Lexington Cooperative Market poured the inside foundation of its second store on Wednesday, March 1st. This kicked off the final phase of construction, as the community-owned natural foods market moves towards a mid-summer opening. This expansion project began more than two years ago when some 300+ community

investors raised more than \$2 million to fund the project in just six months.

Ahead of pouring of the foundation, Lexington Coop asked its shoppers and staff to write "love notes" and well wishes as it sets out on this exciting new adventure. These notes will be placed inside the foundation of the store as it is poured.

This will forever cement the community's involvement and dedication to bringing a natural foods co-op to North Buffalo. "This

is truly a grassroots project," said Tim Bartlett, the Coop's General Manager. "The community funded this new store, and now we're thrilled to cement their hopes and



### **Sabres Season Comes Crashing Down**

With three consecutive losses over four days it is now safe to start shoveling dirt onto the 2016-17 season. Coming out of the league mandated bye week, it was expected the team would be sluggish so their 5-3 loss Saturday in Colorado was not unexpected. The high elevation and thin air in Denver makes it challenging for visiting teams but there are ways of dealing with that. Combined with the five days of no practicing it was too much to overcome.

A loss in Phoenix on Sunday and the manner in which the Sabres surrendered a 2-0 lead was especially galling. Rasmus Ristolainen who wears the label "number one defenseman" just handed the puck to Max Domi player in the slot for an easy goal. This started the Desert Dogs on a three goal surge in the last 13 minutes culminating with the winning goal by Radim Verbata with just 18.9 seconds remaining. Vrbata's long slapper was through a screen which Sabres defenders Zach Bogosian and Dmitri Kulikov did little to rectify. Bogosian actually skated

into and bowled over his own goaltender shortly before the shot.

Sabres players know the home team will push harder after falling behind by two but did little to match the increasing intensity of their opponent. "We let them come at us a little bit too hard. We were a little too passive in the neutral zone and they came at us with a ton of speed." said coach Dan Bylsma in writing the seasons obituary.

The mood in the Sabres locker room following the loss was reportedly one of resignation with the players largely silent, knowing that they had failed to generate even a single point in the standings against the leagues two worst teams. They returned to Buffalo and lost another 2-0 lead falling to Nashville 5-4 on Tuesday at the Keybank Center. In overtime with a 4 on 3 power play, they misfired on six consecutive shots including three Jack Eichel attempts which were all blocked before the winning goal from Filip Forsberg.

The Preds commitment on that penalty kill illustrates a season long problem for Buffalo, the players are not willing to pay the price in bruises to keep opponents from getting shots on goal. The next game you watch, keep notes on every Buffalo forward who blocks a shot. You won't need much ink. And when you do find one, it will probably be someone like Justin Bailey, a young player trying to establish himself, not one of the veterans. The Sabres have given up far too many shots against this season, a total of 2,151 for 34.1 per game both ranking 30th and dead last in the league. It's just not good enough.



Principal chess players were Cage; Duchamp and his wife, Alexina (Teeny). A chessboard was designed by composer/media artist Lowell Cross; in which every move on the chessboard signaled a change in sound distributed to eight speakers and created by composers David Behrman, Gordon Mumma, David Tudor and Lowell Cross.

The Burchfield Penney Art Center at SUNY Buffalo State in collaboration with the Institute for Electronic Arts and National Casting Centre at NYSCC, Alfred University will co-present a homage to this spontaneous musical event. Reunion: Chess will open Friday, March 10th in The Center's Project Space and be on view through Sunday, June 25th.

Gallery visitors will be encouraged to play on one of four unique chess sets designed and made by sculptors Karen Donnellan and Coral Penelope Lambert. The exhibition will include archival video footage of Cage and Duchamp altered: colorized, wobblized, inverted, distorted et al by Buffalo-based multimedia and electronic artist Bill Sack whose contributions will also include technical design and musical composition.

In the spirit of Cage, new music was commissioned to include works by Jacob Carpenter Morris; excerpts from Train Tracks and Harpsichord Remix (2013) by Marc Thorman; and Please, Wait (2013) by Lynn Wright for Sack's version of Reunion: Chess (2013); Cage's composition Chess Pieces (1943)

originally created for The Imagery of Chess exhibition organized by Duchamp, Max Ernst, and Julien Levy at the Julien Levy Gallery in New York (194445) unites the new version with the old.


