
be live entertainment as well.

A Sad Farewell

Ryan P. Lepo, a young man who served the league as an umpire for several years after his playing days, died suddenly in his North Buffalo home. He was 22 years old. As an umpire, Lepo put his heart and soul back into the sport he loved the best, Baseball. He was, according to most observers to Shoshone Park on any given night, the best there ever was at calling a game fairly for all the boys playing in the North Buffalo league over the last few years. According to League officials, Lepo possessed a style and grace out on the diamonds of Shoshone Park, standing behind a nine or ten year old pitcher on the mound, making the calls of balls or strikes, safe or out.

Then, when the inning would be over, he would quietly make his way to that team's dugout, searching for the player who he had just called out and explain to him why he had made his decision. An unexpected gesture to a visitor in the Park, but a habit forming practice to those who had come to know Ryan well. He played in this very same Park not all that long ago. His Dad was the team's coach and spoke to his friends like that all the time.

"He was a student of the game and was far ahead of his peers in his knowledge..." said League president Don Morris recently. Paul Fuzak, another long-time coach of his was quoted as saying "He (Lepo) was almost an assistant coach at that young age. He could do that because his demeanor was great, never condescending."

His father, Michael, along with Fuzak and a few others, helped lead the Tigers to a division and playoff championship under Tom Amodeo when Lepo was twelve. This was

when boys grew up in the same system of play (as Tigers) not all that long ago. The elder Lepo was a great coach to so many others and was excited now to see his son pursuing a possible career in becoming an umpire beyond Shoshone Park.

Umpires are the "Go To" people to see after a game for the final score and Lepo never shook his responsibility of informing the League. Besides a love for baseball, he was an avid Bills and Sabres fan. He thought of studying horticulture at Morrisville State College after graduation from the Tapestry Charter School in 2013. In the wake of his death, a fund has been set up in Ryan's honor, which might benefit the Hertel North Park Youth League. He will be truly missed.

Playoff Championships are being played as we write this in house divisions. The Dodgers won the Championship in Major Girls with a 5-3 victory over the Astros. By the time this paper hits the streets, Rookie Boys will have their Championship winner with both Rookie and Minor Girls playoffs winners celebrating on the Diamonds of Shoshone Park. Time to celebrate a winning season!

When the very first Buffalo Rocket was created back in 1969, after printing, the next challenge was its distribution. Fortunately, at that time, we had six children old enough, who unbeknownst to them, became the fledgling paper's circulation department. As the first issue was one sheet and only had a total of 3,000 printed, this was an easy task for our built-in, door to door delivery crew. As the Rocket grew and the circulation increased, extra bodies were needed to make sure all those who wanted the publication, received it. Desired or not, it was on the doorstep. began to hire neighborhood boys and girls to deliver established routes of 300 to 600 papers. Most were great kids and I loved seeing them every week when they came to pick up their pay. Knew every one of them by first name, and still run into them on occasion. Of course, I look the same as then, but they did not have mustaches and beards, so when they approach me, they have to identify themselves. Had a nickname for every one of my extended family. Great memories of the lineup in the hall every Thursday of my young employees waiting for me to come back from the bank with the cash. One of the few times I was popular, and someone was glad to see me. Once when I was late, they actually cheered when I walked in. Could have been more for the money than me. You

When we bought the West Side Times in 1980, it had a professional delivery Company which the Rocket adopted. Sadly, dozens of neighborhood kids were suddenly unemployed. missed seeing my little friends every week, but with the increased circulation, professional delivery was a must. This delivery system had been in place for many years and again, soon we became familiar with some of the delivery personal. The delivery company changed ownership, and with the new management, delivery became suspect. When we discovered that many of our papers were in a dumpster

and not delivered, it was time to find another option for circulation.

The delivery company did have some among their ranks that were honest, hardworking, loyal workers. This was obvious to us. We asked those who we felt fell into that category to stay on and distribute our product. One of those people is our own Charles Wilson. He has been delivering the Rocket for us for about 15 years. He has become a staple at Rocket Communications and now is easily recognizable on the streets of the neighborhood. Mostly at our drop off points. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday he is the delivery person for our other business, Gallagher Printing. Thursday, Friday and Saturday, he delivers the Rocket. There is not a more conscientious employee than our own Charlie.

Charles Wilson, man!

Mr. Wilson did not get much schooling, so his education was limited, and his skills have never been fully developed. His former job was delivering slingers for a local butcher. When the former delivery company went into the "hood", as Charlie calls it, looking for delivery people, Charlie was quick to respond. Like it was stated before, he became a star in what he did with that company. He is still a star as far as we are concerned with our company. He is well liked wherever he goes, either to our printing customers, or the Rocket drop off places that see his smiling face every week. We know he is appreciated as he occasionally proudly shows us gift certificates, presented to him in appreciation for his dedication. We are so happy that people have grown to love this man. If you know Charlie you know him as a tall, gentle, polite, humble man who loves doing what he does and loves people. Seldom or never angry even to those who are rude to him. He treats everyone with respect and is an asset to us as our representative on the streets. So, when you see our Charlie just say hello and see the big smile you will receive. He appreciates just being liked.

Ask Rusty - "Rat Holes" in the Social Security System

Dear Rusty: I am single and will be 63 on July 1 this year. I was born in 1955. I have been considering retiring sooner rather than later. (In other words, before FRA, which for me is 66 and 2 months). I have been reading about the "rat holes" in the Social Security system that may affect my timing for when I choose to begin my SS - I can't quite figure out a strategy as to when to begin my SS so as not to fall into that rat hole. Can you possibly advise me as to when would be the soonest that I should choose and not "take a hit", so to speak? Or does it not really matter that much? Signed: Trying to Decide

Dear Trying: I'm not sure what you've been reading which describes Security's holes," but it sounds to me like hyperbole designed to get you to buy something. Social Security really doesn't have any secrets or nefarious traps designed to cheat you out of the money you've earned from a lifetime of working, although it is a necessarily


complex topic, which governs a myriad of possible claiming choices by millions of different people. But at a basic level the rules are pretty simple: if you claim benefits at your full retirement age you'll get 100% of the benefit you are entitled to from your lifetime of working; if you apply sooner you'll get less and if you claim later you'll get more. Age 62 is the earliest you can collect and age 70 is the latest you should apply.

Deciding when to claim your Social Security is never really a simple matter, but rather one that should take into account your health, your family history of longevity, and your current and future financial needs. If you're in good health, come from a family, which typically lives to a ripe old age and don't really need the money right now, then waiting until at least your FRA and possibly longer will get you a bigger benefit check. But if you're sickly and/or need the extra money now to pay your basic living expenses, then collecting earlier makes

a lot of sense. The fact is that Social Security was designed to pay out about the same amount of money regardless of what age you apply - if you claim early your checks are smaller but you get more of them; if you wait until later your checks are bigger but you don't get as many. But that logic depends almost entirely on how long you live. You may want to do a "break even analysis" which will show how long you would need to live to break even if you collected at age 66 versus collecting at age 63, or when you would break even if you waited until you are 70 to apply versus claiming at your FRA.


