# **Deadline Fast Approaching for** STAR Tax Exemption Registration

The New York State Department of Taxation and Finance reminds homeowners to register for the Basic STAR property tax exemption by the December 31, 2013 deadline.

With 12 days remaining to register, more than 2 million homeowners have registered for their Basic STAR exemptions. The registration facilitates Governor Cuomo's 2013-2014 Budget initiative to save New York taxpayers millions by eliminating inappropriate exemptions.

The Basic STAR ex-

emption is available on the primary residence of homeowners with incomes under \$500,000. The registration stems from a Tax Department investigation that found thousands of taxpayers receiving STAR exemptions on more than one property.

The Tax Department has directly mailed all of the 2.7 million homeowners who claimed the exemption last year, participated in 225 local meetings, fielded more than a half million phone calls, and registered thousands of people at local events including the State Fair.

Senior citizens receiving the Enhanced STAR exemption are not impacted by the new registration program.

To register, visit www. tax.ny.gov or call 518-457-2036. Online information is available in six languages and translators stand ready to assist speakers of all languages via telephone. Extended STAR Hotline hours are 8:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. weekdays, and 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on Saturdays.



### 'A Visit From Tony Orlando'

After Tony Orlando's concert last Wednesday afternoon at the Seneca Niagara Casino, someone in the audience left a walker behind.

Much as Rocket Man exaggerates, he is not making this up.

As Orlando retreated and the house lights rose, he delayed launch, waiting for the jam to clear in the lobby. And here comes this young woman, a Casino staffer, guiding this walker through the void and asking, "Anybody know who this belongs to?"

Surely there's a reasonable explanation, but there was so much revival meeting in Orlando's show that it seemed plausible that somebody came in lame and was healed.

We can't remember a better show, or cleaner, either.

Rocket Man covered Orlando at Melody Fair in the '70s, still has a picture of him with Little Booster Holly, which he passed backstage. He felt a little

sheepish - like, how many people have old Tony Orlando photos, five million? - until a beieweled woman in red, no spring chicken she, rose during the show and handed him a gift bag and scrapbook.

Those '70s were Orlando's "Dawn Days." He's had a twilight or two since and a few years back we caught him at a Canadian casino, having recently shed many kilograms. Here, for \$35 each, peanuts in today's concert economy, we'd be happy to settle for Tony Orlando & Dusk.

But the Tony Orlando who walked on to open the show – just walked on, no intro, no nothing but a few wisps of smoke - was fiddle-fit, and it was easy to see how a soldier on Iraq deployment, as he would later recall, would mistake him for Geraldo Rivera.

A Tony Orlando doesn't have to do much. Just being there is enough. But what a cadre of musicians he has assembled. For

one, there's a keyboardist named Toni Wine who has been with him, he said, for 52 years. Fifty-two years, platonically, in showbiz? What does that say about him? It's not as if she needs the money - she's still lapping up residuals for "Meow Mix" commercials. "She's rich," he whispered in loud aside, more admiring than envious.

Then there was lefthanded guitarist Kerri Cole, a mimic, it turns out, everyone from Led Zeppelin to Cher, and a Johnny Cash, mining those low, low notes the Man in Black found in Folsom Prison. He was unbelievable.

And speaking of belief, there was an odd-looking chap in the audience, bearded, long red flannels. He turned out to represent a Jolly Old Elf often seen along about now, who lectured Orlando on the meaning of the season in an exchange so professionally awkward it almost seemed real.

After nearly two hours they receded, to rest up for six more shows, all virtually sold out. Rocket Man has tied a yellow ribbon to his old fir tree. Knock three times. And don't forget your walker.



### **Buffalo Snow**

Just in case you were out of town or never venture out of doors in the winter, you must be aware that we had an early dumping of snow in our fair city. My recollection is that it has been some time since we have had this much snow in December. I say that knowing I do go to Florida for the snow season which usually begins in earnest in January. It has been some time since I had to shovel, wear boots every day, heavy coat, and slip slide down the street. After experiencing this last week I realize even more I do not miss it. However, if you live in or around the city of Buffalo, snow is like a second language. The more of it you experience the more you learn to live with it.

Lake effect snow! How many times have you heard that phrase especially living in this area? We have to actually hope that it gets cold enough for Lake Erie to freeze in order for the natural snow making machine to stop making snow. Who the heck likes it that cold? Just in case you do not listen to the weather reports it seems that cold wind coming from the west across the open water of Lake Erie produces snow. Snow, snow and more snow.

Not like normal cities that measure in inches, we measure by feet. I remember one year we had seven feet in one week. Then how many remember the blizzard of '77. So much snow there was no longer any place to put it. The parking lots were full of huge piles. The sides of the streets where the plows shove it were so high, the stop signs barely stuck out the top. Finally after a week of not being able to move, the National Guard came in and trucked it to the parks and dumped it into the river. They had to do this to clear enough space to open the streets. Now that is really snow at its worst.

But let's look at the bright side. The first snow fall is usually a thing of beauty. Clean, fluffy white, soft, billowy, and usually it is not a bitter cold day. It covers everything on the ground, the trees take on a different look with the branches highlighted with a white trim. It is so magical and so breathtaking it makes you hear music as you gaze at it. We know nothing beats a white Christmas. Some people even dream of a Christmas with snow. They even wrote a song about it. One

of the most popular songs of all times. Imagine living somewhere where it does not snow on Christmas, where they are wrapping colored lights around a palm tree to get into the spirit. Now who would enjoy that? Not we snow birds. I mean snow lovers. Why else would you live in Buffalo? Like one fellow in Las Vegas said, two seasons in Buffalo, snow season, and the fourth of July.

So we have learned to live with the part of our fair city that we are known for, snow. Many look forward to the snow and the more there is, the more they like it. Usually younger people who ski, ice skate, snow mobile, toboggan, or just like to make snowmen. They wait all year for it to be cold enough to snow. Picture this if you will, a machine

that actually makes snow on purpose. Fortunately those are located in places where snow is desired. We have our own snow making machine, Lake Erie.

Now let's look at the down side of snow. Yes it is pretty on the first day, for about 30 seconds. Then you have to go out and shovel. Even if you have it plowed or a snow blower, you still have to do some shoveling. Welcome to heart attack haven. Once you get things shoveled and clean. we have another show fall. You get your driveway cleared and the plow goes by and seals the entrance. Not with the clean white stuff but dirty, salt and sand filled ice packed heavy gook. So you clean that and as soon as you are done, the plow goes by again. He is just doing what he is paid to do. Clear the streets and keep them passable. So soon this dirty "snow" is piled on the sides of your driveway to remain till the spring. You wait through January and February hoping for a day that will be warm enough to at least get rid of some of this unsightly mess. It is not long before the "had enough" sets in and you long for the look of green grass. The smell of blossoms, the glorious happy chore of cleaning out what remains of winter and the snow, which by now has become nothing but hidden objects shoveled into a pile. You never know what you will find in those piles. No matter if you like the snow or not, spring is welcomed and looked forward to. Nobody hates spring. not so for winter. Personally, it makes no difference to me. I go to Florida where the sun shines every day. Boring.
