Great Race Begins In Buffalo

On June 23rd "The Great Race" will be starting in Buffalo with a group of over 120 rare collector cars competing in an endurance road rally.

The Race kicks off in Buffalo, New York and makes its way on a 9-day trek through Vermont, New H a m p s h i r e, Maine and into New Bruns-

wick, Canada until it reaches its resting stop of Halifax, Nova Scotia in Canada. This year is bringing together 120 of the world's finest collector cars, exclusive to the model year 1972 and older, competing on teams from all around the world. One of the unique stories this year is that two teenage girls (15 and 17 years old) are taking on the event in a classic Dodge Dart.

With no technology and just the open road, each

team consists of a driver and navigator completing precise course instructions. Each day, the race will be stopping in local towns along the way for fun,

food, and festivities.

The community is invited to join the fun and experience these moving pieces of history up close and personal.

The Great Race is open to cars built prior to 1972 and this year there are several entries that were manufactured before World War II. Some of these pre-war cars include a chain-driven 1918 American LaFrance Speedster, a 1917 Peerless Speedster, a 1916 Hudson and the oldest vehicle to compete in this year's race – a 1909 American Simplex. The winner of the Great Race will receive \$50,000 of the \$150,000 total purse.


Veterans Symposium

This Day In Buffalo Sabres History Stanley Cup Finals 1975

With the Stanley Cup finals underway between the Las Vegas Golden Knights and Washington Capitals, here is a look back at the Buffalo Sabres appearance in the 1975 finals.

May 26th 1975, the Sabres had just lost game five of the Stanley Cup finals 5-1 at the Spectrum in Philadelphia the day before. Don Luce had been the only Sabre player to solve Bernie Parent who stopped 23 of 24 shots. Sabres goaltender Gerry Desjardins surrendered five goals on 26 shots.

With game six scheduled for the next day in Buffalo, coach Floyd Smith had a tough decision to make about his starting goaltender. Bernie Parent was rock solid in the nets for Philadelphia in the series surrendering only 11 goals on 144 shots with one empty netter while Desjardins had given up 17 goals in five games on 130 shots. Roger Crozier had only played four playoff games that year going 2-2 with a 3.00 GAA but had substantial postseason experience including a Conn Smythe Trophy as playoff MVP with Detroit in 1966.

May 27th 1975, the Philadelphia Flyers defeated the Sabres 2-0 in game six of the Stanley Cup Finals to win their second straight Stanley Cup championship. The game was scoreless through two periods until Bob Kelly broke the tie just 11 seconds into the third period assisted by

Reggie Leach and Jimmy Watson. Orest Kindrachul set up an insurance goal by Bill Clement at 17:11.

Roger Crozier was strong in the nets for Buffalo with 29 saves on 31 shots but Bernie Parent was even stronger stopping all 32 shots that he faced. Both teams were scoreless on six power play chances. Bernie Parent recorded the shutout and was awarded the Conn Smythe Trophy as play-off MVP for the second consecutive season. Parent and Mario Lemieux (1991, 1992), are the only players to win that award in back to back seasons.

Two North Buffalo teams won Championships in a Tournament held this past weekend in Shoshone Park for boys in two separate divisions in honor of Hall of Fame Buffalo native Jimmy Collins. In a first ever tournament hosted by Hertel North Park, the league chose the Boston Beaneater third baseman to represent this Cities heritage of Baseball in a Memorial Day competition against twelve other leagues, May 27-29 inside the city.

The North Buffalo Blaze travel team won the Championship in an eleven and under division with a 13-7 victory over the Tonawanda Tomahawks Saturday afternoon. 

Who is this St. Anthony Dude?

This is not intended to be a religious article but it may seem that way. We all have heard of St Joseph and how he supposedly helps to sell your house if you bury him upside down in your yard. Patron Saints for different reasons, St Jude, children, St Christopher, travel, etc. Then there is St Anthony, who help you find lost objects. If you lose something you pray to St Anthony and he helps you find it, sometimes.

Saint Anthony of Padua, born Fernando Martins de Bulhões, also known as Anthony of Lisbon, was a Portuguese Catholic priest and friar of the Franciscan Order. Most of the pictures of him show him with a child. Cannot figure the connection with lost items but here is my story.

Usually at night when I retire I take off my glasses and place them on the table next to my lounge particular chair. This morning when I arose the glasses where not there. 


