

'King o' the Moon

Could "King o' the Moon" eclipse "Over the Tavern?" Despite astronomical odds, it seemed in the stars at last Thursday's preview in the Kavinoky Theater. A huge crowd got every joke, sobbed at every misfortune and rose almost as one at the close.

During the later talkback, one witness thanked playwright Tom Dudzick for creating a sequel that did not require attendance at its predecessor.

"I did want to write something that stood alone" said Dudzick, nearly blushing.

Dudzick, a Buffalo East Sider who cut many theatrical chops in North Buffalo, wrote the autobiographical "Tavern" for the Studio Arena. Its success was equally unexpected and unprecedented, opening in 1994, closing in 1997. The Studio begged for more. Dudzick determined that the celebrated Pazinski

family, which had so resonated with non-traditional theater-goers, had more to say and moved them – well, most of them – 10 years into the future, the night of the Apollo Moon Landing, and from over the tavern to behind it.

In this setting, the nation is squirming through the Vietnam war while the Catholic church is struggling with rigidity on divorce and abortion. Dudzick and his more mature but distinctively recognizable "family" confront these issues with passion, compassion, intelligence and humor.

Dan Urtz plays Rudy, grown from clownish Sullivan impressionist to seminarian, the actor nearly a double for Dudzick at his age. His theological struggles ooze sincerity, yet his portrayal of a senior warprotester is falling-down funny. NU's Adriano Gatto

breathes fire as his military brother.

Kevin Craig wondrously renders the developmentally-challenged Georgie, never out of the scene, even as a spectator. And fight choreographer Steve Vaughan, besides staging two deadly serious familial battles royal, steps in cozily as bartender Walter, a gentleman who wouldn't mind setting himself up with an order of the Widow Pazinski. "I ain't got it," he laments. Wrong.

Kelly Copps brings the agony of sister Annie, who has married neither wisely nor well, her unseen husband cuckoo for model trains. Kelsey Mogensen is both coquettish and crafty as the soldier's wife, once despised as "Easy-Make" Blake, and Lorraine O'Donnell envelops them all in the sometimes uncomfortable cloak of maternal affection.

Dudzick concedes that "Moon" was launched with more creation than recollection, yet his feel for his characters crosses the generations. Walter's marriage proposal, with clues suggesting that consummation may not be an issue, confirms the absence of romantic age limits.

David King's set, with its vital tree house, works perfectly as Dudzick directs his own work with a refreshing repertory of paces. Houston, their only problem may be seating everyone, through October 4. NINE ROCK-ETS (out of 10.)






