And the Winner is...

"Spotlight"! First Mate presciently dialed it up Saturday night. Seeking respite after a wearying day of packing, she went to "On Demand" and demanded it. Rocket Man thought it odd choice for relaxation, but the two-hour tribute to the journalism craft, and then its later selection as Best Picture, confirmed her navigational genius.

"Spotlight," its title taken from the autonomous investigative team of the Boston Globe, describes a year's probe of the frequency of Catholic clergy misconduct and, more vitally, the Diocese's devotion to keeping those sexual offenses from public knowledge. The "fix" was in at every level, according to the movie, starting with the appropriatelynamed Cardinal Law. In fervidly Catholic eastern Massachusetts, this was a deeply unpopular cause, particularly driven by a

Jewish editor, to whom the Cardinal pompously presents a bound copy of the catechism.

All sought to preserve the Church's reputation for the sake of the "greater good," the true noble charity of Catholicism, cold comfort to the victims, the "rapees," so to speak. Their numbers started at a tremulous 10 people and reached, by film's end, 108 DIOCESES!

Rocket Man recalls being pinned on his own investigation of high-school wrestling in Pennsylvania because a coach who was also a city official threatened to axe his paper's application for a cable franchise. Another probe, of shoddy roadwork, hit a dead end when officials told the paper: "If you ever want that road to Pittsburgh, you'll stop this now." Ever drive past Erie, PA? You know where that led.

"Spotlight" showcases every obstacle - economics, the standdown after 9-11, the fear of losing the story to a rival paper which might mishandle it, the careful post-Christmas timing. "Spotlight" ends not with a bang, but with the ringing of countless telephones from other victims. ArtVoice has a category for this which the Academy does not: Ensemble performance. A right clean movie, too, for its "R" rating and sordid subject. Read all about it.

AND NOW – But Rocket Man missed the presentation. Didn't record enough. An organization with so many awards for editing should be able to conclude its own showcase inside a 3 ½-hour budget.

These were the whiniest Oscars ever. It's a wonder Chris Rock didn't gripe that a piano has more white keys than black. While there's a certain smirk when so "progressive" a claque as moviemakers stands charged with the racism of which it accuses everybody else, this gag got very old, very fast.

Good moments, nonetheless: Whoppi Goldberg sloshing about with a mop, and Rock, in what Rocket Man hopes were bona fide street interviews, finding audiences in "The Hood" clueless as to movies with largely white casts.

Good heavens, the president of the ACADEMY itself is a woman of color and as Rock did observe, 30 years ago racism concerned things that really matter. Can't we all just get along?





were being installed.

The new parking regulations will allow parking on both sides of the street - 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, from April 2nd to November 14th.

Alternate side park-

ing will remain in effect for the purpose of clearing snow from November 15th to April 1st. The change will open up several hundred spots on side streets on weekdays, freeing up supply for both residents and visitors to the area.


