

## **Special One-Stop Passport Acceptance Fairs**

**ERIE COUNTY** 

AUTO BUREAU

County Clerk Michael P. Kearns announced that his office will be conducting "Passports on the Move" outreach events in March at select AAA Travel and Insurance

Centers throughout Erie County. This community event is for first-time passport applicants only. Reservations are required and can be made contacting the Erie County Clerk's Outreach Center at (716) 858-8864.

These passport events will be held on "Travel Tuesdays" from 5pm-7pm at the following AAA of Western and Central New York branch offices: Amherst/ Williamsville, March 12th and KenTon, March 26th.

"I am pleased to bring this popular service to residents of Erie County, along with our community partners at AAA of Western and Central New York," said County Clerk Kearns. "Our main objective is to make County government more customer-centered, including offering easily accessible locations for travelers to apply for their U.S. passport.

Applicants will be able to apply for a passport card, passport book or both. Pay-

ment must be in the form of check or money order. No cash or credit cards will be accepted. "I encourage anyone planan upning spring coming vacation or college

students preparing for a semester abroad to schedule an appointment for our 'Passports on the Move' event while current wait times to receive a first-time passport are minimal at 6-8 weeks," Kearns stated.

A certified copy of birth certificate and proof of identity such as a current New York State driver's license or non-driver identification card is required in order for any application to be accepted. Passport photos can be taken on-site and are available for \$8.95, plus tax for AAA members and \$12.95, plus tax for non-members.

"International travel is back! 2024 is already proving to be a busy year with travelers looking to experience cultures and make memories around the globe. AAA urges travelers to get all the tools in place so they can embark on memorable trips this year, and step one is making sure you have a valid pass-port," said Elizabeth Carey, Director of Public Relations and Corporate Communications at AAA Western and Central New York. "Passports on the Move simplifies the passport process, and provides a valuable, convenient service for travelers.'

Current passport holders with less than 6 months validity remaining are encouraged to follow the instructions on how to renew their passport by mail at travel.state.gov/passports. Passport applications, a list of all required documents and a schedule of fees are available by visiting erie.gov/pass-ports or by contacting the Erie County Clerk's Office Outreach Center at (716) 858-8864.

## **Thieves Takes Cash And** Cigarettes At Local 7Eleven

#### North Buffalo March 2, 2024

Delaware Avenue - Complainant reports that arrested did take \$50.00 from the store register without permission and did conceal it in his right pocket. Video footage is available. Incident occurred on 2/20/24 at 1440 hours.

**February 28, 2024** 

Amherst Street - Defendant did take without permission and did pass all points of purchase \$793.94 worth of groceries. Loss prevention did apprehend defendant and did recover the groceries. Wegmans does have camera footage.

#### Riverside March 4, 2024

Unity Island - Officers did observe New York registered vehicle occupied 2x in the park after hours (9:00pm). The satchel also contained approximately 54 grams of suspected crack cocaine all individually packed in green plastic container inside of a clear mason jar. There also were a bundle of white glassine envelopes containing 1 gram of expected heroin. The defendant's tan jacket was recovered inside of a trash can in front of 116 Isabelle Street and his white sneakers were recovered from on top of the roof of 134 Isabelle. The firearm was loaded with 12 rounds in the magazine and one round in the chamber.

#### March 2, 2024

Elmwood Avenue - On 3/2/24 at approximately 123 hours while inside of 2101 Elmwood Avenue defendant did put \$239.74 worth of merchandise in a backpack taking without permission. Defendant did pass all points of purchase and was stopped in vestibule. Defendant issued appearance ticket.





## Ask Rusty - Will My Benefit Increase If I Work While Collecting Disability?

Dear Rusty: I will be 64 in March and currently receive Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) payments. My full retirement age is 67, but I'm thinking about trying to return to work.

If I work and my earnings exceed the monthly disability payment limits, but do not exceed the annual limit, how will my disability payments be affected? Will working while receiving Social Security disability payments change my Social Security benefit amount when I reach my full retirement age of 67?

Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advisor. Signed: Mending

**Dear Mending:** Social Security doesn't go by annual earnings when it comes to disability (SSDI) – they go by monthly earnings. If your work earnings in any one month of 2024 exceed \$1,550, that will be a flag to SS that you are no longer disabled (\$2,590 per month if you're blind). If that happens for a few months in a row, they will most likely stop your SSDI payments. Often, this happens retroactively – they won't find out until sometime later that you repeatedly exceeded the monthly limit – but they will likely cancel your SSDI benefits and require you to repay any benefits you received in months you exceeded the monthly SSDI earnings limit, or months they deem you were capable of working without restriction.

I suggest you consider enrolling in Social Security's "Ticket to Work" program. While enrolled, you can work and will have a rolling 9 month "Trial Work Period" over 5 years, during which you can earn more than \$1,110/month (in 2024) without jeopardizing your SSDI benefits. If, after completing your 9 month trial work period, you are taken off of SSDI (because you're no longer considered disabled), and you again become disabled and unable to work, your SSDI benefits can resume without requiring you to go through the entire application process again. You can test your ability to work, will be able to work some and can earn more than the limit in some months, which makes the Ticket to Work program your best option. Read more about it here: https://choosework.ssa.gov.

As for whether working while on SSDI will improve your benefit at your full retirement age (FRA), that depends. Your current SSDI benefit is equal to your FRA entitlement from your earnings record at your disability onset date (but paid to you prior to your FRA). The method for determining your benefit under SSDI is complex and depends on the age at which you became unable to work and the number of Social Security credits you had accumulated at that time. Although SS retirement benefits normally require you earn at least 40 SS quarter credits and are based on your highest earning 35 years, those approved for SSDI can get benefits with fewer than 40 credits and less than 35 years of lifetime earnings. Since each case is unique, I cannot say whether your earnings while on SSDI will improve your FRA amount, but Social Security will monitor your earnings and increase your benefit if appropriate.

FYI, your SSDI benefit would normally automatically convert to become your regular SS retirement benefit at your FRA at the same amount you were receiving while on SSDI. It's possible that the limited earnings you may have from working while on SSDI may increase your benefit, but that's impossible for me to predict. Your benefit is based on your lifetime earnings history (adjusted for inflation), not on your contributions to Social Security while working.

So, if you are on SSDI and wish to try returning to work, and you think your monthly earnings will occasionally exceed the SSDI limit, I suggest you contact Social Security (1.800.772.1213 or your local office) to explore enrolling in the Ticket to Work program. That would be your best option to avoid

jeopardizing your SSDI benefits, and your benefit amount will be automatically adjusted by Social Security if appropriate.
