The Skinny on Skinner

With the signing of new coach Ralph Krueger, the next task for GM Jason Botterill this offseason is signing Jeff Skinner. The Sabres 40 goal forward will become an unrestricted free agent on July 1st unless he signs with Buffalo before then and would attract lots of interest from other NHL teams.

The Sabres have stated that they want to re-sign Skinner to a long term contract. Bob McKenzie reported on NBC Sports last week that the parties are moving closer on making that happen: The sense seems to be that there's optimism, but not to the point where either side is entirely comfortable with the numbers that they're exchanging. I do expect that there is likely to be more dialogue between Skinner's agent and the Buffalo Sabres. For quite some time now I've been saying that I think the sweet spot for a number is an eight-year deal somewhere between \$8.5MM per year and \$9.5MM per year.

Buffalo certainly wants

him back, and Skinner would like to come back but they've just got to get the final massaging of the numbers to the point where both sides are happy. So it's very close, but it's not done. And until it's done, it's not done.

Skinner is coming off

the best season of his career, showing great chemistry with Jack Eichel. Both players enjoyed career highs with Skinner scoring 40 goals and 63 points while Eichel had 82 points.

However, an eight contract for any player is risky. You are paying top dollars for the player you have today knowing that his production will drop as the player gets older and

past his prime. Skinner is a relatively one dimensional player that doesn't have the well rounded game to sustain his value when his goal scoring drops off. He had a low value season with Carolina in 2017-18 scoring only 24 goals and 49 points after scoring 37 times and 63 points in 2016-17. He had only 18 goals in 2014-15.

Skinner's 40 goals came on an a career best 14.9% shooting percentage. At his career average of 11.2%, his 40 goal season becomes 30 goals. Skinner had a hot start scoring 30 goals in his first 44 games but over the second half of the season he scored just ten goals in 38 games. That's a 22 goal pace over 82 games. This disparity makes it a challenge when determining his true value.

No doubt Skinner will want to be paid like a 40 goal scorer. Considering Skinner's late season decline and lack of history as an elite scorer Botterill would like to see a cheaper deal. But the Sabres need to assume the risk and sign him because Skinner holds all the leverage here and Buffalo cannot afford to lose their number one goal scorer. The longer Skinner goes without signing with the Sabres, the temptation to wait a little longer to see what's out there on the open market will increase.

Please wake up!

If you are old enough, you remember having all the childhood diseases. Chicken Pox, Mumps, Whooping Cough, and of course, the Measles. Although you felt ill, you made it through the normal incubation period until it had run its course. With Chicken Pox, one breaks out into sores usually on your face. It could lead to Shingles in later life, which is extremely painful. Mumps are lumps on your throat, if the lumps drop, it could be a problem with men in later life. Whooping cough is a serious cough and extremely contagious. Each one would pass through our family, either one after another but sometimes more than one at the same time. Now there are vaccinations and you seldom hear of an outbreak of any significance for any of them. Except recently with the measles

epidemic.

Measles if I remember correctly, and I had them all, outside of the rash is the easiest to get through. But it has possible side effects which can be quite serious. We found that out the hard way.

My children all went through the process. They all had all of them. Fortunately for us, not all at once. We knew if one got the mumps, soon afterwards another would contact the disease. Came and went normally. That is until our one son got the 14-day measles. In the beginning, like the others he was given the same treatment, and we waited for it to be over. Not this time. Each day his condition got worse. High fever and lack of appetite and strange behavior. Finally, we realized that it was more than just the measles. When his condition seemed to

worsen, we called the doctor. At the time our family pediatrician was Dr. Thomas Bumbalo. When we described his vitals on the phone, this doctor, in a snowstorm, came to our house. When is the last time you heard of a doctor making a house call? After five minutes of examination, he said we had to get him to a hospital immediately. No 911 back then and an ambulance in those days was very costly. So, we bundled him up and rushed him to Children's hospital on Bryant street. He was admitted and placed in the intensive care unit. He was diagnosed with Encephalitis, inflammation of the brain. One of the side effects of measles. Rare but it happens, and it happened to him.

He slipped into a coma and it was questionable if he would make it through. A parent's worst nightmare is to lose a child. Day after day he just laid there, non-responsive. If he did wake he became irrational and even screamed before slipping back into the darkness he was experiencing. One hospital doctor who witnessed one of his waking moments, made a com-

ment to me that I will never forget. Something to the effect that he was not well behaved. The kid was sick you lame brained idiot. I thought to myself, let it pass. Another doctor told us he may never walk or talk, even if he makes it. Our doctor, Dr. Bumbalo, was furious with these two "professionals". In any case, we stood vigil and prayed every day. That was the longest week of our lives, still hoping for the best.

