



Wither Schimschack's?

After a week in interstate obit, Rocket Man and First Mate returned to indigestible news. Schimschack's, the singularly spectacular restaurant overlooking the escarpment in Niagara County, was closing. Where on earth would we take our company now?

Anyone who visited two days got provisions at Schimschack's. You couldn't beat it, particularly at twilight time, or on Sundays, when the coloration was high and the prices low. Schimschack's innovated economical, allinclusive autumn Sunday dinners as a way of combatting pro football. Incurables could watch at the bar, but for others at three tiers of tables overlooking the plain to Lake Ontario, there were five courses, including the likes of lemon cream pie, for \$15 or less. One of Rocket Man's ground support crew hailed their "bananas Foster" thusly -- "And I don't even LIKE bananas!"

Thinking of all the folks they'd introduced to Schimschack's was an orbit down memory lane. A widow from New England near to 100 years old, a baseball announcer from the Carolinas with his relatively new bride, a nephew from Pennsylvania and the woman to whom he's now married. All treasured their group photos there, usually against a background of foliage and, as it read in "Cheap Gourmets' Second Helping," on a clear day "you could see a waiter adding the GST to the bill in Toronto's CN Tower."

Revisiting Trip Advisor website commentaries, we see we celebrated First Mate's 2014 birthday there, loved what we ate but had a wee difficulty with service. The thing is, we celebrated sort of on the spur of the moment and were seated, well, as walk-ins on a Sunday afternoon. This should have been a clue. Within

memory, seasonal Sundays as Schimschack's required reservations a week in advance. Business was fading and we were celebrating too merrily to notice.

Schimschack's screams "overhead." The taxes and utilities must rival the GNP of a developing nation, not to mention Windex by the tankerful. Its soothing forest-green décor and pineapple-newel posts looked nearly new. It's the only restaurant we ever saw sell jewelry in the lobby, and a coat check, virtually mandatory. It was out of the past.

These are perilous times for local, familyowned restaurants. The well-heeled chains suck money out of the atmosphere. Canada's once-elegant Queenston Heights is downgraded to "bistro." Eckl's closed in Orchard Park. Genesee County's Red Ozier recently headlined an advertisement: "We're open and staying until we find the right buyer."

Schimschack's proudly claimed to have been the trysting place of Marilyn Monroe and Joe DiMaggio, far from the roar of the Falls and the fans as she filmed "Niagara" more than 50 years ago. Actually, the place was far different then, lower-profile, smaller, checkered tablecloths. That was Schimschack's. This was, actually, the "New Schimschack's." Now it's the former Schimschack's. Where have you gone, Joe DiMaggio?



Fight Medicare Fraud

Health care fraud drives up costs for everyone in the health care system.

Fraud schemes often depend on identity thieves getting hold of people's Medicare numbers. guard your Medicare number. Treat it as you would a credit card.

Follow these important steps to protect yourself from fraud:

Don't share your Medicare number or other personal information with anyone who contacts you by telephone, email or by approaching you in person, unless you've given them permission in advance. Medicare will NEVER contact you for your Medicare number or other personal information.

Tell your friends and neighbors to guard their Medicare number.

Don't ever let anyone borrow or pay to use your Medicare number.

Review your Medicare Summary Notice to be sure you and Medicare are only being charged for actual services.

Be wary of salespeople who knock on your door or call you uninvited and try to sell you a product or service.

Don't accept items received through the mail that you didn't order. You should refuse the delivery and/or return it to the sender. Keep a record of the sender's name and the date you returned the

And if you're looking to enroll in a Medicare plan:

Be suspicious of anyone who contacts you about Medicare plans unless you gave them permission.

There are no "early bird discounts" or "limited time offers."

Don't let anyone rush you to enroll by claiming you need to "act now for the best deal"

Be skeptical of free gifts, free medical services, discount packages or any offer that sounds "too good to be true."

Any promotional items you're offered to enroll in a plan must be worth no more than \$15, and these items can't be given on the condition that you enroll in a plan.

A common ploy of identity thieves is to say they can send you your free gift right away - they just need your Medicare number to confirm. Decline politely but firmly. Remember, it's not rude to be shrewd!

Call 1-800-MEDICARE to report suspected fraud.

Thanksgiving Day Hazards

When most of us think about Thanksgiving, images of turkey, stuffing and time spent with loved ones typically come to mind, not fire hazards. However, an increased risk of fire is, in fact, a reality of Thanksgiving. According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), three times as many home cooking fires occur on Thanksgiving as on a typical day.

"A combination of factors collectively increase the risk of home cooking fires on Thanksgiving," said Lorraine Carli, NFPA's vice president of Outreach and Advocacy. "People are often preparing multiple dishes with lots of guests and other distractions, which can make it all too easy to forget what's on the stove. That's when cooking mishaps are most likely to occur."

"A little added awareness about potential fire hazards and taking a few basic precautions in the kitchen can go a long way toward keeping your Thanksgiving fire-free," said Carli.

Here are some tips for cooking with fire safety in mind on Thanksgiving and beyond:

Remain in the kitchen while you're cooking.

Be alert when cooking. If you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol, don't use the stove or stovetop.

If you have a small (grease) cooking fire on the stovetop and decide to fight the fire: Smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled. For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed.

If you're cooking a turkey using a disposable aluminum pan, consider doubling up and using two pans to avoid a puncture, as dripping turkey juices can cause an oven fire.

NFPA discourages the use of turkey fryers, a popular cooking method on Thanksgiving. The use of turkey fryers can lead to devastating burns and other injuries, and the destruction of property due to the large amount and high temperature of oil used. NFPA urges those who prefer fried turkey to look for grocery stores, specialty food retailers and restaurants that sell deep fried turkeys.


