## **Buffalo Pond Hockey**



The first puck will drop on February 11th for the 11th Annual Labatt Blue Buffalo Pond Hockey Tournament.

This year's 11th annual Labatt Blue Buffalo Pond Hockey Tournament now offers both a one-day tournament and a week long event at Buffalo RiverWorks entertainment complex, 359 Ganson St, Buffalo, on February 11th through the 18th.

The first tournament will take place on Sunday, February 11th. Twenty-four teams will play three games in a round robin format, with championship games held that evening. Then, on Tuesday, February 13th, a week long tournament begins with 132 more teams, each competing in one game during the week, and playing their remaining games on Saturday, February 17th or Sunday, February 18th. ## West Side Post Office to **Host Passport Event**

The Westside Station Post Office, 465 Grant Street, will host a passport event on Saturday, January 27th from 9 am to 1 pm. Customers have the option of applying for a passport book, good for all international travel or the passport card, which is less expensive but good only for land and sea travel between the U.S. and Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean region and Bermuda. The cost for an



adult passport book is \$110 plus a \$25 processing/accep-

tance fee; the adult passport card is \$30 plus a \$25 processing fee. Both are good for ten years. Customers wanting both the passport book and card are charged only one processing fee. Payments are accepted via cash or check. Credit cards are acceptable for processing and photo fees only.

## **Donors Needed**

This January, National Blood Donor Month, the American Red Cross has an urgent need for blood platelet donors of all blood types to make an appointment to give now and help address a winter blood donation short-

Severe winter weather has had a tremendous impact on blood donations already this year, with more than 150 blood drives forced to cancel causing over 5,500 blood and platelet donations to go uncollected. This is in addition to seasonal illnesses, such as the flu, and hectic holiday schedules collectively contributing to more than 28,000 fewer donations than what was needed in November and December.

"Even temporary disruptions to blood and platelet donations can diminish the availability for hospital patients," said Patty Corvaia, communications manager of the New York-Penn Red Cross Blood Services Region. "It's the blood on the shelves that helps save lives in an emergency, and that's why we're asking eligible individuals to make an appointment to give blood or platelets today."

Eligible donors can find a blood or platelet donation opportunity and schedule an appointment to donate by using the free Blood Donor App, visiting redcrossblood. org or calling 1-800-RED

CROSS (1-800-733-2767). Donation appointments and completion of a RapidPass are encouraged to help speed up the donation process. RapidPass lets donors complete the pre-donation reading and answer the health history questionnaire online, on the day of their donation, by visiting redcrossblood. org/rapidpass from the convenience of a mobile device or computer, or through the Blood Donor App.

Every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood. Accident and burn victims, heart surgery and organ transplant patients, and patients receiving treatment for leukemia, cancer or sickle cell disease may all require blood to save their lives.

## **Five Thoughts**

1. We begin the New Year 2018 with new hopes and a five game losing streak. The 6-2 drubbing in Minnesota on January 5th was a homecoming for Phil Housley but his players certainly made the experience miserable for their coach. There was a noticeable lack of awareness of their opponents whereabouts in the defensive zone as the Sabres players watched the puck carrier who would then pass to an uncovered teammate for an easy goal while building a 6-0 lead through two periods. "I think our urgency without the puck obviously was not there tonight," Sabres coach Phil Housley said after the game in an understatement

2. The 4-1 loss on January 6th in Winnipeg was noteworthy for Jack Eichel setting the league season high for puck possession in a single game by an individual skater of one minute and 45 seconds. That's reminiscent of his strong play near the end of last season. In 2016-17 Eichel led the NHL in exits, skating the puck out of the defensive zone, and entries, skating the puck into the attacking zone, with an average six each per game. He is beginning to show signs of such dominance again this

3. The 7-4 loss to Winnipeg at Keybank Center was the sixth consecutive game where Buffalo has surren-


dered the first goal. While Robin Lehner entered the game with a 2.01 GAA and .935 save percentage on home ice this season, both the third best in the league.

4. Jack Eichel, Ryan O'Reilly and Kyle Okposo each had three points in the loss as the Sabres power play looked dominant resembling last seasons number one ranked unit.

5. Eichel has been on a scoring streak with 15 points in his last 11 games including nine goals. He has gone minus five over that stretch and is minus 16 for the sea-

son. The poor minus totals reflect that he gets lots of ice time on one of the worst teams in the league. It also reflects his lack of defensive awareness.

Against Minnesota he was caught chasing the puck carrier when the more prudent course of action would have been to anticipate and defend against a pass. Against Winnipeg in Buffalo, he was trapped in his own end for one minute and 45 seconds without being able to clear the puck, eventually surrendering the 4-1 goal. A typical shift will last about forty seconds. He displays a casualness at the end of his shifts, a lack of urgency to get to the bench which delays his replacement entering the game. While he is on pace for a career high 74 points it is attention to other less spectacular aspects of his game that have the potential to make him a great player.





eral months before they are scheduled to travel overseas. A passport application is normally processed by the State Department within five to six weeks. However, for an additional fee, the State Department will expedite the application and process it within three business days, and for those who need speedy delivery, the U. S. Postal Service offers Express Mail next day delivery both to and from the State Department.

To apply for a passport,

travelers need to complete Passport Application Form DS-11 (unsigned), provide proof of U.S. citizenship and proof of identity, submit two identical passport photos and pay the appropriate passport fees. Passport photo services are available for \$15. ## Mayor Announces That Common Council Approved Appointments


