# 2024 Spring Bulk Trash Collection

Mayor Byron W. Brown and the City of Buffalo Department of Public Works, Parks & Streets announced that another new season of Spring Bulk Trash Collection will begin during the week of Sunday, April 7th in the Ellicott District.

"We're pleased to announce a new year of bulk trash collection in Buffalo, which kicks off in early April in the Ellicott District. I ask City residents to follow the guidelines on the amount and type of items that can be put out for collection," said Mayor Érown. "I also ask residents to get their bulk trash to the curb on the Sunday of their designated

collection week as pick-ups will take place Monday through Saturday, not just on their scheduled garbage day."

Residents are asked to follow the posted parking regulations in their neighborhood to make sure trash collection equipment has access to the curbside piles. The 2024 Spring Bulk Trash Collection Schedule is as follows.



Continued from page one. in Blasdell, N.Y. with his mother (Amanda), father (Eric), and ten-year-old sister, Frankie!

By just age 2, when many children are littered with bumps and bruises from exploring the world, Oliver had already experienced 31 broken bones. Born with osteogenesis imperfecta (OI), Oliver's bones are extremely brittle, which causes them to break and fracture easily. Read more below on his resilient spirit and inspiring journey at Oishei Children's Hospital (OCH) and The Variety Tent #7 Robert Warner, MD Center for **Developmental Pediatrics** and Rehabilitation.

Amanda's 20-At week ultrasound, results came back that her baby, Oliver, had a femur that was broken. From there, Amanda had specialist appointments every month until he was born to keep an eye on his development. Doctors were initially confused as to why his femur appeared bent and broken. And then they realized his tibias were too short. And then they found that his arms were also underdeveloped. Specialists said it could be either osteogenesis imperfecta (OI), a rare genetic disorder that prevents the body from building strong bones, or dwarfism.

Once Oliver was born, it was obvious he had OI. With 8 broken bones, he was in The Children's Guild Foundation Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at Oishei Children's Hospital (OCH) for 6 weeks and had 6 more breaks in that time.

With Oliver's condition, he can break a bone by just moving around or being held. Amanda recalls a time when he was just sitting on the couch and moved the wrong way, resulting in a sudden break. Another time, Amanda sat him up and accidentally broke a bone. And yet another time, she was putting him down for bed, scooping underneath him, and accidentally broke his collarbone and shoulder blade – it just happens no matter how careful they try to be.

Amanda estimates that Oliver has had 11 surgeries so far. His first was at a month old for a feeding tube and then a port for the infusions he was getting every two months, which since then has had to be replaced as it stopped working properly. He has had rods placed in both left and right femurs, tibias, and humeri, which were three separate surgeries. The rods in his legs have already been replaced as he grew out of them. In the foreseeable future, Oliver's arm rods will need to be replaced, but that surgery is down the road for him and his family.

Oliver's condition also causes brittle teeth. He has had caps placed to help protect some of his teeth and 6 other teeth removed as they were worn down. His last set of surgeries was for a new feeding tube along with a colostomy bag. Because his hips tip to the point where they almost touch, Oliver suffers from chronic constipation and a slower digestive system. He is always bloated and backed up, which is somewhat alleviated by his colostomy bag. However, his stoma for the same issue has problems caused him recently. It has prolapsed and herniated, calling for another surgery only a week after being inserted. Once that settled down, it was causing him irritation as it was too close to his skin, resulting in a third surgery.

Currently, Oliver participates in physical therapy through The Variety Tent #7 Robert Warner, MD Center for Developmental Pediatrics and Rehabilitation at OCH. Initially fearful of coming and participating in hands-on therapy for fear of breaking a bone, he has grown to trust his physicians and is starting to enjoy his time there. He loves the big walker, working with his therapist, and seeing friends that he has made. He is extremely excited to get started with water therapy!

Some fun facts about Oliver whose family affectionately calls "Ollie", include his excitement for building Legos! He is the #1 fan of Kraft Mac & Cheese and loves the color Red. Sonic, the Hedgehog and Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles are a few of his favorite things. He is truly a ray of sunshine with a smile that will light up any room.





# Ask Rusty – Should I Claim Social Security At 68, Or Wait Until I'm 70?

Dear Rusty: I have a question regarding my Social Security benefits. I turned 68 this month and work part time. I earned \$28,000 last year but will probably gross \$36,000 to \$38,000 this year. My husband collects his SS, and he earned \$25,000 last year. I was told by a financial planner that I should apply for my benefits now, instead of waiting until I'm 70. I would collect \$1700/month at 68 and \$1944/month if I wait. Which is the smarter move? Signed: Seeking Answers

**Dear Seeking:** I'm sure your financial advisor would agree that your decision on when to claim your Social Security comes down to just a few basic things -1) how badly you need the money, 2) your life expectancy, and 3) whether you will receive a spousal boost from your husband when you claim.

