



the Playoff Champions. The Broncos, Coached by Liz Hoffman were the Overall Champions in the 14-18 Division.


For the West Side Boys Baseball League, the





 from 7 pm until 9 pm. The city plans to install Pay and Display meters in the three city-owned parking lots, as well.

The lack of turnover makes it difficult to find a parking spot on the Avenue. Hertel Avenue business owners have complained that existing parking rules enable motorists to remain parked in a single spot in the busy restaurant district all evening and even overnight. It is bad for business if customers cannot find a place to park.

Lack of parking spots on Hertel Avenue forces more patrons onto side streets. Business employees, tenants of up-

stairs apartments and residents of nearby side streets have been parking in the currently-free, city-owned lots for long stretches of time.

Difficult parking situations can deter customers from frequenting Hertel Avenue businesses, which in turn affects the prosperity of the community.

The maximum of two hour parking will be enforced, and the metered parking will be extended until 9 pm - remember restaurants and bars are just beginning their busiest times after 5 pm. The North Park Theatre and a block in each direction will have extended three hour parking to accommodate movie pa-

trons. Pay and Display meters will be installed in the city-owned parking lots at 1464 Hertel Avenue (next to Craving) and at 1511 Hertel Avenue (next to and behind La Pizza Club). There will be more parking spaces available for those supporting businesses on Hertel Avenue throughout the day and evening. Almost all of the shops, restaurants and service providers on Hertel Avenue are small businesses which depend on frequent turnover for their livelihoods.

Half of the additional parking revenue resulting from the changes will be earmarked for the Hertel Avenue business district.
