



## 'The Intern'

About 30 minutes in, Rocket Man realized he'd seen this movie before. Only the protagonist's principal prop was a bumbershoot, not a well-pressed suit, and arrived by air rather than sedan.

Robert DeNiro, meet "Mary Poppins," playing games, all sorts.

"The Intern," from celebrated writer and director Nancy Meyers, enlists bored-stiff retiree DeNiro into a "senior" internship with a slick garment-trade start-up called "About the Fit."

Rocket Man has no idea whether such an employment program does exist in the real world but it did make him think of his role writing baseball at a newspaper where his three bosses' ages don't add up to his. It was a rough, technology-challenged start but one of them wrote the other day, "Every time I have a problem, I try to imagine how you'd solve it."

"The Intern" also put Rocket Man in mind of a similarly-plotted but insufferably dreary Jack Nicholson movie of about a decade back titled, "About Schmitt." Jack did wind up hot-tubbed with Kathy Bates but in the main, "Schmitt" was mostly about later-life uselessness.

Not "The Intern." De-Niro's character and the actor himself tune keenly to the advantages of experience, even from a job that today practically defines obsolescence (he manufactured and marketed phone books.) He's sufferably, confidently cheery with a near Greek-chorus of traditional interns, one caught between a lease and a hard place. Eventually he welcomes the lad into his own digs. "I feel like everbody's uncle," DeNiro observes, with far more irony than regret.

He's assigned to "The Boss," Anne Hathaway. She distrusts people who blink

infrequently and obsessively created this seemingly trending endeavor. She is not impressed, would rather have a wastebasket. Seeing her chauffeur tippling on duty, he slips protectively behind the wheel and makes himself invaluable, still to her dismay. He has gotten "too familiar," as Anne harbors some deep-seated guilt over the neglect she inflicts on her family, notably "house husband" Anders Holm.

She is, for our time, practically a descendant of "Poppins" proprietary Mr. Banks. She DOES seem to have time to give her home relationships more minutes, and she doesn't. Spoiler alert: It works out. DeNiro's wry sugar makes the medicine go down.

His wife died several years ago. Asked how long they were married, he replies "Not long enough," best line in the movie, thrown away with bittersweet resignation. Eventually, he falls into the clutches of message therapist Rene Russo, and anyone who objects to this later-life dalliance deserves a slap in the face.

"The Intern" is remarkably "clean" by today's standards, a heart-warmer for all ages, although the audience at Rocket Man's matinee consisted largely of his contemporaries. For all its familiarity, "The Intern," like Miss Poppins practically perfect in every way, deserves a promotion. NINE ROCKETS (out of 10)

- Make sure you have working smoke detectors installed as required
- Make sure that you have working carbon monoxide detectors installed as required
- Leep a working fire extinguisher on hand
- Furnaces and other heating sources should be inspected annually by professionals
- Kitchen stoves/ovens should not be used as a source of heat
- Ensure that the area around your heat sources is clean and free of debris and flammable materials
- Never use gas or diesel powered generators in the home or in confined spaces

Additionally, for the more than one-third of Americans that use fireplaces, wood stoves and other heat sources as their primary means of heat:

- Keep fireplaces, wood stoves, pellet stoves, etc., clean by having a certified chimney specialist inspect and clean them annually
- Safely burn fuels use appropriate fuels never use accelerants to start the fire
- Never leave fires unattended
- Ensure the safety of children and pets
- Luse common sense






