Poloncarz and Commissioner of Health Dr. Gale Burstein are pleased to announce the date of the first of six free rabies vaccination clinics provided by the Erie County Department of Health in 2016. The Clinic will be on Wednesday, January 27th. The clinic will be held from 3 pm to 7 pm at the North Buffalo Community Center at 203 Sanders Road in North Buffalo.

“Our free rabies clinics are a great way for Erie



County to help protect families and their pets from rabies” said Poloncarz. “In 2015, 4,716 dogs, cats and ferrets were vaccinated countywide through these clinics. I strongly encourage pet owners around the

County to take advantage of this valuable and mandated public health initiative.”

“These vaccinations are a good way to minimize any problems that may arise from contact between wildlife, pets and possibly their human owners” added Burstein. “I want to remind Erie County residents that if they or their pets have been exposed to a wild animal, or bitten by a dog or cat, they should contact the Erie County Department of Health at 961-6800.”

The Adventures of...
Rocket Man

‘Of Mice and Men’

Re-sharpening an old saw, build a better “Mice & Men” and the world will beat a path to your door. It sure played out that way Sunday at the charming Lancaster Opera House, where a remarkable North Buffalo lawman led a skilled cast staging the John Steinbeck classic for a mob of miceaholics willing to risk being trapped by oncoming weather.

Historically the last play ever mounted by the Studio Arena, “Mice & Men” tells of two Depression era migrants, savvy George and dense Lenny, struggling to declare independence. They drift onto a Northern California ranch and appear to have made their fortune – or at least enough for a place of their own – before fate stunts their crop.

While sad, the tale is riveting, speaking much to compassion and loyalty. Lon Chaney played

the original movie Lenny (1938), but he’d have a monster of a time matching Victor Morales, a retired North Buffalo trooper, who conveys him with newfound breadth.

Full disclosure: In 1996, Morales played opposite Rocket Man, as his developmentally-disabled son Mickey in Tom Dudzick’s pre-“Tavern” Christmas play “Greetings!” It was just Morales’ second play, and he was a marvel then, although he and Rocket Man were almost comically mis-matched as father and son. (As indeed, here, he beyond the role’s age range.)

It’s not as if Morales makes a habit of realizing the mentally-challenged, but what he does with Lenny makes his doom even gloomier. Morales’ Lenny revels in his small successes, slow to dawn in his dim recognition, his face then so beaming that they could turn out the lights. We’ve

never seen Lenny giggle. He has found the child in the man as few before him.

For Rocking House Productions director Jane Navarro, Andrew Kotler plays the frustrated George with double-edged optimism and pessimism, an exemplar of “tough love” long before the term entered psycho-babble. Mike Breen gives maimed old janitor Candy similar balance, even while criminally upstaged by “Frankie Barkham” as his shaggy old four-footed helpmate. When Frankie re-appeared at final curtain, the throng about brought down the house.

“M&M” pivots on “Curly’s Wife,” seductively played here by Sadie Clark. As plain-clothed as a narc, she makes an effective case for her character’s loneliness, but when she waves a little good-bye, it’s practically R-rated. Nathan Lewinski chillingly bristles as her “handy” spouse, and Shabar Rouse brings dignity and disenfranchisement to the stableman Crooks.

Navarro’s set is spare with the feel, at times, of an Old West movie. Rocket Man learned that the hall’s acoustics militate against a lot of off-stage sound effects, such as horseshoes clanking. The vital fights are vividly staged by battle choreographer Steve Vaughan. Against many peers, “Mice & Men” stands tall. EIGHT ROCKETS (out of 10) through Sunday in Lancaster.

sidewall wear and tread depth.

- Check the antifreeze level and freeze line.

- Have a tune up to ensure your best gas mileage, a quick start and a fast response.

of reach, become exhausted, and collapse. Your car can be a good shelter.

- Keep fresh air in your vehicle. It is better to be chilly or cold and awake than to become comfortably warm and slip into unconsciousness.

Winter Driving Tips:

- Get the latest weather forecast before you leave.

- Keep a full tank of gas at all times.

- Clear snow and ice

from windows, lights, hood and roof before driving.

- Be aware that exit ramps usually have less anti-icing material than the main line and extra care should be taken when exiting.
