'Last Vegas'

Given the tone of the title and the age of the actors, Rocket Man would have bet the house that someone would croak in "Last Vegas." Spoiler alert. As this Geritol-fueled "Hangover" winds down, call off the coroner, they're all standing: Michael Douglas, wealthy bachelor; Kevin Kline, conscientious objector in the sexual revolution; Robert DeNiro, gloomy widower and bearer of grudges, and Morgan Freeman, casino crusher whose offspring love him not wisely, but too well.

It's a pretty decent flick, unexpectedly sentimental, attended last Friday by a fairish throng, most around Rocket Man's age but few of his gender. Remarkably moral, too. Chuck the cusswords, including the anatomical epithets on the cufflinks, and the censors would have cleared this in 1946.

The idea is this. Four guys grew up around Brooklyn in 1955, called themselves "The Flatbush Four," fought off all offend-

ers ("Nobody bad-mouths us except us"). When the screen flashed "58 Years Later" there was quite a chuckle. With no old gang of his own, Rocket Man envied them.

Douglas lives on the Pacific Coast with a ladyfriend of 32 ("I've got hemorrhoids older than that," DeNiro will tell him.

Freeman, in troubled health, lives around New York with children whose concern makes him feel a prisoner rather than a patient.

Kline has retired to a Florida life so bland that his wife sends him off with a recipe for infidelity, and two key ingredients. Later asked, "Are you good in bed?" he answers, "I don't remember."

DeNiro sullenly recalls how Douglas, deliverer of amusing eulogies, failed to make muster when De-Niro's wife died.

Now, by hook but no crook, they reconvene on the occasion of Douglas' pending nuptials. Their first hotel has no rooms, the second no availability. It's a stretch. It's a movie.

Freeman brings along the bulk of his 401-k. Rocket Man shudders to think of the tax implications even before he throws his fortune against the prevailing winds of house odds. Guess who wins (if you watched last week's "CSI," there's a clue.) They all wind up under benign surveillance and the influence of Red Bull martinis ("I feel like I'm getting drunk and electrocuted at the same time.")

Every player in this odd quartet lives up to expectations, eventually joined by Mary Steenburgen, a Rocket Man favorite since "Time After Time" (1979). Here she's a newly-arrived lounge singer of the loneliest sort, crooning in near isolation to compedin couples. She's totally charming, resigned to her lack of recognition. In fact the movie has practically a full house of fine characters, even one Susan Shloub-Larkin, half of Steenburgen's last audience.

It ends well, seemingly set for sequelizing, except that it opened just modestly. Nonetheless, Rocket Man believes that among his generational fellow travelers, what happens in "Vegas" will keep you there.





Higgins Urges Commitment to Help Returning Veterans Find Work

Congressman Brian Higgins (NY-26) spoke on the Floor of the House of Representatives to urge his colleagues to make a strong commitment to veterans' employment. Higgins cited the high 22% unemployment rate for young veterans and encouraged support for programs like Helmets to Hard-

hats, which offer veterans job training and employment in the construction trade. Higgins also encouraged support for his legislation, H.R. 2169, the Veterans Education Flexibility Act, which would eliminate the deadlines for veterans to use the educational benefits they have earned.




