New RiverRock Garden in Riverside Park



The new stone bridge is just one of the many beautiful features of RiverRock Garden in Riverside Park, which officially opens on July 19th.

The newly restored garden in Riverside Park will officially open to the public on July 19th, 2014 at the RiverRock Revival Community Picnic with a ribbon cutting ceremony at 11 am. The Buffalo Olmsted Parks Conservancy is inviting the public to come out and celebrate this beautifully restored landscape, called the RiverRock Garden.

The initial design began more than a decade ago and now features a brand new beautiful stone bridge, new pathways, over 1,100 new shrubs and 1,000 perennials, 12 new benches, and a new "green" storm water management system, a self-sufficient feature of the garden. Based off of historic layout and planting plans, this gar-

den is a reinterpretation of an Olmsted vision for the Riverside area.

The Conservancy is taking this opportunity to encourage families to get healthy and active. Every community can benefit from parks as they support physical activity, reduce air pollution and global warming, and can serve to help psychological and social health needs. Research studies have also found that even those with limited view of grass and trees from their homes report less mental fatigue, less procrastination with daily issues, and everyday problems as less severe and more solvable. "The idea is to get the Riverside community healthy and active with wonderful new walking paths," said

Thomas Herrera-Mishler, president and CEO, Buffalo Olmsted Parks Conservancy.

"This garden will give families a great place to enjoy nature's incredible views just outside their front door."

Designed in 1898, the 22-acre Riverside Park was the last park the Olmsted firm planned in Buffalo. Originally, park visitors could enjoy the Minnow Pools, a romantic stream with waterfalls and bridges, or walk along a formal concourse and across a footbridge over the Erie Canal. Today, the Irene K. Gardner Pedestrian Bridge links Riverside Park to the Riverwalk, part of the Niagara River Greenway Trail that

“Philadelphia Story”

Before there was “E!” there was “Philadelphia Story,” the big romantic comedy (emphasis romantic) in the Shaw Festival Theater at Niagara-on-the-Lake.

The time is 1939, when most rich and famous were content with rich alone. They had their own cadre of newspaper “society writers,” who were actually paid less than their peers. What happened on the estate stayed in the estate.

But now Tracy Lord, wed once to charming rogue Dexter Haven, is about to tie another knot with self-made coal baron George Kittering. A tabloid magazine dispatches a reporter-photographer team to dig for dirt. There’s another skeleton in the family closet and the Lords slide beneath the media microscope as the lesser of

two evils.

Philip Barry’s play saved the career of Katherine Hepburn. A movie swiftly followed. A later musical remake, “High Society,” starred Bing Crosby, Grace Kelly, Frank Sinatra, Louis Armstrong. Well, did you evah, as Cole Porter lyricized.

Here it sprawls as only the Shaw can, magnificent set, props and costumes to cry for, three sets of skis as wedding presents. Moya O’Connell makes Tracy her own. It’s hard not to be Hepburn here, and even the facial resemblances challenge the canny, but often the actress simply breaks away, a very un-Kate screech here, a nod there, a character another describes as unique to American women.

Dexter is deftly done by Gray Powell, a daring

choice by Director Dennis Garnhum, as he’s distinctly smaller than groom-apparent Thom Marriot and in his first appearance looks rather like a jockey. His spat with his ex positively sparkles.

There’s a nifty little role for Tess Benger as the younger and in many ways wiser sister, breathlessly outlining “illicit passion.” But that Phillies hat? Nah, wasn’t their logo in 1939, and the A’s were the bigger team in town. Just sayin’. Patrick McManus does splendidly as the reporter, the Sinatra role, self-defined as “a small pinfeather on the left wing.” There’s a nice turn by Ric Reed as the raffish Uncle Willie.

A few first-act lines were muffled, a unanimous vote of Rocket Man’s row, protecting privileged privacy now and again. The second act was much improved and huge applause arose as the curtain fell on the rise of nosiness in North America. “Philadelphia Story” will be told through late October. This special event is


brought to the community by celebration sponsor Common Council Member Joseph Golombek, Jr.

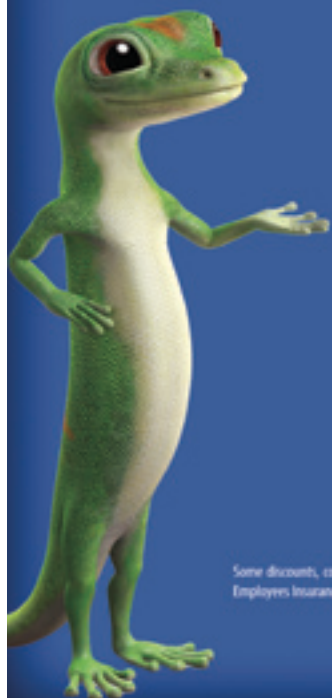

Deputy Mayor Leaving Position



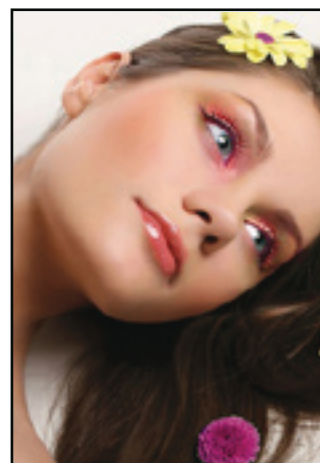
**Steven M. Casey will head

American Red Cross Summer Safety Tips

This summer many people will be traveling, swimming at the beach or in the pool, firing up the backyard grill, and the American Red Cross offers a series of steps everyone can follow to safely enjoy the summer.

The Red Cross has launched an anti-drowning campaign this sum-

mer that promotes swim lessons and safe swimming.

- Learn to swim and only swim in designated areas supervised by lifeguards. If swimming at the beach check weather conditions before going in the water.
- Always swim with

a buddy and always swim sober.

- Have young children or inexperienced swimmers wear U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jackets around water, but do not rely on them alone. Provide close constant attention to children and inexperienced swimmers you are supervising in or near the water.
- Never leave a young child unattended near water, and do not trust a child's life to another child.
- Teach children to always ask permission to go near water.
- If a child is missing, check the water first.
- At beaches, be aware of the danger of rip currents. If caught in one, swim parallel to the shore until out

of the current. When free, turn and swim toward the shore. If unable to swim to the shore, call out for help, float or tread water until free of the rip current and then head toward shore.

- Wear beach shoes at the beach. The sand is hot and can burn someone's feet and glass and other sharp objects can cut them.
- Limit the amount of direct sunlight received between 10:00 am and 4:00 pm, and wear a broad-spectrum sunscreen with a protection factor of at least 15. Reapply often.
- Stay hydrated. Drink plenty of water regularly, even if not thirsty.
- Avoid drinks with alcohol or caffeine.
- Secure the backyard pool with appropriate barriers including four-sided fencing.
- Know how and when to call 9-1-1 or the local emergency number.
