'Visiting "Bro"'

Last Thanksgiving Rocket Man and his First Mate made pilgrimage to Philadelphia to see old buddy Brother Augustine Towey, CM, convalescing at St. Catherine's, 500 East Chelten. For those of you not quite familiar, "Bro" is to the Niagara University Theater Department as St. Peter is to the Roman Catholic Church as a whole. One could not number his disciples.

About 40 miles out, we called "Bro" and said we'd be there in about an hour.

This optimism did not take into account overshooting the exit by five miles, the interminable trolleytrack-encrusted strip mall which is Germantown Avenue, a platoon of no-left turn signs and then the battlements of the seminary itself.

St. Catherine's guards a neighborhood of desperate poverty, most properties announcing the presence of ill-tempered dogs (or "canes," as the signs cautioned the bilingual.) The receptionist suggested that "Bro" had awaited us for some time.

Bro's room was adorned with memorabilia, includ-

ing a picture of us. Considering all who have been touched by Bro, so many of them greats, that was humbling.

He told us that the week he arrived, five residents died. "Get me out of here," he had said. We told him "they were just making room for you."

A half-century earlier, he had attended seminary at this very address. "We were encouraged to take a walk" Sunday afternoons, and "Bro" had led his classmates to theatrical enterprises at nearby LaSalle, including "Death of a Salesman," invoking a stern rebuke from administrators.

Bro's order of Vincentians was little involved in education and he had anticipated service either cooking or repairing cars, for which he insisted he has little aptitude. He was amazed, then, to be dispatched to Niagara U "to teach," sparing untold digestive tracts and driveshafts.

His recollections included dead-on impressions of the likes of actor Vincent O'Neill and NU Prof. Sharon Onevelo Watkinson. As

for NU's new theater, largely the fruit of his efforts, he said, "I had just begun to think that I might make a career out of this, and then I had to leave." His abrupt departure from the school reminded us of the last act of "Damn Yankees" — Joe Hardy, going full speed to make that game-saving catch, is struck down, yet with reduced physical capabilities moves on and succeeds

Then in the doorway appeared a vision in uniformed white, a woman of breathtaking beauty, on a mission. She had work she must do with Bro, work that had been postponed pending our arrival, and while we were welcome to stay, we would need to wear masks.

Having missed our entrance, we sure knew an exit line when we heard it. Shortly we were heading into the sort of sunset that gives atheists the vapors.

This Thanksgiving, as George Burns would say, God gave him his pictures back. He was 75. Throughout Western New York, hundreds of former students and colleagues clustered by social media and in person to share remembrances of his time among us.

"That means your act is closed," Burns would say. Not Bro's. With every laugh and tear in any local playhouse, it lives on. And the faithful are certain that for Bro, it has only begun.



"Men Who Built America and North Buffalo"

Not to promote a television show, but I found this one outstanding. Being a history buff it is not uncommon for me to watch the History Channel. Recently, this particular channel had a series on the Men Who Built America. These were the men who happened to be the catalyst for events that made this country as great as it is.

Vanderbilt and his Railroads, making travel so much easier and connecting areas inland with trade goods that would otherwise take forever. Rockefeller and his oil, needed to oil machinery and kerosene to light up the nights, Andrew Carnegie, a poor Scottish immigrant who built the first steel bridge across the Mississippi and connected the east and west. Steel is the framework of modern America. Investor J.P. Morgan who invested in a young Thomas Edison and his introduction of electricity. Henry Ford and his new use of oil, gasoline.

The series is well done and if you can withstand the commercials, worth watching as it does inspire one to do what they would otherwise not do. Almost all these men at one time or another went bankrupt and experienced hard times, only to come out of it as very rich individuals. No risk, no reward, was the theme of the series. Although it is somewhat of a documentary it is not done as so. The men mentioned are played by actors with a narrator in the background. Anyway, I did enjoy it as truth is always better than

After watching the series I kind of wandered off into thinking of how different people have done things that change the lives of others. Even on a small scale like North Buffalo.

Came into this area some forty years ago and met some really good, inspiring people over the course of that time. Kind of brought me back to those early days when I started the Rocket. I will mention some of them, in hopes I do not misspell any names, as I will be doing it by memory.

Lou Bunis and his sons Maer and David, owners of the Sample shop at 1600 Hertel Avenue. This business started out as a small dress shop run by Lou's wife. The family built it into the largest independently owned retail store in the area. Eventually it took up the whole block with annexes across the street. A major part of North Buffalo is now gone and an apartment building now stands in its place.

The corner of Hertel and Parkside, one of the main intersections, saw Joe Sunshine open a super market with his sons Mel and Seymour. Across the street Ernie Van Slyke opened the successful Van Slyke pharmacy, one of the largest in the area at that time. Sunshine gave way to Walgreen's, along with the long standing furniture store located next door. Bob and John Hazelet, who gave up the wig business to bake pizzas.

The two Toms, Amedeo

and Passanissi who brought the Italian Festival from Connecticut St. to Hertel Ave.. Bob Ryan, who as director of the North Buffalo community center, brought many programs and projects that influence the quality of life in the area.

I could go up and down the street and mention all the different merchants who contributed to the growth of Hertel Avenue but I am sure I would forget someone. North Park Furniture, Ray's Cleaners, Sammy's, Mastman's. The large car dealer at Hertel and Delaware is now Burger King. There was even a skating rink across the street at that intersection.

As one thinks of all the changes and sees the evolution of what used to be into what is, you have to wonder, is it really better? It was not uncommon to go into a business, run by a person who you know took a chance, and actually be able to meet that person. I met all the Bunis family, as they were always there. The Sunshine boys were always there. The independent merchants were pretty much always there. Yes, it is convenient to go into Walgreen's or Kmart and be able to get whatever vou need. But isn't it nice

to be able to be greeted by the owner and know they appreciate your business?

Have you ever been in a restaurant and have the owner come over and talk to you? Even Russell Salvatore takes the time to meet and greet his customers. I know I like it, and I try to say hello to as many customers as I can at our shop. Just good business as we have all taken the risk of going into business on our own.


