National Fire Prevention Week



The Buffalo Fire Department will be hosting Open House events throughout the month of October, which is designated as Nation Fire Prevention Month.

Since 1922, the National Fire Protection Association has sponsored the public observance of Fire Prevention Week. In 1925, President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed Fire Prevention Week a national observance, making it the longest-running public health observance in our country.

During Fire Prevention Week, children, adults, and teachers learn how to stay safe in case of a fire. Firefighters provide lifesaving public education in an effort to drastically decrease casualties caused by fires.

Fire Prevention Week is observed each year during the week of October 9th

in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire, which began on October 8, 1871, and caused devastating damage. This horrific conflagration killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures, and burned more than 2,000 acres of land.

Sabres New Season **Brings Hopes of Success**

With a massive influx of new players, Sabres GM Jason Botterill has swept out the disappointment of last seasons 31st place team. Here is how the forward lines might look on opening

night;

First line: Jeff Skinner LW - Jack Eichel C - Sam Rhinehart RW. Skinner was the splashy off season acquisition. He adds speed which is a much needed element lacking last season. Skinner has had a scoring touch during his eight seasons in Carolina. The hope is that he and Eichel will develop some chemistry and use their speed and skill to create scoring opportunities. Sam Rhinehart showed elite scoring in the second half of 2017-18. Eichel was 775th out of 802 players in plus/minus last season and needs to learn that hockey games aren't won by scoring goals, they are won by outscoring your opponent. His focus this season should be on good defensive play.

Second line: Connor Sheary LW – Patrick Berglund C - Kyle Okposo RW. Sheary is the speedy 20 goal winger acquired from Pittsburgh. Berglund is a veteran center from St Louis acquired in the Ryan O'Reilly trade. He scored 17 goals in 57 games in 2018-19 and

23 the season before. They are both expected to provide strong two way play with some scoring. Kyle with some scoring. Okposo at age 30 is a solid veteran but his scoring touch has slipped and his foot speed is getting slower while the league gets faster

every year. He will be looking to rebound from a disappointing 2018-19 where he scored 15 goals and 44 points in 75 games, a considerable drop from the 64 points he scored for the Islanders two seasons prior.

Third line: Vladimir Sobotka LW - Casey Mittledstat C- Jason Pominville RW. Mittlestadt's preshelped precipitate the O'Reilly trade. He put up five points in six games which is commendable but

did not show the speedy style he demonstrated at the World Junior Championship. He has yet to produce a point in the preseason and had only two assists in the prospects tournament, both in a 10-2 win over Pittsburgh. He certainly hasn't earned a second line spot off this body of work and should be given time on a line with veterans like Sobatka and Pominville to find his way, minimize his tendency to get "too cute" with the puck, regain his scoring touch and learn to play two way hockey. Pominville had a commendable 16 goals and Sobotka 11 goals last season so this will not be a big scoring line but will be counted on for solid two way play.

Fourth line: Scott Wilson LW - Zemgus Girgensons C - Evan Rodriguez RW. Wilson is the type of modestly skilled player who does everything right. He plays hard on the forecheck, backcheck and all over the ice. His presence on the fourth line is a sign of the new depth of talent at forward pushing him down the depth chart. Zemgus has never developed a scoring touch but works hard and has good straight line speed. Rodriguez had 25 points in only 48 games last season and looks like a lock to see regular duty on the fourth line. While many are excited about huge 6' 5" Tage Thompson making the team, he is weak defensively and has not shown a scoring touch in the NHL netting only three goals in 41 games with St. Louis last season. He should be learning the game in Rochester and is not ready for the NHL yet.






