Leave Fireworks To The Professionals

Independence Day and fireworks go hand in hand, but fireworks shouldn't go in consumers' hands. That's the message the National Fire Protection Association is reinforcing this Fourth of July. Fireworks annually cause devastating burns, injuries, fires, and even death, making them too dangerous to be used safely by consumers.

"Each year, thousands of people are injured from using consumer fireworks," said Lorraine Carli, NFPA's vice president of Outreach and Advocacy. "Even sparklers, which are often thought of as harmless enough for children to hold, burn at 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit and can cause significant injuries."

On Independence Day in a typical year, fireworks account for two out of five of all reported U.S. fires, more than any other cause of fire. On average each year, fireworks start 18,500 fires, including 1,300 structure fires, 300 vehicle fires, and 16,900 outside and other fires. These fires cause an annual average of three deaths, 40 civilian injuries, and \$43 million in

direct property damage.

However, the vast majority of fireworks injuries occur without a fire starting. According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission's 2015 Fireworks Annual Report, U.S. hospital emergency rooms treated an estimated 11,900 people for fireworks-related injuries; Sparklers were the leading cause of fireworks injuries. More than half of the fireworks injuries incurred by children under five years of age were caused by sparklers.

"Knowing the harm fireworks inflict each year, particularly among young people, we urge everyone to leave fireworks to the professionals who are trained to safely put on spectacular displays. It is by far the safest way to enjoy them," said Carli.

Why Not Vanek?

The departure of leading goal scorer Evander Kane in the very near future looks certain. Eichel and Kane had developed some chemistry playing together last season. With his ability to finish plays, the veteran Kane gave Eichel a reliable play-making option. How will the Sabres replace the 28 goals Kane scored?

Early in his career Vanek was called the best pure sniper in the NHL by The Hockey News. They said with the game on the line there is no more dangerous player with the puck on his stick in front of the net. He is on the downside of his career since leaving Buffalo early in the 2013-14 season. He slipped below 20 goals in a reduced role recently in Minnesota with 18 goals in 74 games

played in 2015-16 and 17 in 68 games last season split between Detroit and Florida.

Vanek certainly appears capable of scoring 25 or more goals in the right circumstances. Playing left wing with Jack

Eichel and manning a spot on the number one unit on the leagues number one power play would certainly qualify as ideal. He is currently an unrestricted free agent earning a cap friendly \$1.5 million last year, well within the Sabres price range with a projected \$24,862,559 of cap space available according to capspace.com.

Signing aging veterans to bolster your lineup isn't the ideal way to build a young team but this organization is lacking for talent and depth everywhere so this would be a step in the right direction.

A call has gone out from League president Don Morris to anyone who may have played or participated in this North Buffalo League in its early years from the late 1950's until the mid to late 1970's.

Based on the success of last summer's 60th Anniversary season, Hertel North Park wishes to gather together any old pictures, scrapbooks, uniforms or banquet programs informing our community of its humble beginnings all in this tiny Park called Shoshone, they play America's game.

If you once played North Buffalo baseball during the League's early years, or at any time really, as a child growing up this great Community and have artifacts or memorabilia that you wish to contribute to the League, could you contact the League's headquarters located in Shoshone Park by phone 716-862-0243 email info@hnpbybl.com or even a personal appearance to discuss the opportunities to showcase your early baseball years in North Buffalo.

So much hard work is being done today by volunteers who give of their time to coach boys and girls how to swing a baseball bat, throw a strike or even catch a ball playing the outfield or shortstop. These are folks who work with families to offer a safe, pleasant experience for all the children enrolled to play in Hertel North Park. These are people who are unsung heroes for this community and what Don Morris claims to be are the strength of the League. The people of the North Buffalo Community are the reason why this League has been so successful.

From a personal standpoint, the Buffalo Rocket newspaper

has been fortunate to work with the many volunteers for the League, including Don Morris. Since 1982, we have witnessed thousands of young lives transformed into young adults just by playing six or nine innings of baseball or softball since their age of five or six until age 16 at least. There have been many moments of great plays made out on the diamonds of Shoshone Park, too many to try and capture in a weekly paper.

Let's take you to the diamonds of Shoshone Park for the big hits. The Nationals defeated the Cubs, 6-2 in the Majors. The Twins got by the Athletics, 6-5 in First Minor. The Orioles defeated the Tigers in Senior Boys and the Rays shut out the A's in Rookie boys, 3-0. Sisters Alyssa and Julia Kilonisky combined for three of the Pirates runs by smacking homeruns to lead the team to a 14-12 victory over the Yankees in Senior girls. Since their sea-

son started earlier this month, the Bucs have yet to lose after seven games.

The Pirates remain undefeated in Second Minors with a victory over the Braves, 8-3. But the Padres have won three of their last five games, including a win over the Brewers, 3-1 led by Anthony Johnson. He blasted a homerun and doubled at the plate and then pitched two innings and striking out four batters. Teammate Bryce Parker had two hits including a triple and had two RBI's.

Steven Clark of the Reds knocked in teammate Norm Hall in the bottom of the ninth inning for a 6-5 victory over the Mets in extra innings. Both teams were battling to bring the winning run home over two innings while the overhead lights were turned on. For the Reds, it was their third win in four games and evened their record at six wins.



