daylight and, if possible, try not to travel alone.
- Let someone know your timetable and primary

and alternate routes. Dress to fit the season.

- Wear loose-fitting, lightweight, warm clothing in several layers. Trapped air insulates. Layers can be removed to avoid perspiration and subsequent chill. Outer garments should be tightly woven, water repellent and hooded. Wear a hat. Half your body heat loss can be from the head. Cover your mouth to protect your lungs from extreme cold. Mittens, snug at the wrist, are better than gloves. Try to stay dry.
- Carry food and water. Store a supply of high-energy "munchies" and sev-

## Winter Traffic Safety

Continued from page one. high-energy "munchies" and several bottles of water.

If trapped in car during a blizzard:

- Stay in the car. Do not leave the car to search for assistance unless help is visible within 100 yards. You may become disoriented and lost in blowing and drifting snow.
- Display a trouble sign. Hang a brightly colored cloth on the radio antenna and raise the car hood.
- Occasionally run engine to keep warm. Turn on the car's engine for about 10 minutes each hour. Run the heater when the car is running. Also, turn on the car's dome light when the car is running. Beware of carbon mon-

oxide poisoning. Keep the exhaust pipe clear of snow and open a downwind window slightly for ventilation.

• Watch for signs of frostbite and hypothermia.

If more than one person is in the car, take turns sleeping.

• Avoid overexertion. Cold

weather puts an added strain on the heart. Unaccustomed exercise such as shoveling snow or pushing a car can bring on a heart attack or make other medical conditions worse. Be aware of symptoms of dehydration.

### North Buffalo **January 12, 2024**

Delaware Avenue - Defendant did switch barcode on action figures and did take without permission (2) action figures scanned at \$1.19 and did pass all points of purchase. Defendant should have paid \$45.98 for merchandise.

## Ask Rusty - If I Apply Now, When Will I Get My First Social Security Check?

Dear Rusty: If I were to apply for my Social Security retirement (I will be 68 on November 1, 2023), when could I realistically expect to receive my first check?

Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advisor.

#### Signed: Ready to Claim

Dear Ready: Social Security suggests applying for benefits 2 - 3 months before you wish payments to begin, to allow time for processing your application. When you apply, you will specify the month you wish your benefits to start, and that is when your benefits will officially begin. But Social Security pays benefits in the month following the month they are earned. So, if, for example, you applied and specified November 2023 as your benefit start month, your benefit for that month wouldn't be received until December. The payment date for you will be on the 2nd Wednesday (because you were born between the 1st and 10th of the month), and your payment won't be by check but rather by direct deposit into your bank account. Here are a few other things you should be aware of:

Plenty of food for everyone and it was inexpensive. So many Saturday nights and laughs and fun. Sometimes you won as much as two dollars.

Then TV came along and made our lives so much better. Add computers and we became so much smarter. Put the two together and we are fulfilled. Who needs to listen to other people's rhetoric? We now have professionals telling stories, like the news. It is better, isn't it?
