Remembering Father Joe



Father Joe Moreno will be remembered for his dedication to serving the community.

Father Joseph Moreno will be remembered for the many community services and events he was involved with during his life in the Buffalo area. Father Joe Moreno was found dead in the rectory of St. Lawrence Church on Saturday, October 13, 2012 by a church employee.

A native of Buffalo, Father Moreno was born on June 21, 1958. He was ordained to the priesthood on April 25, 1986, at Holy Spirit Church in North Buffalo by Bishop Edward D. Head.

In a statement, Bishop Richard J. Malone, bishop of Buffalo, said "Father Joe was dedicated to the priesthood, especially when it came to serving others. His presence to the parishioners of St. Lawrence made him much beloved.

Those who knew Father Joe would tell you that he never said, 'No' to anyone, that he took care of everyone, regardless of their lot in life. He was a friend to law enforcement, as evidenced by the large police presence Saturday afternoon responding to the 9-1-1 call, and he was called to serve the elderly at St. Francis Home and members of St. Mary Parish in Cattaraugus. May God grant him eternal rest."

Father Moreno served a number of parishes in the diocese, including St. Aloysius, Springville; St. John, Olean; St. Margaret, North Buffalo and St. Vincent De-Paul, Attica. He also served as a chaplain at St. Francis Nursing Home, chaplain for the Kenmore Council 3076 Knights of Columbus on Kenmore Avenue and was very active in providing ministerial support to law enforcement.

'As I've Seen It...'

How do you write a tell-all book without infuriating the "tellees"? Sportscaster Ed Kilgore has the answer in a delightful autobiography titled "As I've Seen It... Wide Right, No Goal and other Buffalo Sports Sagas," now in local bookstores or directly from publisher and Rocket alumni Brian Meyer.

No offense to the author, but this book is perfect reading for what they call the smallest room in the house. It has 24 sections of various lengths, none more than 10 pages, and there's no chronological or other sort of order to discourage "cafeteria style"

Rocket Man plunged immediately into Chapter 20. an ode, of sorts, to one of Buffalo's all-time "character" anchorman, Ron Hunter. Many locals believe, incorrectly, that Hunter inspired the movie character Ron Burgundy in "Anchorman," an ego on stilts with no interest in the news beyond the way

he presented it.

Kilgore accepts Hunter warts and all (terrible choice of words), even while describing in painstaking detail the way Hunter manufactured an on-air tear one night in 1974 after a story on a girl with liver disease. While most scoffed at Hunter's egomania, Kilgore clearly liked the guy's company, and this short chapter is an exemplar of workplace tolerance. "Even now, thinking about Ron Hunter makes me smile," Kilgore concludes.

Then there's the time early in his career when Kilgore - whose real first name is "Kim," he confesses – wound up in a New York City YMCA with a room mate who "wasn't on the same team." Rocket Man thought he knew every euphemism for gender identity until he read that one.

Kilgore confronts the O. J. issue straight on. If he'd been on the criminal-case jury, they'd still be deadlocked. On the other hand, he has no

qualms about saving what great company Simpson could be. "How well do we really know anybody?" he finishes, another succinct sum-up.

Then there's a yarn about how the Courier-Express' Jim Baker (another Rocket alumni) swiped an off-the-record story by eavesdropping, and the "skinny" on how Kilgore led the world by 96 hours on the dismissal of coach Punch Imlach by the Sabres. Kilgore loads that story with irony. and without false modesty claims merely to have been in the right place at the right

Rocket Man's observation: So are a lot of hockey forwards, but only the exceptionally alert manage to get the biscuit in the basket, as they say. While inelegantly written (an opinion borrowed from one of Rocket Man's English-teaching relatives) with more than a few grammatical offsides, "As I've Seen It" scores early and often, so authentic that it almost needs a commercial break. Speaking of which, it goes for \$15.95, plus tax, in bookstores, and \$20 (the Rocket Man rate, request it) will bring it home from Western New York Wares, Box 733, Ellicott Station, Buffalo, NY

"The process can be a tad overwhelming, and we understand this," continued Howard. "This is one of the main reasons why our team works with home owners from start to finish. 
