'The "Miracle" Bisons'

It's been an off-and-on year for the Buffalo Bisons.

But they sure looked like winners to Rocket Man Saturday on Grand Island.

After a long, difficult game at Coca-Cola Field Friday night, infielder Matt Tuisasosopo (a newlywed, no less), outfielder Matt den Dekker (both of whom provide full employment for uniform name-stitchers) and pitchers Colin McHugh and Garrett Olson dragged themselves out of bed and drove over the dreaded South Bridge in their own cars to make the day special for some extraordinary fans.

It was a miracle. Literally. Grand Island recently installed its nearly unique Miracle League fields, specially designed to handle the special needs of youngsters - and a few "oldsters" - who want to play the game as well as know it.

It's smooth as glass, sort of a hard carpet, with bases, a short fence, dugouts and all

the fixtures you find at any "ordinary" ballpark in Amer-

On its surface most Saturday mornings swarm, at any one time, dozens of wheelchairs, some powered, some not, as well as walkers and other aids for folks not blessed with full mobility. Here and there, a service dog trots alongside a motorized chair. A ball is hit to a leftfielder who then picks it up and hurls it over the fence. An announcer urges them

They do call it "special needs," but the greatest need is the support of the better abled. And here are some of the finest players in the game, surely with other things to do (Tuiasosopo even brought along his bride Abi, who cheered them all on), joining them, bumping them, slapping them, smiling as broadly as anyone there.

Tuiasosopo, tall and tan, takes a moment after the "game" to wipe off the sweat

(it was an inferno out there) and reflect on the experience. "It was wonderful," he said. Getting up to make the trip "was easy. It's baseball, isn't it? It just made me feel good all over." The man they call "Too-ee" recalls a cousin back in Seattle with some physical disabilities, and how he gets to play a little, "but nothing like this."

He marveled at the diversity of the Miracle players. "Some of them," he observed with wonder, "are older than I am."

Bison public-relations chief Brad Bisbing said he has "no trouble at all" in rounding up volunteers. "These guys loved to do it, they just stepped up," he said. Identifying the Bison personnel at the game, he added, "and the one with the horns, that's Buster."

But the ones with the heart were the players, two Matts, two pitchers. It may be coincidence, but the Herd won the game both before and after their visit to the place where miracles are just part of the job description.
