

Protect Your Home From Ice and Snow



The icicles hanging off your roof might look beautiful, but they’re also a warning sign for homeowners; the same conditions that create icicles also lead to ice dams on the edge of your roof and inside of gutters. When the ice melts, it can leak into your home and cause significant damage inside.

Clearing the snow off your roof from the gutters or eaves upwards of three to four feet after each winter storm can help prevent ice dams from forming. Remember to avoid using a ladder in snowy and icy-conditions. This can be extremely dangerous and is best left to professionals.

If your flat roof is easily accessible from an interior stairway, you may want to shovel the roof, but be careful not to damage the roof covering. Remember to put safety first any time you are on a roof, especially one that is covered in snow and ice. If you have any doubt, leave it to professionals.

It may be possible to remove the snow and ice from your sloped roof using a roof rake – a long-handled tool designed specifically for this purpose. Stand on the ground and pull as much of the snow off the eaves as you can safely reach. If you can-

not safely reach the roof, contact a homebuilder, landscaping and roofing contractor, or property maintenance company to remove the snow and ice. Before hiring a contractor, check their references. Always be sure any contractor you hire is qualified, insured and bonded.

The American Red Cross provides information and suggestions around how to prevent water pipes in the home from freezing, and how to thaw them if they do freeze.

Pipes that freeze most frequently are those that are exposed to severe cold, supply pipes in unheated interior areas like basements and crawl spaces, attics, garages, or kitchen cabinets. Pipes that run against exterior walls that have little or no insulation are also subject to freezing.

Consider installing specific products made to insulate water pipes like a “pipe sleeve” or installing UL-listed “heat tape,” “heat cable,” or similar materials on exposed water pipes. Newspaper can provide some degree of

insulation and protection to exposed pipes – even ¼” of newspaper can provide significant protection in areas that usually do not have frequent or prolonged temperatures below freezing.

Open kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing.

When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe – even at a trickle – helps prevent pipes from freezing.

Keep the faucet open. As you treat the frozen pipe and the frozen area


begins to melt, water will begin to flow through the frozen area. Running water through the pipe will help melt ice in the pipe.

Apply heat to the section of pipe using an electric heating pad wrapped around the pipe, an electric hair dryer, a portable space heater (kept away from flammable materials), or by wrapping pipes with towels soaked in hot water. Do not use a blowtorch, kerosene or propane heater, charcoal stove, or other open flame device.

Check all other faucets in your home to find out if you have additional frozen pipes. If one pipe freezes, others may freeze, too.



Exercise extreme caution when clearing snow from roofs, and contact a professional if necessary.

munity," said Linda Robinson, Executive Director of Operation PETS. "Spaying and neutering our animals is a vital step in combating the pet overpopulation problem in local shelters. Unaltered animals have more health problems and are more likely to stray and run away. To be a responsible pet owner you must spay and neuter your animals."

Eddie Offhaus, Co-founder and President of Operation PETS, added "I am thrilled that the ASPCA continues to support high quality, high volume spay/neuter concepts by providing funding for spay/neuter programs. I am very proud of our clinic and staff." Offhaus adds "making funding available and affordable is making a difference for pet owners."

"The ASPCA is glad to assist Operation PETS with this significant grant," said Jill Van Tuyl, community initiatives director at the ASPCA. "Spay/neuter is the only way to effectively prevent unplanned litters, keeping more animals out of the shelter system and in loving homes."

The New York State Animal Population Control Program (APCP) is a low-cost spay/neuter granting program managed by the ASPCA on behalf of the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets. Funds are garnered from pet licensing fees collected by towns, which are then sent to the state. Quarterly, the state sends these funds to the ASPCA to be granted out specifically toward low-cost spay/neuter programming.

Operation PETS opened in July 2008 in an effort to curb the growing issue of pet overpopulation in

WNY. They provide high-quality, high-volume, low-cost sterilization services for companion animals in target populations such as low-income pet owners who fall within set income guidelines, pit bulls and feral/free-roaming community cats. Since Operation PETS started six and a half years ago, over 47,700 sterilization surgeries have been accomplished.
