Registration Dates Set For HNPYBL 2014 Season

The Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League (HNPYBL), the longest consecutive run youth program in Western New York, recently announced and Delaware Avenues. its registration dates for the 2014 season. They will be held on Saturday February 22nd from 11:00 am to 1:30 pm; Monday, March

10th from 6:00 to 8:30 pm and Monday, March 24th from 6:00 to 8:30 pm. All three dates will be at the North Buffalo Community Center, located on Sanders Road between Colvin

The cost to register your son or daughter is the same rate as in previous years. The first child is \$80.00, a second child is \$70.00 and each additional child is \$55.00. If you register by the March 24th deadline, \$10.00 will be deducted per child off the total cost. Ombuds-

An

man is a dedicated volunteer certified to receive, investigate, and solve complaints made by, or on behalf of, residents in nursing homes, assisted living facilities and certified housing in the community. Ombudsmen are assigned to a facility on a weekly basis to discuss problems, concerns, or to simply lend an ear when residents have something on their minds. They monitor the quality of care, help protect residents' rights, provide information to the residents and their families to ensure proper treatment, and encourage residents

to express their opinions. Residents often come to see their Ombudsman as

simply a regular, friendly visitor, and volunteers will experience a wide range of satisfactions as they handle advocacy issues and increase community concern and interest for the institutionalized elderly.

Volunteers will receive a minimum of 36 hours of training, consisting of pre, post, and in-classroom instruction. Volunteers MUST complete all 4-days of in-classroom instruction. Regularly scheduled training is provided.

The next scheduled training program will be held over four days: March 13th-14th & March 20th-21st. Prospective Ombudsmen must successfully complete the full 36 hours of training.

'Lady with All the Answers'

In the gospel according to Ann Landers, she wandered into a Chicago newspaper office one day to see if she could sort letters for the advice columnist and wound up with the gig herself.

That sounds like applying to caddy at Augusta and next year winning the Masters, but who'd doubt Ann Landers? Surely nobody who enjoys an hour and three quarters hearing O'Connell & Company's "The Lady with All the Answers" on Snyder's Park School stage.

Ann Landers was and is a generic name, rather like Betty Crocker. The long-running incumbent had died just about the time one Eppie Lederer came in with what she describes as the perfect blend of chutzpah and Rolodex. "Dear Abby," her twin, entered the field two years later after what Eppie/Ann describes as "a

very quick study," a line delivered brittlely, but not bitterly, by actress Mary Kate O'Connell.

The play visits, but does not dwell on, the relationship of the sisters. ("Blood is not only thicker than water, it boils faster.") It's more comfortable describing how Ann dialed up a sitting Supreme Court justice for advice on custody of walnuts, and the difficulty of disclosing publicly that she and husband Jules were now going separate ways. Just six years earlier, on the occasion of their 30th anniversary, she had polished her Jules with public praise.

One of the subtle treasures of Mary Kate's performance is her consistently authentic Chicago accent. You have to have lived there a while to appreciate how bang-on it is, this from an actress gifted with one of Buffalo's finest voices and clearest enun-

ciations. It's a one-woman. one-person show, directed with admirable flow by Anne Gayley.

David Rambo's script has more clichés than you could shake a stick at. Rocket Man guesses that these frequent retreats to the trite are intended to underscore the columnist's simple, unpretentious approach. And when she rolls out the letters debating proper placement of certain paper products, it redefines "bathroom humor." Sunday's pre-Super Bowl throng lapped it up.

O'Connell & Company has settled in nicely at the Park School, 4625 Harlem Rd., Snyder, in a cozy hall with impeccable sightlines. Katy Miner's set is both homey and busy, although when Rocket Man sees a piano, he'd love to hear it played. Pam Snyder's wardrobe choices include a classically comfylooking caftan, a word not in Rocket Man's vocabulary until the First Mate corrected him.






The course meets New York State and National Association of Boating Law Administrators requirements for Personal Watercraft (Jet-ski) and conventional vessel (motorboat) operation.

All games are played in Shoshone Park, located off of Hertel Avenue near Main Street. Opening Day is scheduled for Saturday, May 3rd with the League's annual parade up Hertel to the Park before the first pitch is thrown. Thousands of area boys and girls have played in Hertel North Park since the league was incorporated in the late 1950s. It is presently the largest youth baseball and softball league in Western New York

with close to 1,000 children enrolled each season.

There are five girls divisions of teams from age four to sixteen and four boys divisions from age four to fifteen. Girls division teams are known as Pony Tail levels and start with T-Ball, Rookie, Minor, Major and Seniors.




