'Bad Jews'

Theatrically, "Bad Jews" is good news in Getzville. But moments before an open house at headquarters last week, Rocket Man turned his kitchen calendar to the wall. How could he explain to mostly total strangers those two words in letters four inches high, reminding him of opening night?

Like, did you hear the one about "Polish Joke," the title that got North Buffalo's Kaleidoscope troupe tossed out of Canisius College? Ah, but at the Maxine & Robert Seller Theater, 2640 North Forest Rd., a good jewel blessed by the Jewish Community Center, the welcome mat was out, especially at the noshful and nourishing Meyer's Tel Aviv Café across the lobby.

The play convenes four mourners – three Jewish, one not – to assault each other with everything from curses to couches after the death of a revered patri-

arch. The Larry of these four ideological stooges is self-righteous, Daphna, mouth as foul as the water in Flint. She is portrayed by Arin Lee Dandes, a breakout role for a vibrant actress with a boxful of credits including Theater of Youth. (Had Becky Thatcher chosen these words, she'd have gotten her mouth cleansed with whitewash.) In her hand, even a comb morphs into an obscene gesture.

When Daphna talks, people in a five-mile radius listen, as if they had a choice. As cunning as she is crass, she'll gravitationally declare "Let's just drop it," even though she lifted it in the first place. All that might stand between her and awards is that the rest of the cast is so competent as to deserve honor as an ensemble.

Others: Nick Stevens as the less strident cousin Jonah, Adam Rath as the self-serving Liam and fetching Jamie Nablo as his squeeze Melody, thrust into this awkward goy-meets-bull conclave. Melody has "studied" opera, but when she tries to make peace by singing "Summertime," her phrasing makes you yearn for winter. Not even Mary Kate O'Connell's Flo Jo from "Glorious" could have sung it worse, and that's a compliment.

They've gathered 'cause Poppy has passed, Holocaust survivor who has left behind both reverent memories and a necklace, a "chai," much coveted in the worst sort of way. How he got this past the Nazis in concentration camp is a bit hard to swallow, but the oversized prop is probably a necessity for visibility. Whatever. Fierce accusations, recriminations and judgments fill the fairly posh apartment, most concerning who is true to the faith and who not.

Stage-combat maven Steve Vaughan was born to direct this high-energy brawl. Playwright Joshua Harmon excels at bitter ripostes, world-class kvetching with ever-changing allegiances, often too true to be funny, but the little hall rocked with laughter, Rocket Man often the loudest.

There is a commonality here. It wouldn't take many alterations to reset "Bad Jews" at any wake of any faith. Who's afraid of Virginia Woolffstein? NINE ROCKETS (out of 10) through Feb. 28.


The 100-member Canisius College Chorale is one of the area's most active collegiate musical ensembles.



The meeting is free and open to the public.


