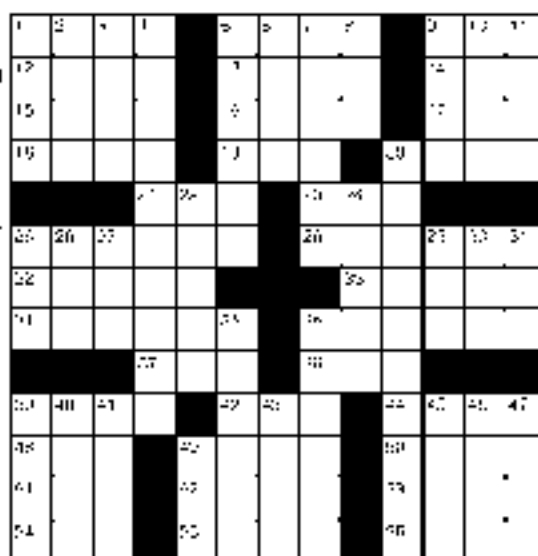

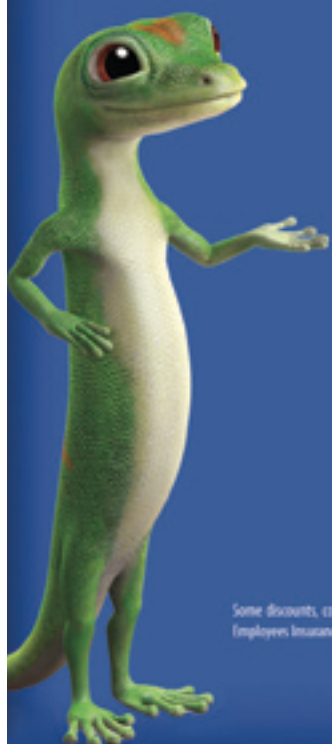

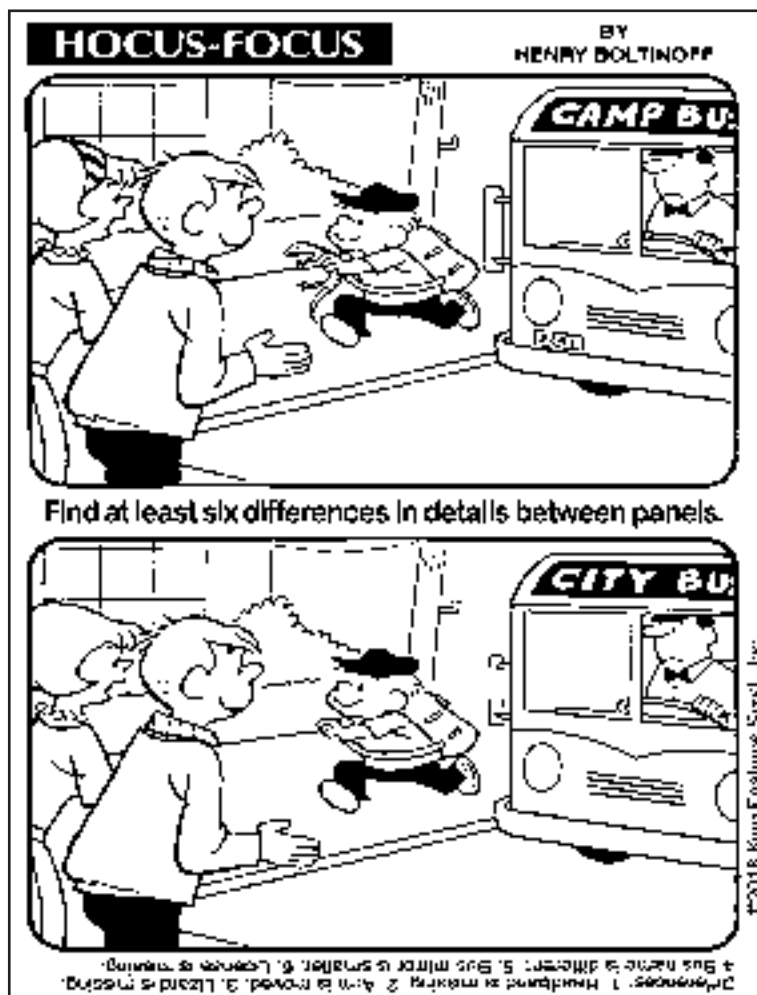

Bring tap water to a rolling boil, boil for one minute, and cool before using. Or use bottled water certified for sale by the NY State Department of Health. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, washing dishes, brushing teeth, and preparing food.

diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms and may pose a special health risk for infants, some elderly, and those with severely compromised immune systems.
