The Truth About Van

One of Van Miller's boyhood inspirations was a fantasmagorical sportscaster named Bill Stern, who never let the truth get in the way of a good yarn. He made a fortune telling "the rest of the story."

Since Saturday afternoon, the media, both social and traditional, has extolled Van's virtues. Rocket Man worked alongside him for a decade and remembers it differently. Here, in memory of Stern and Van, is the "rest of the story."

HIS OWN TEAM MATES ROOTED AGAINST HIM - When Miller took the air for the 6 or 11 o'clock news at Ch. 4, almost every colleague hoped for a production error - wrong tape, dead air, blank screen, whatever.

They did that for a lot of folks, rooting for the Gods of Technology to take their toll on the egotistically untalented, of which there was a surplus.

But with Van it was different. They just wanted to marvel as he worked his way out of it. Wrong tape come up? "Seneca Bridge!," Van would exclaim, one of his signature faux-fanities.

Screen go black? "Well, they were playing at night, and the lights hadn't taken hold." Color balance fail? "Some of you with cheaper sets may have thought you saw that in green." Van respected his audience, never tried to deny what they were seeing. Adversity was Van's best friend.

HE GOOFED OFF - He was Vanishing Van after a 6:30 sign-off, re-appearing about quarter to 11, to do a sportscast at 11:20 that looked as if he'd rehearsed it all night. A new young snotnose, with no sense of heritage, would loudly complain that he wished he could "get away with the !@#\$ Miller pulls."

Actually, Van would drive to Dunkirk - an hour away, even in good weather - to keep company with his ailing mother, and return with the rebukes of a classical out-of-sorts octogenarian ringing in his ears. He maintained this dedicated vigil to her dying day.

HE WAS CHEAP - Actually, there was a bit of truth to this allegation, which Van would enhance by swiping all the peanuts on an in-coming flight or shaking down the movie critic for extra passes. Few knew that there were dozens, perhaps hundreds, of down-and-outers whom

Van had slipped Dead Presidents in time of strife. "Don't you ever tell anybody," he told Rocket Man. Can't hurt now.

HE LIED HIS AGE Although Van boasted "my Social Security number is 4," he kept his actual age secret, so it jolted him to learn that Rocket Man, his contemporary from Chautauqua County, wore his like a badge (at this writing, 80 years, 25 days). "Don't tell people you knew me," he would admonish. They worked it out: Rocket Man would tell folks how "I covered Van in high school," not mentioning that he was 13 at the time and Van was a senior. Van took that one to his final rest, too.

HE WAS A BAD JUDGE OF CHARACTER - Rocket Man was virtually anonymous when he came to Ch. 4. In his restaurant reviews, the Courier-Express drew a bag over his head. Nevertheless, Van greeted him like royalty and actually conveyed a fair familiarity with his work. He flirted shamelessly with Mrs. Paths, whom he called "Pollywollydoodle." She fell for his lost-earring gag every time and probably for him, too.

When Ch. 4 gave Rocket Man the heave-ho, Van wrote this on his get-out-of-town card: "You will always be my friend."

If only it could have been longer.




