

# Sabres Name Ralph Krueger Head Coach

The Buffalo Sabres today announced the team has hired Ralph Krueger as the 19th head coach in franchise history.

\*\*Sabres General Manager Jason Botterill will be available to the media today (Wednesday) at 11 a.m. at Key-Bank Center in the press conference room. Media should enter the building through the arena's security entrance on Illinois Street.\*\*

"Throughout his career, Ralph has shown the ability to adapt to a variety of high-pressure environments while leading some of the world's elite players," Sabres General Manager Jason Botterill said. "His strong communication skills, leadership and diverse background make him a uniquely qualified candidate to lead our team going forward.

Krueger's most recent hockey experiences come in international competition. In 2014, he won a gold medal at the Winter Olympic Games in Sochi, Russia as a consultant to Team Canada's coaching staff. Most recently, he served as the head coach of Team Europe, who finished as runners up at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

"I am excited and honored to join the Buffalo Sabres family and will strive to maximize the potential that lies within

this team," Buffalo Sabres Head Coach Ralph Krueger said. "I look forward to building on the many positives that have been established within the organization and I am especially eager to get behind the bench and represent this passionate hockey city."

At the NHL level, Krueger was named head coach of the Edmonton Oilers prior to the 2012-13 season after spending the 2010-11 and 2011-12 campaigns as the team's associate coach. Prior to his time in Edmonton, Krueger served as a European Consultant for the Carolina Hurricanes from 2005 to 2010, capturing a Stanley Cup in 2006.

Krueger began his coaching career during the 1991-92 season as head coach of VEU Feldkirch in the Austrian Hockey League, where he spent seven seasons and led the team to five consecutive championships (1994 to 1998). He spent the next 12 years as head coach of the Swiss national team, serving behind Switzerland's bench for three Winter Olympic Games and 12 IIHF World Championships.

A native of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Krueger recently spent over five seasons as the Chairman of Southampton Football Club, a soccer team that currently plays in England's Premier League. During his tenure in England, Krueger helped guide Southampton to four consecutive top-eight finishes in England's top league for the first time in the club's 127-year history.



# Northwest Buffalo Beat by Joe Borty

## 50th Year

This week marks the exact week that the very first North Buffalo Rocket hit the streets of North Buffalo. Ads were sold to advertisers as a form to honor mothers on Mother's Day. It worked well as we know, we all love our mothers. It was an easy sell. Local merchants bought business card size ad for \$10 for placement on a slinger saluting mothers. In all honesty I did not even remotely dream that it would become a weekly newspaper with editors, photographers, and columnist. All who have contributed to the growth of the paper and perhaps even the area. All that was intended with this slinger was to recognize mothers and in a way, expose my small print shop. At that time we were located on an off street, Tacoma near Commonwealth. that also worked.

It is not possible to go

over the happenings of the 50 years since that first edition in this column, it would fill a book So many employees, so many people contributing to making it a success. Great photos by outstanding photographers. A series of great editors who did much to make the product the best it could be. Publishing information important to the residents of North Buffalo and the West Side. Many of these people did not work just a forty-hour week, they did whatever it took to meet the deadline however long it took. With the demise of the Courier Express, some of the columnist of that daily, looked for an outlet to write, came to the Rocket, bringing some expert journalistic experience to the pages of the Rocket during its peak years. Doug Smith, Jim Baker, Ray Herman were welcome additions from

the Courier. We had some Television personalities that also wrote sports columns, Clip Smith, Brian Blessing and Ralph Hubble Our favorite was well known Brian Meyers, radio and Buffalo News reporter who started with us as a teenage aspiring writer. The strength of a paper is measured by the number of pages, at our peak we were publishing 24 pages a week. Not bad for a small weekly.

We had full time editors, photographers, salespeople, graphic artist and as mentioned contributing writers. It was considered the voice of North Buffalo and eventually with the addition of the West Side Times, considered a legitimate publication. Rocket Communications became accepted as a member of the National Newspaper Association. We were a serious publication.