Then one morning we walked into his room. Let me describe that moment. He was sitting up being fed by a nurse. When he seen us, his eyes lit up and he said, "hi Dad, hi Mom". Can you even imagine that feeling? After thinking that maybe he would never wake up again? The joy of suddenly, knowing he was going to recover? The feeling of happiness surges through your body like a bolt of soothing elec-

tricity. You want to laugh and cry at the same time. In either case the tears begin to flow. At least mine did. After tons of hugs and kisses that day, he soon returned to normal. He of course knew nothing about what had transpired from the day he left his bed at home till he awakened in the hospital. All he knew was that he had a lot of people fussing over him and just happy to see him. We certainly were and so were his brothers and sisters. They seemed to suffer through this as much as we did.

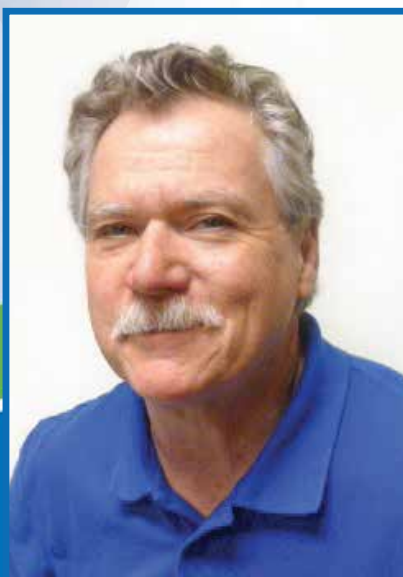

Ask Rusty - Computing Benefits When "WEP" Applies

Dear Rusty: My wife is subject to the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and I'm trying to calculate what her monthly Social Security payment might be. The circular provided by SS says that her earnings will be calculated by multiplying the first \$895 of her average monthly earnings by 90%. According to the circular, since she doesn't have 30 or more years of substantial earnings the 90% will be reduced to 40%. My question is this: How many months do they use to divide into the total earnings to determine the average monthly earnings? If I use the number of total working years, her monthly average is very low and getting lower the longer she works. For example, she has been working since 1973 (46 years/552 months). However, she only paid SS taxes in 20 of those years (240 months). She turned 62 last November, so if she waits to draw SS until her full retirement age she will add another 56 months to the average calculation and reduce her benefit accordingly. I can't determine when it's better for her to apply unless I know how many months they will factor into the calculation. Signed: Confused

Dear Confused: First, I need to clarify for you the basics of how SS benefits are determined (before the WEP computation). Social Security will look at your wife's entire lifetime record of SS-covered earnings, adjust each year's earnings for inflation, and find the 35 years in which she had the highest earnings. If she doesn't have a full 35 years of SS-covered earnings, they'll put zeros in to bring the number of years to 35. They'll then total her earnings for those 35 years and divide by 420 (the number of months in 35 years) to arrive at her "average indexed monthly earnings" (AIME).

The WEP computation is done using her AIME. To arrive at the SS benefit amount, her AIME is divided into 3 parts, and a different percentage of each part contributes to her "primary insurance amount", or "PIA" – the amount due at full retirement age. Normally, the first of the 3 parts is 90% of \$895 (for her eligibility year, which was last year). But when WEP applies, a different percentage is used for the first calculation. If she has 20 or fewer years of SS-covered significant earnings, the first part is multiplied by

40% instead of 90%. If she has more than 20 years of SS-covered significant earnings, the multiplier will increase by 5% for each additional year, up to 30 years of SS covered significant earnings when WEP no longer applies. So, for example, if she has 24 years of SS-covered significant earnings then the WEP multiplier would be 55% instead of 40%, thus increasing her WEP-PIA and lessening the amount of her WEP reduction.

For each year your wife now works and has significant SS earnings, one of those zero years in the 35-year computation will be eliminated, thus increasing her "AIME" and "PIA" (as described above). If your wife now has 20 years of SS-covered earnings, then each additional year she now works in SS-covered employment will add 5% to the multiplier used when doing the WEP computation (thus reducing the WEP effect and increasing her net SS benefit amount). If your wife claims before her full retirement age (FRA), her WEP-reduced benefit amount will be further reduced because she is claiming benefits early. WEP reduces her PIA, which is her FRA benefit amount; claiming earlier than her full retirement age further reduces her benefit amount.

So, to your specific question, the number of months they factor into the benefit calculation is always 420 (35 years times 12). If she doesn't have earnings in all 35 of those years working now will improve, not decrease, your wife's Social Security benefit.
