Sabres History

This day in Buffalo Sabres history, July 30th 1956, Real Cloutier was born in St. Emile, Que. Cloutier had been a legendary junior player scoring 93 goals and 216 points with the Quebec Remparts of the QMJHL in 1973-74. Cloutier was acquired by the Sabres GM Scotty Bowman in a draft day blockbuster trade on June 8th

1983, Bowman essentially shipped out his second line to the Quebec Nordiques sending Tony McKegny, Andre Savard and power play specialist J.F. Suave for Cloutier and a first round pick in 1983 (11th overall - Adam Creighton).

While Cloutier had been a scoring star in the WHA with 60, 66, 56 and 75 goal seasons from 1975-76 through 1978-79, his NHL totals were more modest and declined steadily from 42 to 15, 37, 28 and 24 from 1979-81 onward in his first four injury shortened NHL seasons before finishing his career in the minor leagues.

Bowman had gutted his teams depth at forward for this fading player who played only one more NHL season, scoring 24 times for Buffalo in 77 games. McK-egny who had just scored 36 goals for Buffalo played 8 more seasons in the NHL with five more seasons of 20+ goals including a career high of 40 goals with St. Louis in 1987-88. Savard scored 29 goals for Quebec in 95 games, essentially equaling Cloutier's production for Buffalo.

Galvin claims the Dodgers success had much to do with his roots in the community. "It's a testament to the league's dedication and the community. We should all be grateful."

With an 8-4 record after the regular season, the Dodgers took care of division rivals, the Cardinals and Rockies. A 7-6 victory over the Rockies July 12th meant it probably wasn't going to be easy but the L A team prevailed over the third place team. After the Cardinals surprised the Astros in the first round, the Dodgers met a St. Louis team coming off a big victory, a 16-12 final.

But Galvin and assistant coach Bob Valente kept the girls focused for game two against a Cardinals team suddenly playing well. "I wish to thank all the parents for helping me and chipping in for the good of the team. It was fun."

With just four teams in the division, Girls softball continues to be strong in North Buffalo. Six teams make up Minor girls team play under the major division. Indians, Giants, Yankees and Orioles had exciting seasons here and a new batch of faces coming up to the Majors next year bring an optimism towards many more memories being made. Congratulations to the Dodgers!

Crystal Beach

You are really old if you were around when the Dead Sea was just sick, and you don't buy green bananas. You are old if you remember these actors, Errol Flynn, Tyron Powers and Clark Gable. You are not that old if you remember Milton

Berle and Sid Caesar. You are also not real old if you remember Crystal Beach and the Crystal Beach boat, the Canadiana. Those were the days my friend, I thought they'd never end. What a joyous day of summer, to spend it at that special place across Lake Erie on the beautiful shores of Canada.

For you of the The Candiana younger generation, Crystal beach was an affordable amusement park

set within a short drive, a long bike ride, or a pleasant boat trip, from Buffalo. It was made for people of all ages and had something for everyone. A really fun place to be. We had radios back then, but television was unknown, let alone cell



phones and I pads. So, you would spend your summer vacation days just hanging with friends, and where better to spend it than at a beach? What better beach then Crystal? With rides like the Cyclone roller coaster (which preceded the famous Comet), Laugh in the Dark, Magic Carpet, Wild Mouse, Caterpillar, and dozen more rides. Must not forget the Old Mill, better known as the Tunnel of Love. Pleasant gondola like boats meandering through dark passageways. Nice pleasant ride with a newfound friend, they used to tell me. Besides the rides, this was one of the more beautiful sand beaches in the area that stretched forever. The beach alone was worth the trip. We must not forget the famous Crystal Beach Suckers.

Let's take a trip back into the past to 1949. As a youngster and part of a family of eight living through the depression and the war, going to Crystal was just a dream. Guess you would call it a thing on my bucket list. It was not until I had a Courier Express Newspaper route did I have enough money to even consider experiencing this extreme height of entertainment.

We begin the day with a walk to the Grant/Main Street bus stop, take a bus to Main, for 5 cents. Transfer to a Main Street trolley. Yes, electric trolley cars that ran on tracks down the middle of cobblestone Main Street. Hooked to overhead wires that sparked as you crossed the terminals. The trolley went to the foot of Main Street, where this big double deck ferry boat, the Canadiana was docked. The excitement builds as you board this beautiful, carved oak decorated, sparkling clean floating dream for 25 cents. You either wanted to sit on the bow to see the water split in front of you or the stern to watch the water churn as you leave the dock. Did both over the year and each one was as good as expected.

You leave the dock at the foot of Main and soon


you see Buffalo diminishing in the distance as you travel out into the lake. Not a long trip and not long enough to get the least bit bored. You knew where you were going to end up. Suddenly in front of the boat you can see the destination, the high rising roller coasters are the first to appear, then the whole shoreline. The beach, the rides in

motion just a sight to see and the crescendo builds. We dock, and customs is a formality. Where were you born? Buffalo, as you passed through customs. On to the gateway to para-

dise.

The Buffalo Evening News was owned by the Local Butler family. I mention this as the paper gave free tickets to the rides at Crystal based on your grades in school. Even though I delivered for the competing Courier Express, I was happy to get the free tickets, it made the day there more enjoyable as it made more rides affordable. By the end of a day of sunshine, ups and downs and go rounds, laughing and walking, swimming and viewing the scenery, it was time to hop on the boat and go home. Somehow it seemed faster coming back then going. The trolley ride was not as much fun and the bus ride seemed forever. Mom asked when I got home, "How was your day?" Single word answer, "Fun." With that I go to bed and crash. Here 70 years later, the memories linger. No one forgets a day at Crystal Beach.

Not only is the Department of Senior Services your first stop for all information related to seniors and their well-being, it also advocates for older adults, provides resources for them and their caregivers, and is directly involved in educating and motivating them to live healthier and more active lives.

This month we are celebrating older adults and exploring ways to provide more services in the future. How can we improve services for you? The Department of Senior Services is exploring ways to expand supports, services and programs and urges residents to add their voices to the discussion as we grow into the future.

Did you know that Erie County has 51 congregate

dining sites that serve over 250,000 meals annually to over 2,500 registered seniors? All dining sites also offer monthly nutrition education so seniors can practice better nutrition at home, and individual nutrition counseling with registered dietitians is also available. In addition, 30 of these locations also provide the Erie County Club 99 senior fitness program, which has over 1.000 enthusiastic senior participants countywide. Fitness and nutrition are essential to a healthy life and the Senior Services Department is always looking to spread that message even further.


Ongoing educational programs provided free of charge include Healthy Living Self-Management programs that educate older adults on living with chronic disease, or diabetes. These six-week classes are very popular, as are the free six-week "A Matter of Balance" classes held at area senior centers that educate seniors on better balance and ways to avoid falls. If continuing education interests you, you might want to explore the Department's University express program, which offers free lifelong learning classes spread across a wide variety of topics, or the Aging Mastery class, a 10-week class that helps seniors to take control of aging and lead healthy, productive lives.




