# Large Scale Video Projection To Illuminate Albright-Knox

On October 5th, 2012, Buffalo will experience a spectacle of color and light on a scale never before seen in Western New York. The Albright-Knox Art Gallery will present Illuminate AK, Western New York's first large-scale 3D video projection mapping project. The Gallery's iconic 1905 Albright Building will come alive in 3D, telling the story of the Gallery's history and famed collection.

Thousands of spectators

from across Western New York and beyond are expected to congregate on the Gallery's grounds to enjoy this remarkable free show and unique civic experience. Two viewings of the projection are scheduled to be presented at 7:30 and 8:30 pm. Music and refreshments from Buffalo food trucks will add to the entertainment.

Extremely advanced and powerful 30,000-lumen projectors will create the spectacle. Albright-Knox Curator for the Collection Holly E. Hughes and Digital Media Manager Kelly Carpenter are collaborating with the video-mapping artist Daniel Hartnett to produce a totally unique and dynamic work that will be projected directly onto the Gallery's 1905 Albright Building in 3D.

"We are very excited to present Illuminate AK to the Western New York community" said Albright -Knox Director Louis Grachos. "The opportunity to celebrate the Gallery's 150th anniversary through such an extraordinary and artis-

tic means is incredible. We look forward to using this technology to illuminate the past and the present, and we hope that everyone will come to the gallery to enjoy the experience."

Three-dimensional video projection mapping makes large buildings come alive with color, depth, and motion. Images are manipulated to fit seamlessly onto a building's architecture, creating the illusion of three dimensions without the need for 3D glasses. Major video projection mapping projects have been presented at Frank Lloyd Wright's masterpiece Fallingwater, around Anish Kapoor's Cloud Gate at Millenium Park in Chicago, on London's Millbank Tower and even at the Super Bowl XLVI halftime show in 2012.

## 'Music Man'

MusicalFare honors "Music Man" to the last full measure. Just as Professor Harold Hill conjures illusions to pawn off instruments on "troubled" River City, Director Greg Kelly transforms conference tables into the Old Wood Bridge, cartwheeling choreography into Wells Fargo Wagon wheels and the tapping of dancing shoes into the clickety-clack of the Rock Island Line.

To Rocket Man, day coaches in motion have always sounded like an accelerating dance routine and that's exactly how choreographer Bobby Cooke gets "Music Man" moving, a terrifically complicated and comic number without an iron-horse trapping in sight.

In "Music Man" (1957). Meredith Willson sticks his tongue out at small towns. con men, politicians and incurable academics. Set exactly 100 years ago, it re-

quires little imagination to make it relevant to today. Though his "crime" (what IS his crime, by the way?) is far less heinous, Hill could be Bernie Madoff ingratiating himself to a coalition of willing suckers, and there are issues of bullying and dogwagging, as well.

As the myth-making musicologist, John Kaczorowski - an educator himself - projects a softer sort of swindler, with much more banter than bluster. Kelly's cast boasts "bench power" a-plenty – in fact, Ben Puglisi as old crony Marcellus, nice work in an underappreciated role, might, in a pinch, pick up the maestro's baton himself.

Angular of visage, clear of voice, Amy Jakiel is just the ticket as librarian Marian (rhymes with "carrion," who'd a thunk it?) with a richly projected style ranging from the plaintive "Goodnight My Someone" to the wryly argumentative "If You Don't Mind My Saying So" with a mother delicious wrought by Beth Donahue.

Donahue is red-headed TNT, a lighter twist on any number of maternal characters cast more darkly at Irish Classical. Young Adam Kluge, as Marian's dentallychallenged little brother, is a marvel physically, phonetically and musically. His singing makes "Gary, Indiana" sound like a tourist destination. Rocket Man once lived there. It ain't.

Brandon Barry and Christina Golab make an appealing pair of Romeo & Juliet lovers (with far less drastic consequences). Eric Rawski and Kerrykate Abel shower their Town's First Couple with delicious self-indul-

Rear projections backdrop the rural mood and Kari Drozd's eve for colorful costuming contrasts is 20-20. They all know the territory and if you don't mind my saying so, "Music Man" could play until 76 trombonists wear out their embouchures. 

## "Double Feature"

The other night I had rented the movie BEN HUR, as I had not seen it since 1959, if I saw it at all. The movie is a classic and even though it is that old it was still good to watch. Problem is the time is three hours and forty two minutes. That is a long time to watch the same program on television, other than sports. At least at home you could take breaks and pause during the flick to move around.

When this movie was at the theatres, there was a fifteen minute intermission in the middle, as it was so long you needed a break. So you figure you were in the theatre for four hours at least. Seem like a long time? Not before television and going to the movies was the in thing to do. Actually, just about the only thing you could do for inexpensive entertainment.

Movie theatres were all over the place. I could walk to the Senate on Rhode Island and West, the Victoria or Rialto on West Ferry near Grant across the street from each other, The Elmwood on Elmwood and Utica or the Unity on Grant Street. Now, which one and how do you choose? You chose the one with the best double features.

Double feature means two full length feature movies. Not only do you watch two movies, but they enhance it with news, short subjects and serials. Short subjects being like the Three Stooges and Oliver and Hardy. The serials were cliff-hangers that continued one week to the next. Usually the hero or heroine would be in mortal danger at the end, so you had to go back the following week to see how they escape. They would do anything to fill the theatre on the weekends. Usually they were full, as what else do you do?

Some movie theatres even gave out dishes to further entice you to come to their establishment. Each week it would be a different piece and my mother actually got a complete set of dishes free just for going to the movies. I think some are still in the family somewhere.

There was a down side to all this though, as I look back. In the middle of the theatre in the loges, as they were called, you were allowed to smoke. I recall my father, who was a smoker, had to sit in the loges or not go at all. Now you could just imagine being in an enclosed building with little or no ventilation, and people smoking for four plus hours. The first feature was pretty clear. The short subjects and the serials were okay for a while. At the end of the second feature you could cut the smoke with a knife. Had to look for the light from the movie to determine which end of the building the screen was on.

No wonder the generation died young.

GIFTS FOR BUYING GAS? The free dishes remind me of another perk. In those days gas was about twenty fives cents a gallon. Not only that, but they pumped your gas, checked your oil, washed your windshield and checked the air in your tires. Did everything they could to get you to use their gas station. Then, the one fellow got the idea of giving out gifts if you bought gas there. With every fillup you would get coupons. After so many coupons you could redeem them for merchandise he had displayed in his window. If I recall right, it was a Hamilton station on Niagara. Naturally, we would line up for gas as he was the only one doing that.

Now, you pay four dollars a gallon, pump it yourself, have to pay in advance, wash your own windshield, check your own oil and pump it yourself, and forget about bending for the air in the tires. When they look like they need to be filled, you have to buy the air. Gee, it was nice to be wanted as a customer back then and appreciated.


