Currently, 49 million Americans - 1 in 6 are unsure where their next meal is coming

from. Sixteen million are children who feel hunger's impact on their overall health and ability to perform in school. And nearly 5 million seniors over age 60 are food insecure, with many who live on fixed incomes often too embarrassed to ask for help.

In 2014, over 72 million pounds of food was collected by Postal carriers nationally, feeding an estimated 30 million people.

Over the course of the 22 year history, the Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive has collected well over one billion pounds of food.

The food drive's tim-

ing is crucial. Food banks and pantries often receive the majority of their donations during the Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday seasons. By springtime,

many pan-

tries are depleted, entering the summer low on supplies at a time when many school breakfast and lunch programs are not available to children in need.

'The Odd Couple'

Hard to believe it's been a half-century since playwright Neil Simon sized up the lifestyle of his slovenly brother Danny and committed it to a comedy called "The Odd Couple."

There'd been diametrically daffy duos before - Abbott & Costello, Laurel & Hardy - but never so specifically focused on hygiene. "Couple" conceived a litter of literature -- movies, TV shows, a women's version and even other scripts, notably "Sunshine Boys" and various "Grumpy Old Men." The current reprise

attempts a "Friends" ambience, distinctly its own worst enemy.

This month, Jewish Repertory Theater restores the original testament. Director Saul Elkin has cast the finest Oscar and Felix imaginable. Of Tom Laughlin's Oscar it can truly be said that the better he dresses, the sloppier he looks. Tim Newell is the dean of dread, investing neat-freak Felix

with a horde of tics, twitches and honks remindful of local comedy king Brian Mysliwy.

When he comes in bemoaning the fate of his over-cooked roast, it's as if he were bearing the ashes of a just-deceased pet. Well done, well done.

There's a Greek chorus of card players - Ray Boucher as the crouching, crabby and capped Speed, Mike Randall as the authoritative, pocket-protected accountant Roy, Doug Weyand as the pinch-penny, poker-proficient Vinny and Don Gervasi as a remarkably well-grounded Murray the Cop. He looks great but seems smarter than Simon intended. He should be fumbling the cards, not fondling them.

Lisa Ludwig, surrendering her persona to a dark wig, and peppy Michelle Marie Roberts flit flawlessly as the birds from upstairs, Pigeon sisters Cecily and Gwendolen, their names appropriated from Oscar Wilde.

They are raunchily enthusiastic, just what the doctor ordered for their

mismatched fellow cavedwellers. All-round applause to Kari Drozd's costume choices.

While the war of the messies vs. the fussies got "Odd Couple" started, in endures on its subtler theme, the tribute to loyalty and friendship, sometimes misinterpreted. A local director with whom Rocket Man once worked misread this and cleansed the script of "all references to homosexuality," including the last line. Honest. Told of this by Rocket Man, Simon said "putz!"

The sprawling evokes the times -- the clunky phone, the barometer and the Life magazine among the clutter in the days of long-distance rates and \$240 rents. Set designer Nathan Elsener has even strewn mostly black-and-white newspapers about (color was rare in those times) but probably should ditch the Buffalo Trace bourbon, seldom seen in '65 and too fey for Oscar anyway.

The apartment's a mess, but tolerable. It needs less linen and more litter.

Withal, it's sure as Simon that "Odd Couple," like Felix, will clean up at 2640 North Forest Rd., Getzville, through May 17. EIGHT ROCKETS (out of 10.)




WEEK OF THURSDAY, MAY 7, 2015






