# 'Annie Get Your Gun'

A pistol but not a repeater, that's "Annie Get Your Gun." Even with such musical bulls-eyes as "Lost in His Arms" and "Girl That I Marry," the 1946 Irving Berlin tuner mostly remains holstered, save for a mid-90s revival, politically corrected for "First Settlers."

That's the version Niagara Regional Theater Guild has chosen to open its season in the cozy, accessible Ellicott Creek Playhouse. The troupe, firing hits since Annie Oakley was alive and shootin', meets the challenges of global scene changes (a table hit the deck during one turntable whirl at preview) and costuming fit for upper crust and urchins (hat-tips to fashionista Nancy Watts.)

"Annie/Gun" free-lances sharpshooters Oakley's and Frank Butler's off-

and-on romance and rivalry through 19th Century Wild West shows. Oakley they'd call a tomboy today, her life's aims as sharp as her shootin' eye, although when she meets Butler she starts "bathin' regular." Carolyn Quigley invests Oakley with a soft, accurate vocal style and fetching accent that never weary. A Southern Indianan, she's just "Doing What Comes Naturally."

Chris Turton gives Butler a nice confidence, never drifting into irritating arrogance. Dawn M. Newton takes Butler's old sidekick and covetous crank Dolly from zero to nasty faster than a speeding bullet, relishing every put-down. Best exchange: "I keep all my beauty aids in that bag"... "No wonder it's so heavy."

Clarity is remarkable for so complex a show.

enport, 'though his final reward seems a bit unjust. Chuck Slisz stands tall as Sitting Bull, Wounded Knee so far in his past that Custer's just General Sarah Mullin strike it sharply as the affectionate and attractive knife-thrill act. Ray O'Donnell has

a treasured twisted-face moment as Annie's little brother. Director Fran Newton's cast moves at a rapid-fire fine clip and that turntable whirls at a professional pace. NRTG treats the show with more respect than the text itself treats Annie. Unschooled and living in near slavery, the real

Annie didn't compromise in any way, fought for women's rights to her dying day and never threw a match. Near the end of the show it comes down to a diamond contest or, as she puts it, "who has the most stones." It runs through October 4th at the Playhouse, 530 Ellicott Creek, Tonawanda.
