

Final Touchdown

In the autumn of 1984, the Man Who Would Be Rocket returned from to Manhattan, where he had seen the movie "Man with the Red Shoe," interviewed star Gene Wilder for Channel 4 and then, on a whim, accepted a print-mediaonly chat with co-star Kelly LeBrock. It might reactivate the writing chops which had served him so well in a 37-year newspaper career, terminated when the Courier-Express closed.

The Buffalo News' theater editor green-lighted the project, but when Rocket Man showed up at the door, the signal changed. They would get every bit as good a piece from the wire services, and for nothing, a different editor told him rather cooly.

Crushed and betrayed, he stopped by the Delaware Avenue offices of the North Buffalo Rocket. Editor Paul Likoudis, had a better idea: How would he like to write a regular weekly column on almost any topic of his choosing.

Deal. He joined an awesome aggregation of media giants including TV's Jim Baker, radio legend Ralph Hubbell and governmental reporter Brian Meyer.

To this day, he has not missed a column, come rain, sleet, temper or vacation. It took many forms - there was "That's Entertainment," a media commentary called "Between the Lines," a diamondsports observation "Base Paths." For a while, all three ran simultaneously. Then, about 10 years ago, he shot off an apology to Elton John and gathered the three-ring circus under the coverall "Rocket Man."

With today's edition, the circus leaves town. Rocket Man is not only cooling his jets, he's shutting them down. As this paper rolls off the press, he and his First Mate roll toward Cortland,

A Trip Through the Past

While Hertel North Park gets ready to celebrate 60 years, The Buffalo Rocket looks back on some old press clippings submitted by this correspondent.

Robert O'Sullivan of North Buffalo was quoted here in the Rocket back in 1983. "Baseball is as much a mental as a physical game." He was right. A first year volunteer manager for a White Sox team in Hertel North Park, O'Sullivan felt that confidence can swav from time to time like in any other game. His team had yet to win their first game but he was patient "for their sway to the top."

These were thoughts and notes collected over a thirty year period when there were once two little league baseball programs in North Buffalo. Hertel North Park was in its 34th season, according to records, and a neighboring Delaware Hertel League played baseball just down the street on Tacoma near Delaware Avenue. Between the two leagues, over 1,000 boys and some girls played every night and on the weekends not far from their homes.

In 1982, Hertel North Park began two Pony

Tail Softball Divisions for girls, ages 7 to 10 and 11 to 14. After years of playing together with the boys, teams like Tigers or Brewers were helping the League expand its opportunities for Girls. From June in 1983 we read: "The Tigers are defending last year's championship. They have a four and one record and this week they shut out the Pirates, 8-0 behind the two hit pitching of Jackie Moranto, who went 3 for 4 at the plate. Centerfielder Anita Anzalone caught a pop fly and threw to second base for an inning ending double play."

The Brewers were 7-0 and consisted of players Michelle Neff, Dawn Mason, Monica Barnett, Maureen Littlefield, Gina Smaldone, Jennifer Yager and Melissa Lyons. Each of the seven wins were keyed by a different girl. All but four of them are playing Softball for the first time.

So many memories played on the diamonds of Shoshone Park. There was still a concrete wall where diamond #3 now sits, and diamonds #7 and the t-ball area were not even placed just within the past ten years. Sho-


shone Park was also home to various Youth Football Leagues in the area at the time. Summers ended quickly back then with the play of Shoshone football Chiefs, Redskins, Savages and Warriors.

For boys, the Reds and Sam Chianta were always a part of teams qualifying for playoffs. "The Reds scored eight runs in the first inning on RBI singles that shut down the Phillies early and gave pitcher Mark Kolepp his second win of the season. On defense, the Reds came up with a double play. In the fourth, with the bases loaded and one out, Jason Newton caught a pop fly and immediately threw to shortstop Doug Klaif. Klaif then threw home to catcher Andy Moynihan at the plate, tagging a Phillie runner."

We're not certain when the Delaware Hertel League was formed. They played on land adjacent to Public School 81 until 1986. There was just one diamond and a small concession stand. The League consisted of a dozen teams both in Major and Minor divisions. Smaller to the Hertel North Park League, but well run by a contingent of working families who cared enough to keep their children safe at night and on Saturdays for League games.

Next week we'll share more names of players and mention League coaches who were instrumental in helping Hertel North become what it is today.



April is Donate Life Month

April is National "Donate Life" Month and a good time to consider helping the growing list of people living on hope. As you read this, as many as 10,000 New Yorkers are waiting for a life-saving transplant, including close to 800 people here in Western New York. Thousands more are waiting for lifeenhancing tissue and eye donations.

Every 10 minutes someone is added to the national waiting list. The good news is that each day approximately 79 individuals will get a new lease on life by receiving an organ transplant. One organ and tissue donor has the ability to save and enhance the lives of up to 50 people through needed organs, corneas, skin, bone, and heart valves.

Disappointingly, New York State has the third highest need for donors in the country and has the second lowest percentage of registered donors nationwide with only 26% of individuals 18 and older who have joined the New York State Donate Life Or-

gan and Tissue Donation Registry. Out of the 10,000 New Yorkers on the waiting list, over 1,700 have been waiting for life saving and improving transplants for more than 5 years. Each year, approximately 500 men, women and children in the state die because to the shortage of donors.

I am pleased to report over the last two years, Erie County Auto Bureaus have signed-up nearly 45,000 individuals to the New York State Donor Registry, significantly increasing the number of registrants by 62% in comparison to a couple of years ago. According to Unyts, 80% of people that become organ donors register through the DMV. In total, over 3.5 million have registered as organ donors through DMV's statewide, with 264,996 Erie County residents having enrolled through our local Auto Bureau offices.

I encourage all motorists that come into any of the Erie County Auto Bureaus to enroll in the Donate Life Registry by checking the box "yes" and signing the New York State

Organ and Tissue Donation consent on any driver license or non-driver identification application or renewal form. When you enroll through this method, a symbol of a heart and the words "Organ Donor" will be printed on the front of your driver license or nondriver identification card at no extra cost.