So many things we covered in those 50 years. So many changes in the neighborhood. North Buffalo is nothing like it was in 1969. Hertel had changed but not as drastic as Delaware. One of the biggest corrections on Hertel is the sewer problem. Hertel during a big rainstorm would be under-

water. The biggest flood was 1975. Cars parked on Hertel were under water. All the rainwater running downhill from Main was too much for the small sewers at the low spots on Hertel and became fountains in the basements of the homeowners and businesses. Leaving them with as much as six feet of water. This happened many times till finally the situation was corrected. This took a major construction project right down the middle of Hertel. A large drain was installed and is now able to handle the large influx of water.

Just to mention one other thing that stands out. The demolition of School 21 on Hertel. What is important to me is that so many schools we used to cover in 1969 no longer exist. PS 21, 22, 52 and 88. Once full public schools are no longer here. Where have all the children gone?

Of course, there are

positive many, many things that changed the look of the area. Big box stores like Kmart. Target, Kohls, and Home Depot have been added. Many new plazas and restaurants. North Buffalo is booming. Like to think that we had something to do with it but who knows. All we can say is that after 50 years we are still here. Not as big and as strong as we were at one time, but we still produce a product that is accepted as the voice of North Buffalo. Advertisers that are satisfied and readers. Just that we are not as loud as

we once were.



# Ask Rusty - What Social Security Benefit Will My Wife Get If I Die?

Dear Rusty: I am 69 and have been holding off on collecting my Social Security payment until I'm 70 on the assumption that my wife would collect my benefit if I died first. My thought was that she would collect the monthly benefit I will earn at age 70 in the event of my death. Now a Social Security employee is telling me she would only be entitled to what my benefit would have been at age 66 (my full retirement age). That is about a \$800 drop in monthly benefits from what I thought it would be. My wife is 1 year younger than me, much healthier than I am, has mostly worked part time and she started collecting her SS at age 62 and gets about \$700 a month. So, is the Social Security employee correct? Signed: Concerned Husband

**Concerned:** Dear The Social Security employee you spoke with might have misunderstood your question. It sounds like the answer you were given pertained to the benefit your wife is entitled to as your spouse while you are living, which is based upon your "primary insurance amount", or "PIA" (your PIA is the amount you were due at your full retirement age, or "FRA").


When you claim your increased benefit at age 70 your wife can apply for her spousal benefit which will be based on your FRA benefit amount (not the increased amount you'll get by waiting until age 70 to claim). She gets that spousal benefit if it is more than she is receiving on her own work record, which from what you've told me it will be. What actually happens is that she will continue to get her own benefit and she will also get a supplemental amount to make her total Social Security benefit equal to what she is entitled to as your spouse. That amount will be a bit less than half of your FRA benefit because she took her own benefit at age 62 (claiming Social Security early doesn't only affect one's own benefit, it affects their spousal benefit also). The spousal benefit your wife gets when you claim at age 70 will continue for as long as you are living. But the Social Securient for your wife as your claim).

widow and your survivor. If you predecease your wife, her spousal benefit from your work record, as described above, will discontinue and she will be switched to her survivor's benefit. That survivor's benefit will be 100% of the benefit amount you were receiving at your death, instead of the lower amount she was receiving as your spouse when you were living. So, your original assumption is correct – as your widow your wife will get 100% of the increased benefit you were receiving when you pass. The Social Security employee was incorrect by telling you that, if you pass, your wife will only get what you were due at your full retirement age; instead she'll get the full amount of your current Social Security benefit (your full age 70 benefit, plus any COLA adjustments made after your

# "Super Heros" With A **Shovel**

With all this rain in our local forecasts of weather, you would think boys and girls playing in Shoshone Park since Opening Day could be disappointed. Don't assume anything.

The Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League has "gotten most of their games in" the opening week of their 63rd season, missing just two days. In Second Minor action, Tyler Adamczyk-Turkovich has helped lead the Dodgers to their first two wins on the season. They shut out the Padres, 4-0 last Monday and then beat the Pirates 4-1 Saturday. The Padres got their first win Saturday though with a 4-3 victory over the Brewers. Liam Nieves knocked in Ted Scanlon in the bottom of the sixth after a big hit from teammate David Reyes put runners on in

the comeback victory.

In Rookie Boys, the Yankees are 2-0 already with wins over the Mariners and A's. Three players each had four hits in the victory over the Athletics. the dignity of all people - a time to consider the lessons learned from


this unfortunate event


