The New York State Department of Transportation has announced the next public hearing to solicit public feedback for their plan to transform the Scajaquada Expressway into a Boulevard on January 25th, at the Fredrick Law Olmsted Public School 64 auditorium (874 Amherst Street) beginning at 5:30 pm. The project is currently scheduled to allow construction to begin

in fall 2017.

Sabres Turn To Nilsson To Ignite Playoff Push

With the Sabres languishing near the bottom of the Eastern Conference standings despite recent strong play, the team turned to backup goalie Anders Nilsson to help close in on a playoff spot. Starter Robin Lehner and Nilsson have nearly identical individual game statistics except for their win-loss records, Lehner is 9-12-5 while Nilsson is 7-3-4 after the win against Philadelphia including 5-1-2 in his last eight games. While the team has shown deference to Lehner as the starter appearing in 27 games to Nilsson's 14, they are in a must win situation now at the seasons mid point and need to lean on Nilsson because he has proven more adept at winning games.Among the skaters Sam Reinhart had a goal and two assists giving him 12 points in his

last 10 games.

Nilsson was strong Tuesday night against Philadelphia in a 4-1 win. The Flyers put 40 shots on goal but few were from the dangerous scoring area where the Flyers seemed unwilling to pay the price to establish their presence. Only a late goal by Brayden Schenn on a six to four man power play with the goalie pulled averted a shutout Philly's failure to convert on their chances was not surprising as they have scored only 19 goals in their last 11 games.

The Sabres are on a bit of a tear lately, going 3-0-1 in their last four games beating league powers the New York Rangers decisively and losing in overtime to the Chicago Blackhawks both on the

They defeated the Winnipeg Jets at home 4-3 overcoming a 3-1 deficit with three third period goals in a game seen as having the potential to turn their season around.

With the Sabres win there are only seven points between Buffalo and Philadelphia in the standings. But that is a huge gap and it is sobering to see Philly. com this morning referring to the the Flyers loss to the "Lowly Sabres" and their status as one of the league's "Bottom feeders." The team still has a lot of work to do to.

Notice of Rescheduled Public Hearing New York State Department of Transportation Project Identification No. 5470.22 NY Route 198, Scajaquada Corridor Project

In accordance with the provisions of Title 23, U.S. Code, Section 128 and Title 40, Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 1500 to 1508: a design public hearing will be conducted by the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) for the NY Route 198 (Scajaquada Corridor) project. The hearing originally scheduled for December 14, 2016 has been rescheduled to January 25, 2017 at Fredrick Law Olmsted Public School 64 Auditorium, 874 Amherst Street at Lincoln Parkway, Buffalo, NY 14216, beginning at 5:30 p.m. The project would provide geometric and operational improvements to NY Route 198 in its current location from the Grant Street interchange to the Parkside Avenue intersection, including the segment through Delaware Park. These improvements would be made while maintaining local connectivity and a critical transportation link between Interstate 190 and NY Route 33 (Kensington Expressway) while providing enhanced compatibility with adjacent land uses. The total length of the project is 2.2+/- miles, all within the City of Buffalo.

Design plans for the project have been developed by NYSDOT after coordination with federal, state, local agencies and the public, and will be available for inspection at the public hearing. Department staff will be on hand at 4:30 p.m., one hour prior to the start of the hearing, to discuss the project and answer any questions. Tentative schedules for right–of-way acquisition and construction will be discussed. No relocations are anticipated with this project.

Maps, drawings and other pertinent information developed by NYSDOT, and comments received as a result of the coordination with federal, state and local agencies, is available for public inspection and copying at the Office of the Regional Director, New York State Department of Transportation, 100 Seneca Street, Buffalo, New York, 14203.

The documents are also available electronically on the project website:https://www.dot.ny.gov/scajaquadacorridor.

All interested persons will be given the opportunity to express their views concerning the design plans, their impact on the environment and their consistency with the goals and objectives of such planning as has been promulgated by the community. The proceedings will be recorded. Persons may file written statements and other exhibits in place of or in addition to oral statements made at the public hearing. Written statements submitted at the hearing, emailed to scajaquadacorridor@dot.ny.gov or mailed and received before February 08, 2017 at the Regional Director's Office will be made part of the record.

Those property owners who may subsequently wish to challenge condemnation of their property via judicial review under the Eminent Domain Procedure Law (EDPL) may do so only on the basis of issues, facts and objections raised at the hearing.




