Red Cross Offers Ways to Safely Cook and Travel this Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is here, and millions of people will take to the road and kitchen to share the holiday with loved ones. Because Thanksgiving is a peak time for congested travel and home cooking fires, the American Red Cross asks everyone to follow the steps below to help stay safe this holiday.

COOKING SAFETY

Install a smoke alarm near your kitchen, on each level of your home, inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas. Use the test button to check it each month. Replace all batteries at least once a year if your smoke alarm requires it.

While cooking, don't wear loose clothing or sleeves that dangle.

If you are frying, grilling or broiling food, never leave it unattended—stay in the kitchen. If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove. Unattended cooking is the leading cause of cooking fires.

If you're simmering, baking, roasting or broiling food, check it regularly.

Use a timer to remind yourself that the stove or oven is on.

Keep kids and pets

away from the cooking area. Make them stay at least three feet away from the stove.

Always check the kitchen before going to bed or leaving home to make sure all stoves, ovens, and small appliances are turned off.

HIGHWAY SAFETY

Each year, millions of people drive to spend Thanksgiving with family and friends—making it one of the busiest times for road traffic. If you're

Buckle up, slow down and don't drive impaired.

Follow the rules of the road and use caution in work zones.

Give your full attention to the road. Avoid distractions such as cell phones.

Make frequent stops. During long trips, rotate drivers. If you're too tired to drive, stop and get some rest.

THE FLU AND YOUR TRAVEL PLANS

If public transportation is part of your travel plans, remember it's flu season. From luggage to seats, everything that you touch is likely touched by someone else. Follow these tips to help avoid the spread of germs.

Handle your own belongings.

Wash your hands often with soap and water.

Carry hand sanitizer and anti-bacterial wipes with you. You can use them to wash your hands or wipe down surfaces, such as armrests.

Bring your own pillows and blankets. They can act as a shield against the seat itself.

Avoid touching your face or eyes. If you have to cough or sneeze, do so into a tissue or your sleeve



planning to travel by car, follow these safety tips:

Make sure your car is in good condition for a road trip. Pack an emergency preparedness kit, supplies and a first aid kit in the trunk.

Share travel plans with a family member or friend. Check the weather before departing and along your route. Plan for travel around any storms that may be coming.

Be well rested and alert.

Florida Wildfires

With all the terrible deaths that are happening in California, one wonders, why? Why are they finding people in their homes who had refused to leave and perished? I can relate to that in a way.

As most of my readers know I go to Florida for the winter. Have been since 1994 when I built my first house down there. Hear all the time how lucky I am to be able to do that. There is some luck but most of it comes from planning and hard work. It doesn't just happen. Made my choice to make a winter home in Florida at the first Buffalo Bills Super Bowl appearance in Tampa Bay. You know the wide right one. That is another story. Just thought how nice it was to be warm in the dead of winter. So I went to one of those meetings where they sell Florida

lots in a development for \$100 a month for 10 years. Long story short, bought a lot and decided to build on it.

Nice new three bedroom two bath house on my lot. In the middle of a jungle. There were paved streets, water and sewer but no houses. Went down and checked the place out. It had a nice golf course, nice hotel with tennis courts and swimming pool. Even had a marina. Checked out my lot that was nothing but vegetation and brush and palm trees. No houses. Still wanted to build there and in spite of my wife saying it would never happen, it happened. She never liked it there cause, there were no houses. There were a few scattered here and there but you had to drive to see your neighbor. It was still mostly jungle. We were surrounded by

thick overgrowth.

If you did not know it Florida is probably second to California as far as wildfires. It is tropical heat and in the winter it does not rain. So the natural over growth is dry and parched. Crunches when you walk through it. It is quite common to have wildfires in Florida. Not as bad as out west, but the results are the same. Acres of burnt out foliage. Black stumps sticking up like tombstones on the parched earth. The healthy green is suddenly gone and destroyed.

Our house, being surrounded by foliage, was pretty but unknowing to us was dangerous. When a fire broke out near us it was kind of unexpected. Since I am not there during hurricane season this was going to be a new experience. As the burning trees and brush got closer to my house I got out my video camera and started videoing the fire. Now wasn't this fun. Not! The smoke got heavier and it was harder to breath. The flames were right there in my backyard. Started to feel the heat. Hey, this is getting serious, so I got out my

hose and started to squirt my roof. The firemen had arrived and started to work on the fire and advised me to get out. Get out, me? In the middle of all this excitement I was going to leave? Well when the police officer came and escorted me and my wife to our car, I knew it was time to go. We drove a safe distance away and watched.

