The cubs, one male and two females, were born to firsttime mother Lusaka and second-time father Tiberius on May 12th of this year.

Along with the public debut this weekend, the Zoo will be announcing the names of each of the cubs. In considering a methodol-



Jacobs Receives Donate Life Champion Honor

 ${\bf Erie\,County\,Clerk\,Chris}$ Jacobs and his staff at the Erie County Auto Bureau were recently honored by the New York Alliance for Donation (NYAD) with the Donate Life Champion Award in recognition for exceptional leadership in raising awareness of organ, eye and tissue donation during National "Donate Life" Month.

Jacobs received the Award because of the outstanding support he and his staff demonstrated during the 2016 "Donate Life" Month campaign by enrolling 2,197 new organ donor registrants in April into the New York State Donate Life Registry.

"I want to thank New York Alliance Donation for this honor and congratulate my Auto Bureau staff for their dedication to this

life-saving campaign," stated Jacobs. "Over the past two years, they have helped to collectively enroll 44,565 new organ donors just in Erie County to the New York State Organ Donor Registry, which is an exceptional achievement."

"It was my distinct pleasure to inform Clerk Jacobs that Erie County was awarded the outstanding champion and winner of the high population county," said Aisha M. Tator, Executive Director of the New York Alliance for Donation.

Jacobs is a member of the "Working Together, Working for Life" Task Force, led by the Alliance whose mission is to increase organ, eye and tissue donation in New York State. Currently, over 10,000 New Yorkers are currently waiting for a lifesaving organ transplant, including more than 800 across Erie County and Western New York.

"Mv staff and I will continue to work year-round educating our customers on the significance of organ donation and emphasize the importance of enrolling in the New York State Organ Donor Registry," added Jacobs.

corporate sponsor will be naming the male cub as a courtesy of it and Mr. Rich's generosity; the keeper staff will name one of the female cubs; and, the general public will be able to weighin on three name choices for the remaining female through an online survey found on the Zoo's social media pages. "Our visitors

are important to us and we are committed to engaging them whenever possible. Like the gorilla baby naming earlier this year, this is yet another opportunity to involve the public," Geise added. All three names will be revealed at 11 am on Saturday at the lion exhibit.

African lions are classified as vulnerable in the wild by the International

Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN). The U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service classifies the African lion as threatened. Loss of habitat and poaching are among the key causes of this classification. Galligano said Reddy rack locations were chosen based on public feedback gathered from the "Get Reddy Buffalo" campaign conducted this past spring as well as criteria such as available space, pedestrian traffic, population density, and each site's vicinity to bike infrastructure and transit options.

"More than 800 votes were logged both online and in person with considerable public appeal for specific locations including Delaware Park, Broadway Market, Buffalo Museum of Science, the downtown Buffalo & Erie County Public Library, and RiverWorks as well as Canalside and the Allentown and Elmwood Village neighborhoods," said Galligano. "Riders will be able to pick up Reddy bikes at all

these locations and plenty more."

Mayor Brown said, "The launch of Buffalo's new Reddy bikeshare program is yet another step in making our city more bike-friendly for both our residents and visitors. With over 30 new bike stations being placed throughout the city, this program will give people additional healthy options to get around our city. I recently had a wonderful bike ride at Rails to Trails, and I'm pleased I was able to participate in the group ride around Delaware Park. I hope those riding the new "smart" bikes will enjoy the many trails, parks and bike lanes that the City is continuing to invest in to improve the quality of life for all."

Reddy bikes allow riders the flexibility to park at any public bike rack within city limits with three different parking options.

Free parking zones - located on Elmwood Avenue, Allen Street, downtown on Main Street as well as at the Broadway Market and the Buffalo Museum of Science. In these zones, riders can park at any Reddy rack or public bike rack for free.

Preferred parking zones - available for the rider's convenience to drop off a bike closer to their destination. Reddy racks outside of the free parking zones will cost a rider \$.25 to park.

Public bike racks - riders will also have the freedom to park at any other public rack within the city limits for a small fee of \$2.00.
