# Lehner Establishing Credentials as Number One Goalie

Robin Lehner's athleticism was on full display during the Buffalo Sabres 2-1 victory on the road against the Ottawa Senators on October 5th. Ottawa dominated the first two periods with Lehner holding the Sabres in the game until the third period when his teammates scored twice for the victory.

Following the game Lehner had a 4-3-1 record and ranked in the top ten among NHL goalies in both save percentage at .929 and goals against average with 2.14.

When Sabres GM Tim Murray acquired Lehner along with aging center David Legwand in a trade with Ottawa Senators for a first round draft pick, many observers felt that he had given up too much for an unproven goaltender. The addition of Legwand seemed like a favor to Ottawa's GM, Brian Murray the uncle of the Sabres GM. Legwand was

in the final year of his contract and not in Ottawa's long term plans so the Sens were able to free up cap space and dump his salary onto the Sabres books. Was this a hockey trade or a family favor?

Lehner's first year in Buffalo saw him compile a mediocre 5-9- 5 record but his 0.924 save percentage was the sixth best in the NHL. It wasn't his play that limited him to just 21 games, he suffered a concussion that cost him the bulk of the season and underwent ankle surgery

near the end of the season.

Having never played more than 36 games in a season and with only 97 starts in six NHL campaigns, did Lehner have the durability to carry the load and play 55 games or more as the Sabres number one goalie? At 245 pounds was he too heavy and injury prone? Lehner answered these questions by showing up at training camp a new man, having lost 30 or more pounds and displaying a svelte athletic physique. His improved quickness was on full display in the Ottawa game as he darted from side to side twice to deny sure goals and lead the Sabres to a victory.

So far this season, Lehner's play has been exemplary. If he can stay healthy, perhaps the Sabres have found their franchise goaltender.








- 1 (8.5 ounce) package dry corn bread mix
- 1 (15 ounce) can whole kernel corn, drained
- 1 (14.75 ounce) can creamed corn
- 1 cup sour cream

#### Directions:


Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C), and lightly grease a 9x9 inch baking dish or soufflé dish.


In a medium bowl, combine butter, eggs, corn bread mix, whole and creamed corn and sour cream. Spoon mixture into prepared dish.

McKinley was run by Master Sergeant Joe Dugan.

Sergeant Brown said that he looked up to Master Sergeant Dugan as a father figure. He was his "leader" in JROTC, ". . . and Master Sergeant Dugan never pushed anyone towards the armed services."

The JROTC program goes well beyond the class-room. By providing many opportunities to participate in community events and to volunteer for community services, it leads cadets to a practical understanding of how to be good citizens.

It is important to know that JROTC is neither recruitment nor an indoctrination program. The military structure is only a vehicle to develop and improve students' self-discipline, confidence, and pride in ways schools generally do not offer. The goal is to develop good students and

citizens. Nothing is more rewarding than JROTC integrated-curricular activities. JROTC uses a unique but proven approach across the world to guide students toward success in high school, college, and beyond.

In 2010, Sergeant Brown enlisted in the New York Army National Guard as an Infantryman. While in the Guard he was deployed to Afghanistan.

Sergeant Brown returned home in 2013, married his wife Sierra and attended three semesters of school at Erie County Community College for Criminal Justice and maintained a 3.8 GPA.

He switched to active duty in June of 2014 and was deployed in support of Operation Inherent Resolve in 2015

At the party on Erie Street in front of the Submarine Croaker at the Buffalo and Naval Servicemen's Park, Sam Guadagna, former Captain of the fireboat and a person most responsible for the Cotter's National Landmark Status and Buffalo Fire Commissioner Garnell Whitfield, Jr. will blow out the candles on a specially prepared birthday cake.

The Buffalo Firefighters Pipe and Drum Band will perform. Captain Guadagna will be available to answer questions on the history of the Cotter and


