Attorney Thomas Eoannou, owner of the North Park Theatre building, recently announced that he will team up with some local establishment owners to convert the theatre to digital projection. Lots of cosmetic work will also be done on the

theater.

Eoannou, who calls the North Park the "crown jewel" of Hertel Avenue, says he'll also keep the staff, some who have been working there for 40 to 50 years.

The popular North Buffalo institution, the North Park Theatre on Hertel Avenue will live on, despite a decision by the current theater operator to end its agreement to run it.



Holy Angels and Us

The Holy Angels crew painted its farewell onto on the West Side Rowing Club breakwall Monday. Through the corrective vision of hindsight, Rocket Man realizes he may have seen the handwriting on the wall already.

In both basketball and softball this year, the Angels were a little less intimidating. Athletics shouldn't define an educational institution – Notre Dame and its recent travails notwithstanding – but at schools such as Holy Angels, where pride trumps profit, it can portend a sense of pur-

And Holy Angels had not been wearing what Rocket Man once called "the pinstripes," a force field of preparedness that frequently flummoxed more talented

For insight, Rocket Man radioed Anna Nagro, Class of 2003, whom he looks on as the Holy Angels "franchise," much like former Bison catcher Tom Prince.

Many Angels have flown on to prominence notably singer-actress Michelle Ragusa, in demand nationwide – and Anna Nagro two years ago became the youngest person ever selected to coach a Division I softball program, at Mt. St. Mary's in Maryland.

Anna confesses she had "no clue" of her alma mater's imminent closure. "They seemed to be doing so well," she said. "They just built that gym." (For years, HAA's basketball court had fallen so far behind contemporary standards that it had to play home games on the road, at little cost to success.)

"So many good happened at things that school," she said. "It's one of those special places and if you didn't have direct contact with it, you might not understand. The other girls that I went to that school with, they will always be the best friends I ever had."

Anna was on a recruiting trip while chatting with Rocket Man,

Holy Angels brought girls to womanhood through exercise and energy. It emphasized hard work. Hard work ain't what it used to be. It is less valued. Quicker, cheaper short-cuts are sought.

And if we can't value what Holy Angels sold sufficiently to support it through tuition, then we, as a neighborhood and a nation, have lost our way.

"We will all be Angels forever.

North Park Theatre

Our own North Park Theatre has been one of the topics in the local news lately. One of the only surviving neighborhood movie theaters to still be in operation, the new owner intends to keep it going with digital movies, whatever that is. If you have lived in North Buffalo for any length of time you had to of one time or another been in this landmark building. Back in the day, before television and computers, people actually left their houses and went out to the movies. Neighborhoods were dotted with local movie theatres and in most case you could walk to one. The North Park was unique as it also had a stage and was used for other things than just movies.

Let's start with the name, North Park. At one time the whole area located above Amherst Street was called North Park. If you know your geography it is north of Delaware Park and was first designated as the area north of the park, hence North Park. The area to the east of the park was called and is still called "Central Park". It has since been changed to North Buffalo but some institutions retained the North Park signature. Hertel was especially loaded with North Park businesses, North Park furniture,

North Park pharmacy, North Park cleaners, etc. So the North Park stuck with the theatre and that is good.

I recall back in the seventies when the theatre like I mentioned was used for more than just movies. It has a stage and draw curtains and lighting to compliment whatever is performing at the time. The first and last North Buffalo beauty Pageant was held on that stage. Sponsored by the Hertel North Buffalo Business Association, a number of local beauties performed their talent on that stage with Diane McCarthy chosen as Miss North Buffalo.

It seemed that every Christmas the Rocket held a doings at the theatre for the children of the neighborhood. I was Santa and some of my staff dressed as elves and one even wore a Rudolph costume. I won't mention her name as she went on to become a teacher at Bennett. That was one of the penalties of working at the North Buffalo Rocket back then. You were at the whim of the publisher, trying to make the publication work. Have to say it was fun and we made lots of little kiddies happy.


One of the most memorable things I remember happening at this establishment was the

appearance of Buford Pusser of "Walking Tall" fame. The year was 1973 and it was the opening of the first "Walking Tall" movie. Sheriff Pusser had gained nationwide fame as a law enforcement officer in Tennessee, single handedly fighting the Mc-Nairy county area mob. The movie was based on real life facts which included the attempt on his life that resulted in the murder of his wife. This re-enactment scene was graphic in the movie and in talking with him later he told me it was the hardest thing to watch. Sheriff Pusser himself died in an automobile "accident" a year or so later. Not before the four men he first accused of the attempt on his life were pointed out. He later retracted his identification and three of the four ended up with violent deaths. The forth is still in jail on unrelated charges.

It was a big night for North Buffalo as he was well known and to have this great man signing autographs in the lobby of our local movie theatre was a real treat. There was a sequel to the movie called "Walking Tall 2" or something like that, a television series starring Bo Sven-

son as Sheriff Pusser and a later movie with Dwayne Johnson.

That is a little bit of the history of this historic survivor of local movie theatres. One would suppose that there are many stories out there about things that have happened over the last umpteen years since that block was constructed, back in maybe the twenties or thirties. Maybe even before that. It was just nice to have it part of the neighborhood with Norm Decker as manager over the last lots of years. We look forward to the future it may hold.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF SECTION 106 CONSULTATION PROCESS FOR THE NY GATEWAY CONNECTIONS IMPROVEMENT PROJECT TO THE US PEACE BRIDGE PLAZA

Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (NHPA; 36 CFR § 800) requires Federal agencies to consider the effects of their actions on historic properties that are listed or meet the eligibility criteria for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. This Public Notice is part of the Section 106 public involvement component for the NY Gateway Connections Improvement Project to the US Peace Bridge Plaza, which includes providing the public with Information about the project and its effects on historic properties, seeking public comment and input, and a consultation process as described below.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), acting as the federal lead agency, and the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT), acting as the sponsoring agency, are preparing an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the NY Gateway Connections Improvement Project to the US Peace Bridge Plaza. The EIS will identify alternatives to address the limited direct access between the US Border Port of Entry/Peace Bridge Plaza (Plaza) and Interstate 190 (I-190) and document their potential environmental consequences. The purpose of the project is to reduce the use of the local streets by interstate traffic and provide access to the existing Plaza at its current location. The primary objectives of the project are to address the need for direct access from the Plaza to the northbound lanes of I-190, to redirect through traffic from Front Park, to remove Baird Drive, and to provide alternate access from Porter Avenue to the Plaza.

Section 106 of NHPA requires that FHWA, in cooperation with the New York State Historic Preservation Officer (NYSHPO), identify parties to participate in the Section 106 process ("Consulting Parties"). Consulting Parties may include local governments, federally recognized Native American tribes, and individuals and organizations with a cemonstrated interest in the project who may participate due to the nature of their legal or economic relation to the undertaking or affected properties, or their concern with the undertaking's effects on historic properties.