Because you have already passed your full retirement age (FRA) of 66 years and 4 months, your work earnings won't negatively affect your monthly SS benefit amount. If you claim now, however, your work earnings will affect how much of your SS benefits will be subject to income tax. Assuming you file your income tax as "married/fil-ing jointly," up to 85% of the Social Security benefits you receive during the tax year will become part of your income taxable by the IRS. If you do not urgently need the extra money that your SS will provide, then wait-ing longer to claim will also postpone paying income tax on your received benefits, and that may be a consideration.

Your life expectancy is key in making your decision on when to claim. You already know that your ben-

efit will be \$244 per month more if you wait until you are 70 to claim. If you claim at 68 (e.g., this month), you will collect about \$40,800 by the time you reach 70. If you, instead, wait until age 70 to get that extra \$244/month benefit, it will take you about 14 years collecting at the higher rate to offset the \$40,800 you would have received had you claimed now (in other words, you would break even moneywise at about age 84). If your life expectancy is longer, then waiting to claim may be the better choice. Of course, no one knows how long they will live but, for general guidance, average life expectancy for a woman your current age is about 87. Family history and your current health are obviously influencing factors as well. If you wish to get a more personal estimate of your life expectancy, I suggest using this tool:

www.socialsecurityreport.org/tools/life-expectancy-calculator/

In the end, if you believe you will attain at least average life expectancy and you don't urgently need the money now, waiting longer will not only give you a higher monthly benefit in your later years, but also the most in cumulative lifetime benefits.




### JN Adams Memorial Hospital in Perrysburg, NY.

We are living through it, another epidemic.

Upon entering Grammer school many years ago, Kindergarten children were required to stand in line and get a smallpox vaccination. It was mandatory, no questions asked, but the vac-cine did the job. Wiped-out smallpox in this country and the world. It was one of those killer epidemics. Most modern people have never even heard of smallpox. Just like most never heard of Polio or Tuberculosis. Both were killers or cripplers of thousands. Polio, to survive some had to be placed in what was called an "iron lung." Most people are aware that President Theodore Roosevelt was a victim of Polio and used a wheelchair most of his presidency.

The vaccine for smallpox was my first encounter with any infectious disease. We worried about polio until Johannes Salk came up with the Salk vaccine. Took that worry off the table. Polio was no longer a major concern. However, there were many people that were contracting and dying of TB, Tuberculosis. It was common and even hit our family. My dad's sister, my aunt Mildred got TB. If I remember right, it was highly contagious and life threatening. I was just a kid.

There was a hospital built in Perrysburg here in Western New York just for Tuberculosis patients. It was named the J.N. Adams Memorial Hospital after the then Mayor of Buffalo who donated the land. They had found that sunshine and fresh air helped in the cure. Its purpose was exclusively to treat people with TB. This facility started out with 120 beds and eventually expanded to hold 420 residents. The building is still there, a magnificent structure in disrepair. It has a fence around it and has been abandoned for many years. Seen pictures of what it looked like as a sanatorium. People can still drive by as it is a pleasant ride in the country. The scenery is outstanding. Perrysburg is named after Commadore Perry, Lake Erie hero in the war of 1812. The area has the



nickname of "Enchanted Mountains", I will return to a point about TB a bit later.

Seems like epidemics, like Covid, come along, for whatever reason every so often. Worldwide I think Covid has killed millions. This being the latest killer of the masses. We just lived through one of many. It was the one destined to happen in our lifetime. Over one million have died in the US alone since it began. Would like to think it is now a thing of the past, but we never know. Personally, in my family of ten including my wife and seven of the eight received the vaccine. My one daughter and I opted to not get the needle. Of the seven that received the vaccination, six got Covid. Sick but not life threatening. My non-vaccinated daughter and I never got Covid, so far. One vaccinated son also did not get it. My wife went to the hospital the day after her booster shot and died two months later. Never got better after the shot. Not saying it had anything to do with her passing, but it makes one wonder.

Getting back to tuberculosis. Must realize this was a killer and feared by most in that era. Doctors and researchers produced a cure and made TB just history, something people do not even remember anymore. I did not think about it again till it was injected into me. Procedure called BCG. I am no doctor and had to rely on what I was told. After a couple of bouts with bladder cancer and having two different tumors removed, my Urologist recommended that I have the BCG treatment. Has something to do with tuberculosis. Not sure how it works but has to do with building up your immune system. So far it has worked perfectly as the cancer has not returned. Has been a couple of years. Just wonder if it does prevent cancer cells from growing,

why it is not used more. I am sure that if there was a way, they would use it. Wouldn't they?

In any event, we have survived a terrible epidemic and live to talk about it, thanks to the vaccine producers. Good or bad we have longer lives to look forward to.
