'Pygmalion'

This is not your founders' Shawfest, either. Picture Brian Doherty or Maynard Burgess peeping in on this pumped-up, pimped-out "Pygmalion," dragged kicking (Prof. Higgins) and screaming (Eliza) into a 21st Century chockablock with rap, reflectors and ringtones.

Critical reaction to this production has been as divided as Cold War Berlin. Ditto for Rocket Man and the First Mate at Thursday's matinee, which attracted about 85 per cent of a house. He was charmed by its audacity and vigor, the other just plain didn't like it.

No argument, though, that everything George Bernard Shaw intended in 1913 has survived - maybe not all the words (a mercy. that) but surely its delineation of class oppression, often underlined, along with Shaw's intended ending.

"Pygmalion" of course begat "My Fair Lady," whose melodic (while argumentative) tone leads most audiences to expect something a little light. Peter Hinton's direction, for all its flamboyance the modern devices, emphasizes the playwright's original intentions, to the point of discomfort. Accentologist Higgins, happy to "make a living at my hobby," challenges himself to groom a scruffy flower girl to the point where aurally, at least, she can pass as high society.

Peter McManus makes an unusually unkempt Higgins who, however smitten with his charge, simply can not shake off the imperial sense of his upbrings. Harveen Sandhu, tawny temptress from last year's "Philanderer," is a daring choice as Eliza, charming beyond telling, breathtaking in the theatrically famous monologue which takes the girl off of the streets, but not the streets off of the girl.

Its signature line, scandalous in its time, has been updated to modern vulgarity, convulsing most of the house 'though she muffed it slightly. And when another character reprises it, Jeff Meadows' mediating Col. Pickering reminds, "It's not compulsory, you know."

Peter Krantz's roaring, demanding, scheming, ever-offended Doolittle, Eliza's father, simply steals the show and there is a nifty little exchange early on involving one Jennifer Dzialoszynski, perhaps the Sandhu of the future.

Not even Shaw and his early directors and actors could agree on a tone for "Pygmalion," and the debates might bring him close to a smile. Some may find it unpalatable, but boring? Not ----- likely. It runs through Oct. 24.

More than 37 million people participate in National Night Out events in 15,000 communities in the United States.