The one thing Florida has that California does not have is lots of lakes. Plenty of water to pump from. We had a nice lake right down the road. With that and years of experience they had the fire under control quickly. We watched with some of the few neighbors we had, as the gray smoke billowed upward from the very spot where our house was located. The police officer was also with us to make sure I behaved. After a few tense moments the gray smoke changed to white and we were informed that meant the fire was out. Now we can return and see the damage.


What we saw was amazing. Everything within 10 feet of our house was scorched. No color, black for what was left of the trees and white ash on the ground. Still smoldering and even small fires. Our house was untouched.

Not one scorch mark and nothing but a slight hint of smoke. Unbelievable.


I tell this to try to in some way understand why the people in California chose to stay. Risking everything to try to protect what they have spent their lives trying to achieve. Unknowingly, I would have stayed. Fortunately, my story ended up on the bright side. I know how intense the smoke and heat can become. I imagine the people who died thought they were doing the right thing. We learn. Knowing what I know now, I would have left.

We moved out of that spot to a more populated community. No fires, just hurricanes. Two hit our house so far. Maybe I will put the video of the fire at my place on YouTube. Think that would be more interesting than the tornado that I filmed at our second house?

Ask Rusty – Will I Get Spousal Benefits?

Dear Rusty: *I will be 67 years old this September and have been receiving my Social Security benefits since September of last year (2017). I've found that I do not need the money now, and since I don't need the money, I'm wondering if can I repay what I've already collected and just wait until I'm 70 to get a larger benefit?* **Signed: Changed My Mind**

Dear Changed: Situations such as yours are exactly why Social Security has a "do over" option, which allows those who claim benefits to withdraw that application within one year. Reality is that sometimes financial circumstances change. People who lost their job may react by claiming Social Security, and then later find other employment, which provides them the income they need. Or they may simply just change their mind and be sorry they applied for

benefits. In any case, the do-over option can be used to fix that but exercising that option does have some important consequences.

The short answer to your questions is "Yes" - you can exercise the "do over" option and totally withdraw from Social Security if you do so within 1 year of the date your benefits originally started. But - and this is a big but - you will have to pay back everything that you have collected, including any withheld taxes, Medicare premiums, and any spousal or other dependent benefits that may have been paid on, to or from your account over the past year. Obviously if you wish to do that you should act with haste to submit Form SSA-521 (Request for Withdrawal of Application), because you're coming up on the one-year anniversary of your original application.

However, since you have

already reached your full retirement age of 66, you have another less financially painful option available to you which you might want to consider - you can simply suspend your current benefits, which will allow you to earn delayed retirement credits equal to 2/3 of 1% per month of suspension (8% per year) up until you reach 70 years of age. You will have lost that initial 8% benefit growth you would have otherwise realized for the 1st year after you reached age 66, but that may be less traumatic than repaying Social Security a very large lump sum for an entire year's worth of benefits paid. Then when you reinstate (un-suspend) your benefits at age 70, the benefit amount will be about 24% higher than it is now. Thus, you'll gain a significantly increased benefit without needing to repay all that money you collected for a whole year.

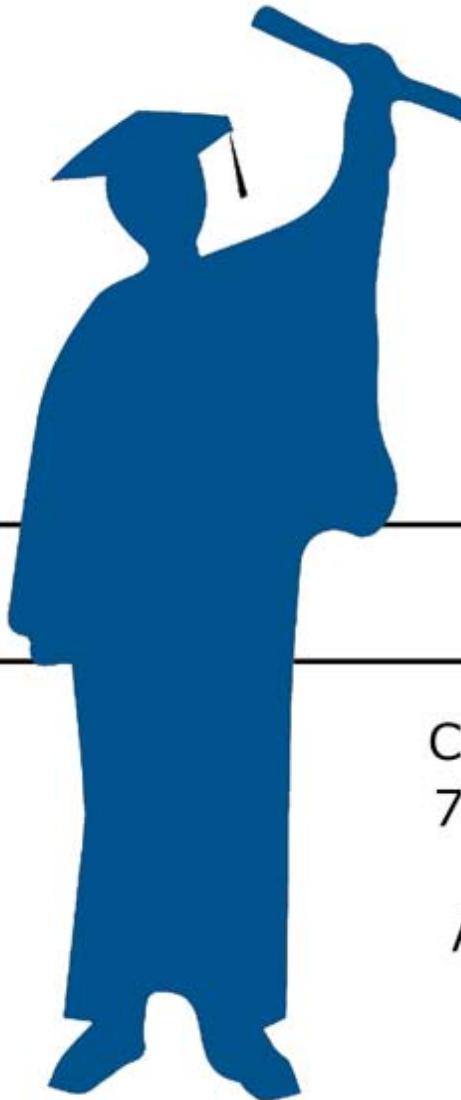
