### 'Trouble In Tahiti'

For more than half its 50 years, the Shaw Festival has enhanced its lineup with a one-act show at lunchtime, a quick shot of something Shavian to be complemented with chasers of shopping and dining in this Borough Walt Disney might have invented.

Providing a second role for actors from the mainstages, many a noonday play has satisfied visitors' theatrical hunger all by itself, an appetizer obviating the entree. "Village Wooing" comes to mind, and the frenetic "The President," so popular that it won a second term in a landslide.

This year it's "Trouble in Tahiti" and comparatively speaking, it doesn't wash except as a curiosity, a one-act

opera by Leonard Bernstein pinpointing the perils of suburbia in 1952. It seems dated, a nearly fatal attribute at the time-specific Shaw Fest. (A sharp contrast is the Amherst Players' recent "Our Town," which clearly revered its doubly-distant time period, even if definitively amateur.)

"Trouble" – the title refers to a fictional movie - conveys Bernstein's search for a voice, and in the small orchestra and large chorus there are hints in movement and sound of the work he then called "East Side Story." This operetta tells of Dinah and Sam, once in love, now in lack, in their hell of a suburban paradise. "If only," she sings, "we could return to the garden."

It has its moments. Elodie Gillett and Mark Uhre sing gorgeous, if forgettable, lyrics. From the Greek-style chorus, director Jay Turvey couches his counsel in cynicism as the works-for-cash psychiatrist and Patty Jamieson jots down just the right notes as the stenographer. The movie scene works quite well, to an effectively ironic ending.

Bernstein's lyrics catalogue an intriguing roster - Wellesley, Elkins Park, Shaker Heights, Ozone Park - but in his program notes, Director Turvey suggests that the suburbs sprang into being about 1947. Take it from Rocket Man, who was launched in one, it was way before that. Why is Kenmore Village Historian Ed Adamczyk never around when you need him?

With an 11:30 a.m. curtain. "Tahiti" remains on the Shaw Festival horizon until Oct. 8, three or four times a week. FIVE ROCKETS (out of 10).

# **Stream & Lake** Map of New York
