'Bizarre' Book of Weird & Wacky Tales Hits Home

A new title by two local authors offers readers a book that's both trick and treat for Halloween. "Buffalo Bizarre: Weird, Wild and Wacky Tales from Western New York" unloads more than two centuries of homespun tomfoolery into one handy package perfect for holiday gift-giving.

The book was written by Brian Meyer, a former Buffalo Rocket columnist, and Mark Ciemcioch. Meyer spent many years writing for Rocket Publications. In fact, he penned his first front-page article for one of the newspapers at the age of 15 – which is bizarre all by itself. He has since carved out a distinguished career in local journalism. Meyer has also taught for many years at SUNY Buffalo State and Medaille College. Ciemcioch is an area writer who works for the Catholic Diocese of Buffalo.

"We call it a cruise down the boulevard of the bizarre," said Meyer.

"After people read our book, the region might never look quite the same."

A local almanac of the weird and obscure, "Buffalo Bizarre" features a special section highlighting the region's connection to the supernatural, as many ghosts, ghouls and creatures have an apparent craving for chicken wings. The book offers these tales with a light touch of humor.

For example, while you may know Western New York isn't known as one of North America's most common place for Bigfoot sightings, it didn't stop a Chautauqua County town



from hosting its own Bigfoot Weekend and Expo. Anybody looking methods on how to collect evidence of Bigfoot, or just hoping to pick up that famous video of a Sasquatch stomping through the woods, could have headed down to Dewittville for the convention. While there were no sightings of Bigfoot during the weekend, attendees did report seeing a creature that can be equally as scary - an inquisitive WGRZ Channel 2 reporter.

While Dewittville used Bigfoot to provide an economic boost to the town, the community of Perry in Wyoming County went another way. Back in 1855, hotel owner A.B. Walker was looking for a way to increase business when he wrapped some waterproof canvas around a coiled frame and dropped it into the nearby Silver Lake. When local fishermen spotted the object, (Continued on page 6)






YMCA Turkey Trot are encouraged to bring cans with them to packet pick-up at the Delaware YMCA, November 25th-27th.



(Continued from page 1) they thought it was a sea serpent.

It played right into Walker's hands, and business was booming. But when interest in the socalled "Perry Sea Serpent" became too big, Walker took his device and hid it in the attic of the Walker House Hotel. The Perry Sea Serpent was on its way to becoming folklore until firefighters discovered Walker's device after a hotel fire two years later. Perry continues to honor its history of the supernatural with an annual Sea Serpent Festival.

"Buffalo Bizarre" also reports some of the findings of local supernatural expert Mason Winfield, who has written a half-dozen books for regional publisher Western New York Wares about the subject. One of Winfield's most common findings is the report of a ghostly young girl haunting the Holiday Inn on Grand Island... and Forest Lawn Cemetery on Delaware

Avenue... and the Town Ballroom on Main Street in Buffalo... and a couple of other places. This ghost girl gets around.

Other strange and screwy stories include a Halloween night incident in which a television weatherman's mishap almost created an inferno during a live broadcast in a local resident's yard, and a wandering deer that crashed into an Elmwood Avenue restaurant, prancing around the bar for a time.

The book includes nearly two dozen chapters that feature everything from odd tales about our sports teams, to offbeat inventors and scandals involving elected leaders. There are probably dozens of tales about Buffalo you've never heard before.

"Buffalo Bizarre" is now available at local book retailers and online at www. buffalobooks.com.

"Our book is serious about not being serious," said Ciemcioch. "It's not the best of Buffalo history, it's just the rest."
