"... Nobody Knows Your Name..."

Three weeks from today, the road-weary Bisons will hurl the first pitch at Coca-Cola Field. For those who can't wait to savor the flavor, there's author John Feinstein's "Where Nobody Knows Your Name: Life in the Minor Leagues of Baseball," a revealing and myth-busting study of the fears, frustrations and failures of life within reach of the top.

Rocket Man had anticipated it would include the lower minors, where things REALLY get anonymous. Instead, it concentrates almost exclusively on Class AAA, but in that regards provides a real insight into the scrambled rosters, the multiple player moves and the mindset of a manager who comes to the park to discover that the pitcher he's planned to start that night has been called up for a look.

It's a nice way to make a living, but it's hard, and as one of the managers rationalizes, "If you don't like it here, get better and move up to the next level."

Feinstein haunted a score of ballparks from daybreak to the weesmalls. He watched players get sent up, sent down, sent to the hospital, sent to rehab. It's a bit of a jungle in there.

Along the way, Feinstein confirmed a conclusion that Rocket Man suspected almost ever since liftoff. There is no way that any one can presume to predict how a Class AAA team's season will play out. Who could, when likely as not a late-August lineup may include just one or two players from opening day? And no parent club gives a flying fig about how a call-up might affect the chances of a Class AAA club fighting for the pennant or at least the playoffs.

One amusing yarn involves a Bison pitcher named Chris Schwinden,

ostensibly sent here from Pittsburgh, which even soft-footed Rocket Man can maneuver in four hours. It took Schwinden closer to 24, via New York City, the last 18 spent in a horrifying, hired-car, wiper-shredded drive with a thick-headed chauffeur from Manhattan. Uber, where is thy sting?

Feinstein goes far beyond the rosters. Here's an umpire, "on the bubble," at the point of no return in his career; after this season he will either elevate to the major leagues or go home to play with his kids. Rocket Man confesses to having skipped to the conclusion of this wrenching tale. Announcers have dreams, too, subject to heart-breaking wakeup calls.

Feinstein doesn't pitch a perfect game. Involved in a review of a scoring call in Raleigh, he gets it wrong, at least to Rocket Man's thinking, confirmed by one of the best. And it's not the sort of book that makes you want to drop everything and run out to the game, but if that's part of your habit you'll get insight as almost never before. Play ball.


Meyer continued to write weekly features and columns for Rocket Publications through 1997. Over the years, he wrote nearly 1,000 articles for the newspapers.




